1 can (20-oz.) Dole Crushed Pineapple in

syrup 1/2 cup diced onion ½ cup chili sauce

1/2 cup packed brown

2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce 1 teaspoon dry mustard

Wipe pork with damp paper towel. Cut slits about halfway through meat between bones. Place ribs on roasting rack with a drip pan. Sprinkle with salt. Cover ribs with foil. Bake in 325° oven 2 hours until tender. Meanwhile, combine remaining ingredients in a medium saucepan. Simmer 30 minutes. Spoon sauce evenly over all of ribs. Bake uncovered 30 minutes. Makes 6 servings.
