But now that the squash have peaked in their production, we are beginning to weary of them just a little.


After picking them by the waterbucket full almost daily, squash are no longer any great thrill.


After people got to where they would shake their heads with a tolerant "no" before we even finished saying "do you need .... " we began freezing the stuff for winter time use.

#### Board **Tends** To Business

The Prairiland School Board met Monday night and tended to some routine business.

After hearing the minutes and approving them, the board approved the Title I education program, raised the cooks at the three schools to \$3.60 per hour, and raised the head cooks extra pay from \$50 a month to \$70 a month.

A discussion of the building renovation going on at Blossom and Deport Elementary Schools was held, with the board hearing progress reports on air conditioning, new window installation, lowering of ceilings and various other facets of the renovation program currently going on. The board also approved

the financial statements for the school.



School Students may buy lunch for \$.80 and breakfas. for \$.50. Children from families whose income falls within the level shown on the following scale are eligible for either free meals or reduced-price meals. To apply for free or fill out an application as soon as possible, sign it, and return it to the school. Please answer all questions

on the form. An application which does not contain the total household income, the names of all household members, social security numbers of all household members 21 years or older or a statement that the household member does not have one, and the signature of an adult household member cannot be processed by the school. The information on the application may be checked by the school or other of-

ficials at any time during the school year. If your child is approved for meal benefits, you must tell the school when your household income increases by more than \$50 per month (\$600 per year) or when your household size decreases. You may apply for benefits at any time during the school year. If you are not eligible now, but have a decrease in household income, become unemployed, or have an increase in family size, fill out an application at that time. If you have foster children living with you, they may be eligible for these benefits. If




