

Armed Robbery And Wrecks Mark Week

It just doesn't happen around here...but last Friday it did. Francis Food Store, located on Hwy. 271 in Deport, was robbed by an armed robber.

Shortly before 11 a.m., owner Floy Francis went to the bank to make a deposit, leaving employee Carol Hunt and her infant son at the store.

She noticed an old brown station wagon, parked at the adjacent roadside park, but didn't pay much

attention to it. Almost as soon as she was out of sight, a short, thin man with a ski mask over his face came into the store and pointed either a rifle or a shotgun at Mrs. Hunt, demanding that she give him all the money.

Mrs. Hunt complied, and he told her to "hurry up", then took the money and began to leave. He turned back, told her he would kill her if she "stuck her head out of the door" and

left. She took her child and hid in the bathroom until Mrs. Francis returned, only a few moments later. Mrs. Francis immediately called law officers, roadblocks were set up, but no suspect has yet been apprehended.

The amount of cash is not completely determined, although it was probably in the neighborhood of \$300. The matter is currently under

investigation by the Lamar County Sheriff's Office.

Other problems arose during the week, too, as a burglary and two auto accidents upped the toll of unrest in the area.

Last Thursday night a car of people "just passing through" ran under a Pilgrim Industries semi-tractor trailer rig that pulled out in front of them just west of Deport on

Highway 271.

Then, Saturday night, Alan Frazier of Deport was involved in a one-car accident that resulted in total destruction of his vehicle, and a light pole with a street light on it.

Frazier apparently lost control of his vehicle on the business 271 Loop in Deport, ran off the road and snapped the light pole off. He was carried to a Paris hospital for

treatment of injuries.

Sunday night, it was the turn for crime once again, as Billy's Garage, located at the south end of Deport, was broken into sometime during the night, resulting in the theft of \$3,000 worth of tools and shop equipment. Lamar County Sheriff's Department has that matter under investigation, also.

But the end is in sight now...and for the first time in my life, I feel very sure that I will appreciate a kitchen...oh, how much that kitchen is gonna be appreciated!

