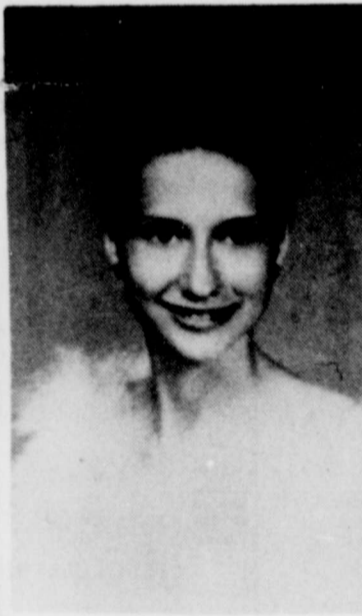

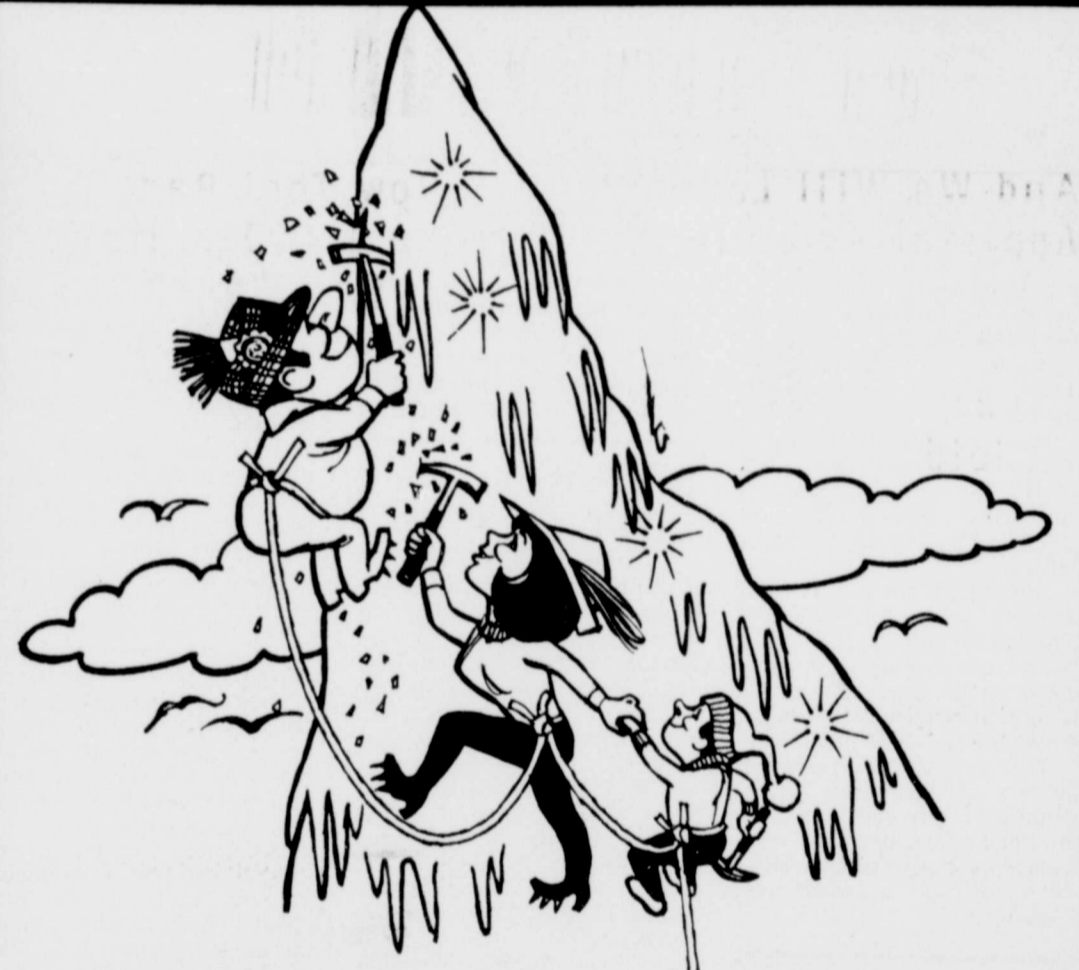

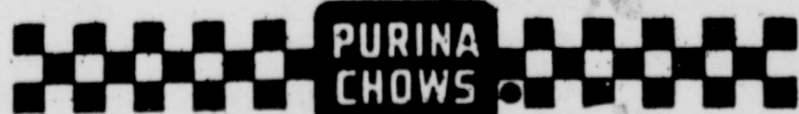


This Is a Photo of the 6-Row Tool Bar

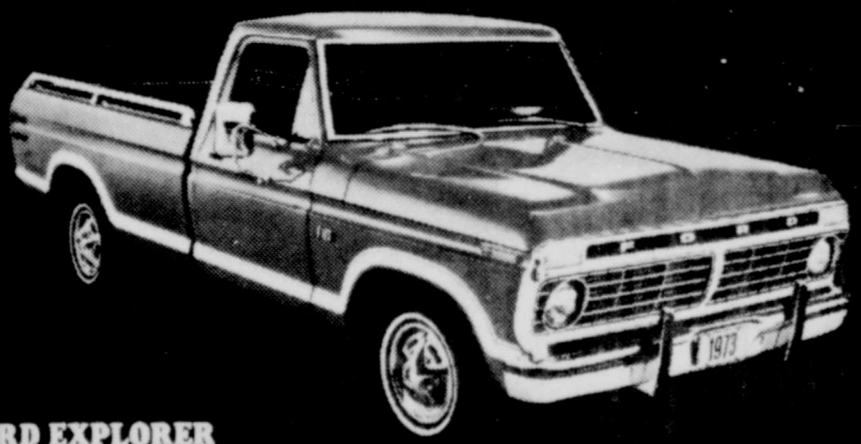

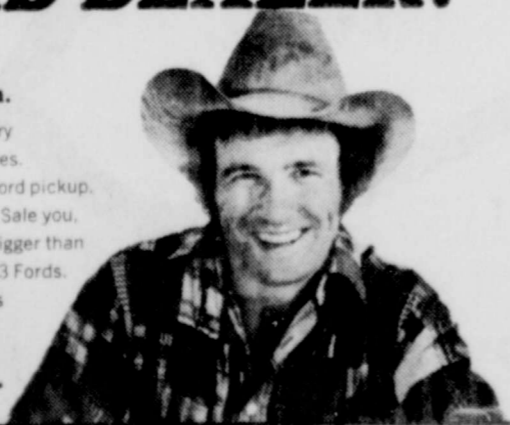
