One dead, another injured in rollover near Coleman

WINTERS- A one-vehicle wreck occurring Sunday night, January 19, near Coleman, left one person dead. Lance Wesley Hinds, 30-years-of-age, of Coleman, was pronounced dead at the scene by Judge Nance Campbell. His body was taken to Stephens Funeral Home in Coleman.

According to the Texas Department of Public Safety, Hinds was not wearing a seatbelt.

Hinds was driving a 1991 Dodge Ram pickup truck on U.S. 283, 3.2 miles north of Coleman. The vehicle was traveling north

and failed to negotiate a curve.

The vehicle went off the road to the east side, then crossed back over U.S. 283 to the west side and rolled over. The driver and female passenger were not wearing seatbelts and were ejected from the vehicle. A child passenger was in a child safety seat and remained inside the vehicle.

Texas DPS identified the female passenger as Lesley Lavon Acosta, 21, of Coleman. She was diagnosed with serious incapacitating injuries and transported to Hendricks Medical Center, in Abilene, Texas.

Clerk's Office taking applications for early voting

BALLINGER- The County Clerk's Office is now accepting applications for early voting by mail for the March 4 Democratic and Republican Primary Election. A voter has the option of voting in either the Democratic Primary or the Republican Primary. A qualified voter is eligible to vote by mail if

the voter: 1. Expects to be absent from the county of residency on election day and during the regular hours for early voting by personal appearance; 2. Is disabled; 3. Will be 65 years of age or older on election day; or 4. Is confined in jail but eligible to vote. The last day to receive an application to vote by mail is February 21.

Any qualified voter will be eligible for early voting by personal appearance at the Courthouse Annex Building in Ballinger, beginning February 18 and ending February 28, Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. until 5 p.m. Please note that Early Voting will no longer be held in the Courthouse. It will be in the Courthouse Annex Building, which is

located behind the Courthouse at 608 Strong in Ballinger. Sample Ballots are available at the County Clerk's Office in Ballinger, the Tax Branch Office in Winters and the City Hall in Miles. Reason Animal Rescue holds 2014 elections

WINTERS- The year 2013 was another successful year for Reason Animal Rescue. In 2013 alone, Reason successfully rescued, vetted and adopted out over 150 dogs and 45 cats. Both 2012 and 2013 combined, over 250 dogs have been removed from the population and over 100 feral cats have been spayed or neutered.

January 2014 elections started off the year with lots of excitement for potential new accomplishments in our efforts of protection of animals and the community of Winters and surrounding Runnels County area. Our newly elected officers for 2014 are: President, Jim Pumphrey; Vice President/Treasurer, Tammy Jackson; and Secretary, Marsha Smith. We invite residents to come and join with us in this highly important endeavor to control a serious danger to the all citizens of our county.

In 2013, with the coordination of Reason volunteers and Winters law enforcement officials, many dogs and cats have been removed that could have potentially cause dangerous human

injury and disease. Our new Winters Community Animals Control Officer, Eric Samaniego, in cooperation with Reason has helped to make a huge difference to the animal population control efforts. Winters has a leash and containment law for dogs and cats of our community. For many years, our community has been inundated and overwhelmed with an enormous population of roaming and feral animals that threaten the safety of citizens and family members, including our personal pets. Animals, running loose and not inoculated to prevent dangerous disease, bring huge risk of exposure and contamination to everyone. It is through Reason's and our community authorities' efforts that this potential threat is gradually being whittled out of our community.

Many individuals over the years have struggled alone to make a dent in the overpopulation of stray and feral animals. But, it is the joining together of many individuals, into a "like minded" organization, that big strides can be made in conquering these major problems. Together, as a team, we can do so much

more than each individual alone. Every person has many talents to offer, whether large or small, to the success of any organization. We welcome folks to come join us and help with fundraising, membership, spay/neuter programs, animal fostering, meet and greet adoption events, animal socialization and training, material donations, bake sales, community education programs and so much more. Even the smallest effort is precious in this important task and to the animals in our care.

We know that there are many folks that still don't know that our organization exists. Word of mouth about Reason Animal Rescue is an easy thing that everyone can help with. Together we can make a big difference to every citizen and to animals in this area of Texas. We can show other communities in Texas and our great country just what can happen when we all come together to accomplish an important need.

