

Armed Robbery Suspect Surrenders

A twenty-four year old Talco area man, Ronnie Stephen Clements, was arrested Saturday at 5:45 p.m. and charged with the Wednesday morning armed robbery of the Deport Shamrock Station, is a suspect in the armed robbery of Francis Food Store and the Enloe State Bank.

The Francis Food Store robbery was expected to go before the Grand Jury on Wednesday, December 5 and charges of aggravated bank robbery were filed in Eighth Judicial District

Court on Tuesday, December 4 by the District Attorney's office for the Friday night armed robbery of the Enloe State Bank.

The apparent end to what appeared to be a crime spree came when Clements surrendered to Lamar County Deputy B.J. McCoy and Texas Ranger Eddie Almond in Bogata on Saturday. The suspect's father of Blossom, called the Lamar County Sheriff's Office and said his son would give himself up, but didn't want a lot of police cars converging

on him. Law officers then went to Bogata and arrested Ronnie Clements.

The first armed robbery occurred on Thursday, when a small, thin man in a ski mask and armed with a rifle or shotgun entered Francis Food Store and demanded the money.

Just after this paper's release last Wednesday, November 28, the Shamrock Station west of Deport on Highway 271, and operated by Edith Mitchell, was held up in almost the same fashion. Mrs. Mitchell iden-

tified a black Chevrolet Luv pickup fleeing the scene, and a small black pickup was seen at the Francis Food Store robbery scene.

Mrs. Mitchell said, too, that the suspect was small, thin and wearing a ski mask and armed with what she thought was a shotgun.

On November 30 at around 7 p.m. the Enloe State Bank, located in Delta County, was held up, and again the black Chevrolet Luv pickup was identified.

Delta County law officers pursued the bank robbery suspect, and more law officers picked up the trail, with roadblocks being set up all over the area around Cunningham.

The driver of the black truck made a "U" turn and attempted to flee back west, but law officers shot the tires on the vehicle out.

The suspect then fled through a pasture and into some woods on foot. Reportedly around \$9,000 was found scattered in the cab of the truck, plus

a weapon.

The search for the robber went on until 2 a.m. Saturday morning, but dogs apparently lost the trail and could not pick it up again.

Law enforcement officers worked on the case all day Saturday, and then the call to the Sheriff's Department from the suspect's father was received.

The truck has been impounded by Lamar County Sheriff's deputies, and bond was set at \$50,000 by Justice of the Peace Chester Oakes.

Prairiland Patriots Take Second At Rivercrest

The Prairiland Patriot men hoopsters won their second straight place trophy during the past weekend at the annual Rivercrest Tournament.

The Patriots opened the tournament with a win over Saltillo Thursday night. Prairiland jumped ahead for a quick ten to nothing lead and never looked back. The ten points consisted of five for five shooting from the fired up Patriots.

The second quarter was just as lopsided for the Patriots as they increased their lead to 38 to 19. The lead could be attributed to an intense defense as well as a good offensive display by the Patriots. The third quarter was the same as the second as the Patriots again scored 18 points and gave up another nine. At the end of the third quarter, the Patriots held a 56 to 29 lead over Saltillo. The last quarter was the closest of the game as Prairiland outscored Saltillo only ten to nine. The final score of the game was Prairiland 66 to Saltillo 38.

Scott Scudder was high point scorer for the balanced offensive attack of the Patriots as he scored 14 points. Scudder was followed by 12 points from Kalvin Williams, ten of which he scored in the first half, and ten from Joel Ballard.

The Patriots continued their winning ways Friday night in the tournament semi-finals against a powerful Cooper team.

The Patriots opened the game in opposite fashion from their prior

victory. The Patriots started the game out cold and trailed after the first quarter 8 to 15. Junior pivotman Mike Connot contributed six of these Patriot points. The Patriots recovered enough in the second quarter to tie up the game at 25 all.