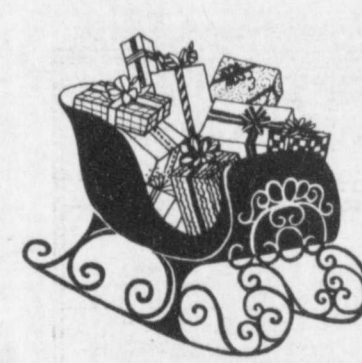

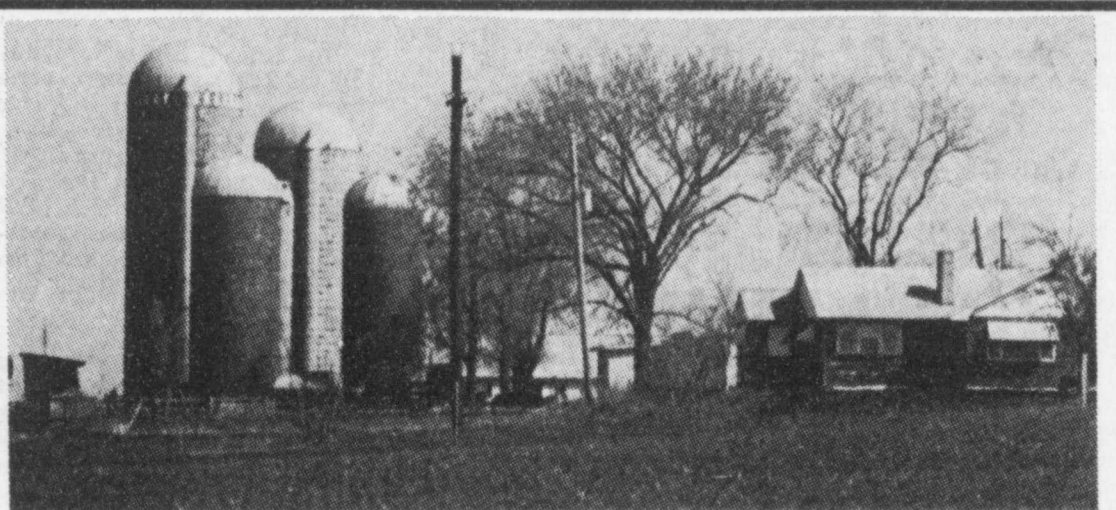

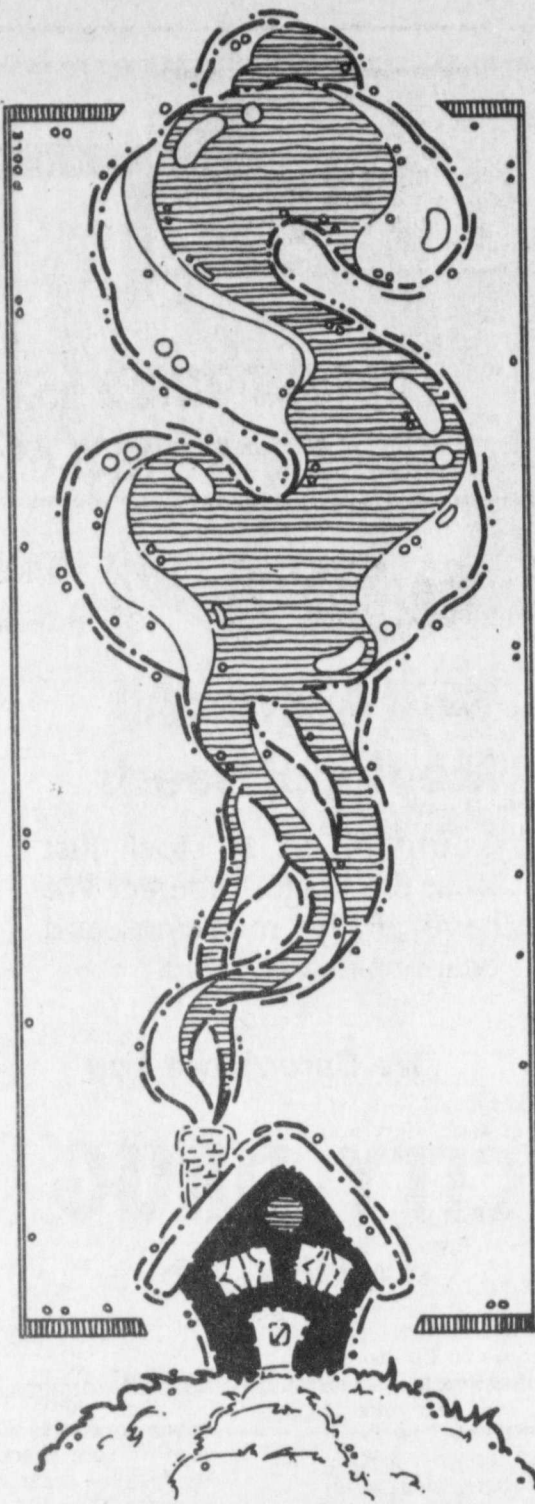

Educators Make Trip To Florida

The United States Navy invited three persons from Prairiland CISD to visit the U.S. Naval Training Station and Kennedy Space Center at Orlando, Florida recently.
Making the trip were Leslie Taylor and Richard Nash from administration and Richard Rast for the Science department.
This was a very exciting and educational three day trip. The time schedule was very close with excellent guides who were knowledgeable from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration plus the U.S. Navy personnel.
The trip began on Wednesday, November 7 at the Naval Air Base in Grand Prairie, Texas. There were eighty school personnel from northeast Texas making the trip. We boarded the plane from Dallas and flew to Orlando. All arrangements were made by the Navy, plus the expenses for the trip. Upon arriving in Orlando, we were transported to the motel where we were to stay for three nights.
The first evening of the seventh, we attended a meeting where the officials gave us a schedule of the three days activities.
At 5:30 a.m. Thursday morning, we got a renewed feeling of being in the service. Everyone was scheduled to begin the tour at 7 a.m. This was a very special morning. At 7:13, we got to see a sight very few Americans have seen, we watched the space shuttle and rocket rise from the launching station until it reached its desired height and began to turn toward its orbital flight. The weather and visibility were excellent.
About 7:30 a.m., we loaded the bus and traveled to the U.S. Naval Training Center where we were greeted by the commander of the base. We were given a tour by slides showing what we should see. Then we were divided into groups and given the grand tour. The first stop was at the introduction center for recruits. This base handles basic training for both male and female. It is one of the largest training bases of the Navy.
We got to talk to the basics who were in their first week of training. At this time the recruits were wondering if they did the right thing. Around 10 a.m. we began to visit the

training classes for the first four weeks of basic. I will vouch for the fact our Navy is in good hands. Some of the training they go through equals any program these boys and girls faced in high school.
About 12 noon we visited and ate lunch in the base mess hall where we sat with recruits in their fourth week of training, the lunch was very delicious, but the outstanding thing was at this stage, 99 percent of those students were showing pride and were glad they were there.
After lunch, we began to visit the advance classes for the five to eight weeks training. This was educational in that each recruit was training at their individual pace. We visited with the electrical division, the computer department and visited the barracks of a squadron who were to graduate the next morning. After talking with them for about one hour, we honor they felt. They were all glad they were in the Navy and looking eagerly to their next training.
At about 4 p.m. we toured the high technical training of the weapons division and the nuclear training program. It is hard to believe a torpedo can explode and destroy a submarine without touching it.
About 5:30 p.m. we assembled on the bus to return to the motel. We only had time to freshen up then we returned at the Naval Station (the officers club) for a formal banquet after which we returned to the motel around 10:30 p.m.
About 5:30 a.m. Friday morning, we prepared to eat breakfast. The tour began at 7 a.m. We returned to the Naval Base to witness the full dress review of the graduating class. This was one of the most thrilling sights we observed. The Under Secretary of the Navy, Mr. Goodrich, gave the address.
After the review, we boarded the bus for our trip to the Kennedy Space Center. By watching television, we can't possibly conceive everything involved in the launching of a missile, the shuttle and especially the Apollo 15.

- Ag Update**
The first killing frost is a shade late arriving in the area this fall, but when it does arrive, the danger of Prussic Acid poisoning in cattle grazing frosted Johnson Grass, Sudan and Milo stubble will be real. In fact, individuals with the above named plants in their pastures would be wise to remove their stock until those plants are cured following a killing frost.
Many farms have been received in our office the last week or so from individuals concerned about Prussic Acid and wanting to know about the safe period. To be on the safe side, wait for about a week or 10 days after a killing frost before allowing cattle to graze those plants. If these plants are cut for hay, there should be no danger of Prussic Acid poisoning as the curing process destroys the causative problem. If in doubt, keep them out.

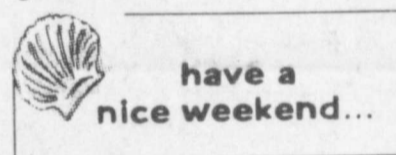