Imagine what the situation would be like in our community if an organization such as Reason had not been here for the last five years. Reason Animal

From the Chief's Desk
Keeping our children safe

Members of the Winters Police Department recently attended the 83rd Legislative Law Update hosted by Ballinger Police Department, to keep abreast of changes and updates affecting the citizens of the State Of Texas.

This past legislative session made fewer than usual changes in the states laws but several of the changes directly affect many of our day to day activities. Unfortunately most people don't learn of changes and updates to the statutes until you are signing a citation or worse. To keep our community informed of changes, I have chosen to share some of those changes through this column rather than our citizens having to learn of their existence through unfortunate police contacts.

One of the more dramatic changes affects parents and students traveling in areas surrounding our schools and in posted school zones. Whether delivering children to school or passing through school zones or reduced speed areas during times school zones or school crossings are in effect, the use of wireless communication devices are illegal. Wireless communication device is simply an elongated term for a cell phone or other similar device.

In the past communities had the option of enforcing a similar law and were required, in order to enforce the law, to post signage stating the use of cell phones was prohibited while traveling through school zones. The posting of signs is

no longer required as the law now is enforceable in all school zones and the option of communities choosing to, or not to enforce this law has been removed.

Of course, with every good law, there are always exclusions to the law. Exclusions to this law include the use of a cell phone while the vehicle is stopped or parked, or if the phone is being used with a hands free device. Other exceptions include if the phone is being used at the time while making an emergency call to police, fire, or other emergency provider.

Other changes include amendments to the operation of a vehicle by persons under the age of 18. The law has been amended to prohibit all drivers under the age of 18 from operating a motor vehicle between the hours of midnight and 5 a.m. In addition, drivers under the age of 18 are now prohibited from operating a motor vehicle with more than one non-family member under the age of 21. In addition to this law, the exemption under this section for teens having been issued a hardship license has been removed.

This law was designed in part to protect our children during periods of high risk. It has been a near tradition for teens to cruise the roadways with their friends after hours and on weekends. Unfortunately a car load of teens also means a car load of driver distractions placing an inexperienced driver and his, or her, passengers at greater risks of harm. The ultimate goal of the writing and enforcement of these laws is, simply, keeping our children safe.

Weather Whys

Q: I heard a weather forecaster talk about thundersnow. What is thundersnow?
A: Thundersnow is the rare combination of thunder and lightning within a snowstorm, says Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M University. "This phenomenon occurs when a deep convection within a snowstorm allows the clouds to extend high enough for an electrical charge to develop," he explains. "Thundersnow can occur along storm fronts, and is often associated with lake-effect snow, making the Great Lakes a prime region in the United States for its occurrence. In Texas, thundersnow has been reported as far south as San Angelo, though most events have been observed in the Panhandle, especially around Lubbock and Amarillo. Thunder in a snowstorm is more difficult to hear than in a rainstorm because the snow muffles the rumble to where it can only be heard within a radius of a couple miles."

THE ORGANIZATION OF RUNNELS COUNTY

The railroad takes ownership and names the new settlement

WINTERS- June 14, 1886, was the date for a Special Term of the Runnels County Commissioners Court. The special meeting was for the purpose of being a Board of Equalization at the courthouse in the Town of Runnels. The Judge, C.H. Willingham, the Sheriff, J.M. Formwalt, Commissioners, F.M. Bright, H.C. Wylie, Marion Teel and County Clerk, W.L. Towner, County Clerk also Mr. S. Gurley, Deputy Co. Clerk was all present.

After examining the county assessment sheets of the Tax Adjuster for the year of 1886, they found the renditions of several property owners were very low. The court ordered the County Clerk to give notice to the property owners to appear before the Honorable Court on Monday June 28 to show why their renditions of their property should not be raised. The list of 26 property owners was from all over the State of Texas. The court ordered the Assessor-Collector to place all unrendered (as written in the minutes) dry land on his rolls at \$2 dollars per acre and all watered land at \$2.50 per acre. The court paid the due to all officers and then adjourned until June 28, for the purpose of equalizing the property taxes.

