## Cotton Burr Mulching

 Can Enrich The Soil

| In the past Soll Conservationists have viewed the growing of cotton with some misgivings. It is true that planting cotton continuously on the same land is harmful to the land from a soil and water conservation standpoint. And many farmers would like to plant conserv ing and soil improving crops but due to our present farm programs they are forced economically to devote most of their acreage to cotton. This leaves little or no land available for the soil improving crops. <br> A growing green crop such as winter wheat, opts or winter peas does a much better job of protecting and improving your soll and these crops can be planted after your cotton crop is gathered and can be planted on the same land as your cotton, But, if for some reason you | why not try cotton bur mulching ? Cotton burs or gin trash, when applied at the recommended minimum rate of 3 tons per acre, will help to reduce runoff and erosi on, during the blow season. Cotton burs are also considered as soil improving if 20 lbs of nitrogeń per ton is added to the residue. <br> Cotton burs should be spread evenly over the surface and can be "tucked in" by shallow, chiseling if the minimum application is made. Bursshould be left on the surface during the blow season or until about April lst. <br> For further information on this practice or for technical assistance on other problems you might have, please contact your local soll conservation office located in the courthouse basement in Jayton. |

## VOTE NO ON on november <br> 

Amendment $\mathbf{3}$ is one of numerous proposals to amend the Texas Constitution which will be on the November 3 general election ballot.

This amendment would permit tax assessment of ranch, farm, and forest lands "based upon the capability of such lands to support the raising of livestock and/or to produce farm and orest crops.'

This could almost destroy the tax base of many school districts.

- It would drastically alter the present principle of taxation based on market value.
and the docial treatment would be given one group of taxpayers. . Those would be open to other exceptions.

Those whose land is producing, and those who own homes and businesses, would have to pay higher taxes to make up for evenue lost under this amendmen.
