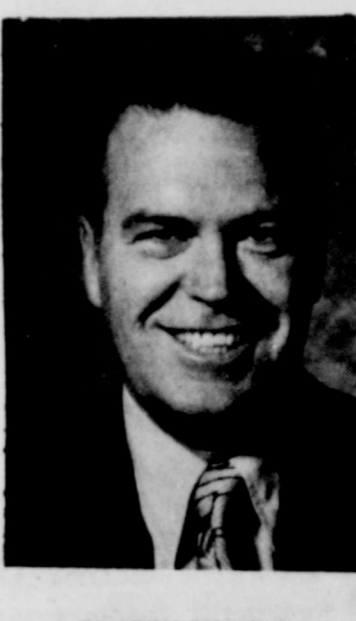
Ode M. Prescott Former Minister Here (From Daily Paper Feb. 17.)