With the railroad now as close as Brownwood,

Texas the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Company sought a route to San Angelo as a terminus in West Texas. More than a month before the town lot sale in June 1886, the town already had a population of about 200 with tents going up every week. The county paper (The Texas Eagle, May 20, 1886) published the article saying the town's chances were good. They approved of the location near the Colorado except for the fact "the lower part of the tract on which the town is to be built has been known to flood by a rise in the river. The concern was that an extraordinary rise may cause the high land to overflow. These fears have proved on several later occasions to be well-founded.

This booming tent city had a problem —no name. The Post Office department would not approve of the name Hutchings City since there was already a post office named Hutchins. One of the tent residents suggested Toombs City but others adopted the name, Gresham. The Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Rail Road officials ignored all of these and called the new prospective town, Ballinger, in honor of a Galveston Attorney, William Pitt Ballinger. The newspaper (The Eagle) then announced:

"No more the dismal 'Toombs' we'll hear; But 'Ballinger' will be, And far and wide her

fame will sound From Runnels to the sea."

Word was getting out far and wide as more and more people came. A Galveston paper, The News, reported there were 700 or 800 people scattered all around the area and others were arriving daily.

White tents gleamed everywhere and the whole country presented the appearance of a mining camp with its sights and sounds.

Revelry came from an improvised pavilion and dance house. People were everywhere as well as the cowboys, living in every sort of primitive habitat "from brush jackals" to aristocratic board shanties with canvas roofs. Ballinger very quickly acquired a reputation for being a very rough place. The newly erected Clifford Hotel was burned on a Saturday night a month before the official opening. A few days later, Bill Collins "brutally murdered Albert Krencke, a German cook at a dance hall. No record was found as to what happened to Collins. According to stories in keeping with the spirit of early Ballinger justice, a man supposedly indicted for a major offense came to trial as his own lawyer. The judge notified him to secure an attorney since the man knew nothing of the law. He refused, then turned around and blackmailed the court. The case was dismissed.

With the survey of the town complete, the Santa Fe Company set June 29, 1886 as the date for the sale of lots. The railroad began an advertisement and promotion campaign, also excursion trains to run from several points. Passengers were charged one-half fare to be refunded if they bought lots costing \$100 or more. The newspapers' account of the time glowingly described the site in much detail. Even the "prickly cactus with its brilliant bloom" would soon be cherished as a house plant. (A History of Runnels County" Self).

Information from the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Rail Road, indicated the new town seemed to have an abundance of everything, water, pure air, scenery, building materials and it was the prettiest "Natural Park" in Texas according to the news.

Runnels City was boasting of several lovely homes at this time and also the two-story rock jailhouse that was built by the county. It was a difficult time due to the drought and no grass for the cattle. Prices were still very cheap. The disaster of the severe drought presented insurmountable obstacles to the town. With each passing day, more people left for the metropolis on the Colorado River. The water supply was critical. The citizens' hopes for a railroad faded after so

long when they found it to be a myth. The two men had promoted the whole affair for the purpose of getting any inflated survey contract. (Runnels Is My County, Charles Poe)

Since the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Rail Road lines now extended to Brownwood, Texas (from "A History of Texas Rail Roads") the officials had decided Ballinger and San Angelo were promising points.

A railroad official rode his horse across the fields and asked W. T. Routh if he would be interested in selling his land near Ballinger to be stocked with cattle. Mr. Routh told him that he would not because he had cattle of his own. Six months later the same official rode back across the ranch and asked Mr. Routh if he would be willing to sell for a railroad right-of-way. "Yes, I would sell for that purpose." He said. The land was bought for the sum of \$6000 dollars.

Mrs. Routh was promised a free lot for her home and one for her church. (Runnels Is My County, Charles Poe).

On the matter of mattresses...

Goldilocks didn't realize it at the time, of course, but she had it comparatively easy — lucky beyond measure — to find the "just right" bed on the third try. Within mere seconds of trying out The Three Bears' beds, she nestled comfortably, thinking — albeit erroneously — that all was right with her world.

Today we are challenged by dozens of eye-crossing choices offered by many firms, some with big ads proclaiming whatever day it is to be the best day ever to purchase a new mattress.

Our first one served us well for nigh onto 40 years — until it buckled 14 years ago. When they removed the mattress, a card fell out: "Re-Elect LBJ to the US Senate..."

My wife and I thought

we were careful shoppers back there at century's turn, hoping to buy another king mattress to take us to 2040 or so. After all, we bought from a reputable company that made good on warranties. They replaced our mattress twice in a single decade.

Authorities say that the average life of mattresses now is seven to nine years.

And young adults are largely to blame. Back when, mattresses were constructed with durability in mind; comfort was a distant second. Nowadays, it's all about comfort, bells, whistles and miscellaneous technology. Durability concerns rarely come up....

During my youth, family mattresses — always

"used" — were cotton-filled. When they sprang leaks, we called Elmo Let-better, who reconditioned with cotton re-fills.

There were no warranties to deal with, since the mattresses — like clothes — were hand-me-downs.

'Course most folks did far more physical labor in those days, so we could sleep anywhere — on pallets, cots, air mattresses and curled up in a wheelbarrow. Creek bank sleeping was fine should fishing be involved....

A few weeks back, we discovered mattress-sagging on both sides. Yep, it was time to shop for a new one — our fourth try since 2000. (I can live with my "matted hair," but not if it is caused by a bad mattress.)

Brenda "deaf-eared" my suggestion that we consider a gently-used, \$17.50 mattress listed on Craigslist. So, we watched ads, read Consumer Reports and called various stores to find a king mattress that was "just right."

We "lucked out" on the first store we visited....

I never thought I would admit this, but here goes: A computer was our best friend. We were escorted to a computer-assisted mattress that provided important data, thus simplifying our search. All we had to do was lie down and follow instructions. Within five minutes, the "Expert Match™" had spit out information on our sleeping contortions, movement and more stuff, and then the nice salesman suggested mattresses that came closest to meeting our needs.

There was no pressure. He asked us to try a few,

and we made an almost iron-clad decision on one we liked and could afford.

We then visited a couple of other stores, both of which fell short — not only because they didn't use computers to determine our likes and wants, but they vowed "never to be undersold." One wanted us to find the best price around, then return for him to beat it....

Soon we were back at the store first visited, print-out in hand. Our purchase was made from Aaron Simmons, who, while saying nice things about Simmons mattresses, regretted being a limb on a different Simmons tree. He's an absolute sleep expert, though, who has heard it all. (He spoke of one customer seeking a mattress for her pet pig. She insisted on steel coils; otherwise, her pet would "root" through the foam in short order. Another guy

wanted a king bed with a matching, extra-long twin bed, the latter for his dog.)

The very next day, deliverymen came. During the minutes before delivery, Brenda was readying our vacuum cleaner, ready to "attack" when the old mattresses were removed. She told them she just couldn't imagine where all the dust came from; I'm sure it's been there since the last mattress was brought in.

For folks about to embark on a mattress quest, please consider our experiences. And don't try to act like an expert. Aaron and his associates know better, but they'll smile and help you anyway!...

Area author launches novel at Carnegie Library

BALLINGER- Ballinger author Christine Kohler brought a WWII cannon shell and coconuts to her novel launch at the Carnegie Library January 18, 2014 — the official release date of *No Surrender Soldier* published by Merit Press (Adams Media/ F+W Media).

"It was important to me to hold my book launch at the Carnegie Library in Ballinger," said Kohler, who has lived in Ballinger for nearly six years. "I'm really appreciative to the library board and librarian, Ruth, for organizing this event."

No Surrender Soldier, a young adult novel set in Guam in 1972, tells the story of 15-year-old Kiko who is dealing with an older brother serving in the Vietnam war and a grandfather who has dementia. He has also just learned that when his mother was a teen during World War II, she was raped by a Japanese soldier when Guam was occupied by Japan. What Kiko doesn't know is that a WWII Japanese soldier has been hiding in the jungle for 28 years. The novel deals with themes of shame, forgiveness, redemption and courage.

The WWII cannon shell during Kohler's lecture showed what the real "no surrender soldier" who hid on Guam used to dig an underground tunnel where he lived the last eight years. She used coconuts to illustrate how difficult it would be to survive in the jungle.