This comeback was made possible by a hustling defense and strong rebounding. The Patriots and Cooper engaged in a bit of controversy in the third quarter. After a Kalvin Williams three point play, the scorekeeper, and the coaches disagreed on the score. After five minutes of arguing and lobbying from the fans, the score was posted on the scoreboard with 7:01 left with Prairiland leading 40-38. The scoreboard riled up Cooper enough to make a comeback and lead with 3:55 on the clock 47-44. With 1:19 remaining, the Patriots clawed to within one point after consecutive baskets from Heath Kennedy. With :38 left on the clock, Scott Scudder tipped in a Joel Ballard shot to put Prairiland back on top 50-49. With four seconds on the clock, Joel Ballard made two freethots to insure a 52-49 Patriot victory. Many people left the gym with the belief that Prairiland won 52-51.

The Patriots were denied of a first place finish Saturday night in the final game against the host, Rivercrest Rebels.

The Patriots from the get-go had problems containing the tall Rebel postman. The tall Rebel seemed to answer every Patriot basket with

one of his own. The Patriots trailed after the first quarter 14-8. The second quarter was a carbon copy of the first as Prairiland was unable to get a rally going. The taller Rebels led at halftime 26 to 20. The third quarter was a small victory although Prairiland trailed 42 to 34. The victory was that the Patriots, mainly Heath Kennedy, decided to take the ball to the Rebel postman. The powermoves got the talented Rebel into foul trouble to harness his aggressiveness. The Patriots got their long awaited rally going in the fourth quarter. A tight man to man defense got Prairiland to within a point after a Kalvin Williams basket with Rivercrest leading 53-52, with 1:09 remaining. The rally was then stalled as Rivercrest hit their free throws and the Patriots failed to make another basket. The final score of the game was Rivercrest 57, Prairiland 52. High point scorers for the Patriots in the final game were Kalvin Williams and Scott Scudder with 12 points apiece.

Along with a second place trophy in the tournament for Prairiland, Patriot Kalvin Williams was named to the boy's All Tournament Team. Patriot Coach Dan Harris was pleased with his hustling team. Harris commented, "We played hard and kept our poise. We just could not get the ball in the hole."

The next Patriot's men's games will be at the North Lamar Tournament from December 6 through December 8.

Pat Fems Third

The Prairiland Patriot fems won third place during the weekend at the Rivercrest Tournament.

The Patriots, playing perhaps the toughest schedule in the tournament, opened against Honey Grove Thursday night. The Patriots opened up the game quickly on the bad end of a six to nothing score. The Patriots managed to get back into the game as their good team speed began to cause Honey Grove turnovers. At the end of one quarter, Prairiland trailed Honey Grove 11-10. The second quarter of the game was played with few fouls called in a rough game. The Patriots trailed at halftime again by one point at 22 to 21, with the aid of a couple of Tanya Burdine bombs.

After the third quarter, Prairiland managed to tie the game up at 28 all, Anita Jaynes scoring the first basket of the fourth quarter with 5:22 left in the third quarter. Both teams started out the fourth quarter with cold shooting as their was 5:52 remaining in the game when Jaynes made a field goal. Donna Vaughn managed to tie the game at 20-20 with a pair of free throws. Deana Watson answered Leopards baskets with a pair of her own, to tie the game at 24 with 28 seconds remaining. broke the tie at the end of the first half as Prairiland led 26 to 24. The third quarter was one where neither team seemed to get going. It took an Anita Jaynes basket with 14 seconds remaining to tie the game at 32 all after three quarters. Behind Donna Vaughn's seven points in the last quarter, Prairiland managed to take a 47 to 44 lead with :59 remaining. Prairiland failed to put the ball in the basket for the remainder of the game. Two baskets in the last 18 seconds of the game gave West Lamar a 50 to 47 win over Prairiland.

With the game practically won, Prairiland made 8 points to counter Rivercrest's 8. Prairiland won third place with the final score over Rivercrest being 48 to 31. High scorer was Deana Watson with 14 points.

Named to the All Tournament Team from Prairiland were Tanya Burdine and Donna Vaughn. Coach Ronnie Baker was pleased with his team throughout the tournament. Baker stated, "We will have to learn from the tournament and we will get better."

The Varsity girls opened district play on the road Tuesday night with a 55-48 loss to Pittsburg.

Prairiland, behind the hot shooting of Anita Jaynes, trailed Pittsburg at halftime 18-17. Jaynes scored nine of Prairiland's points.

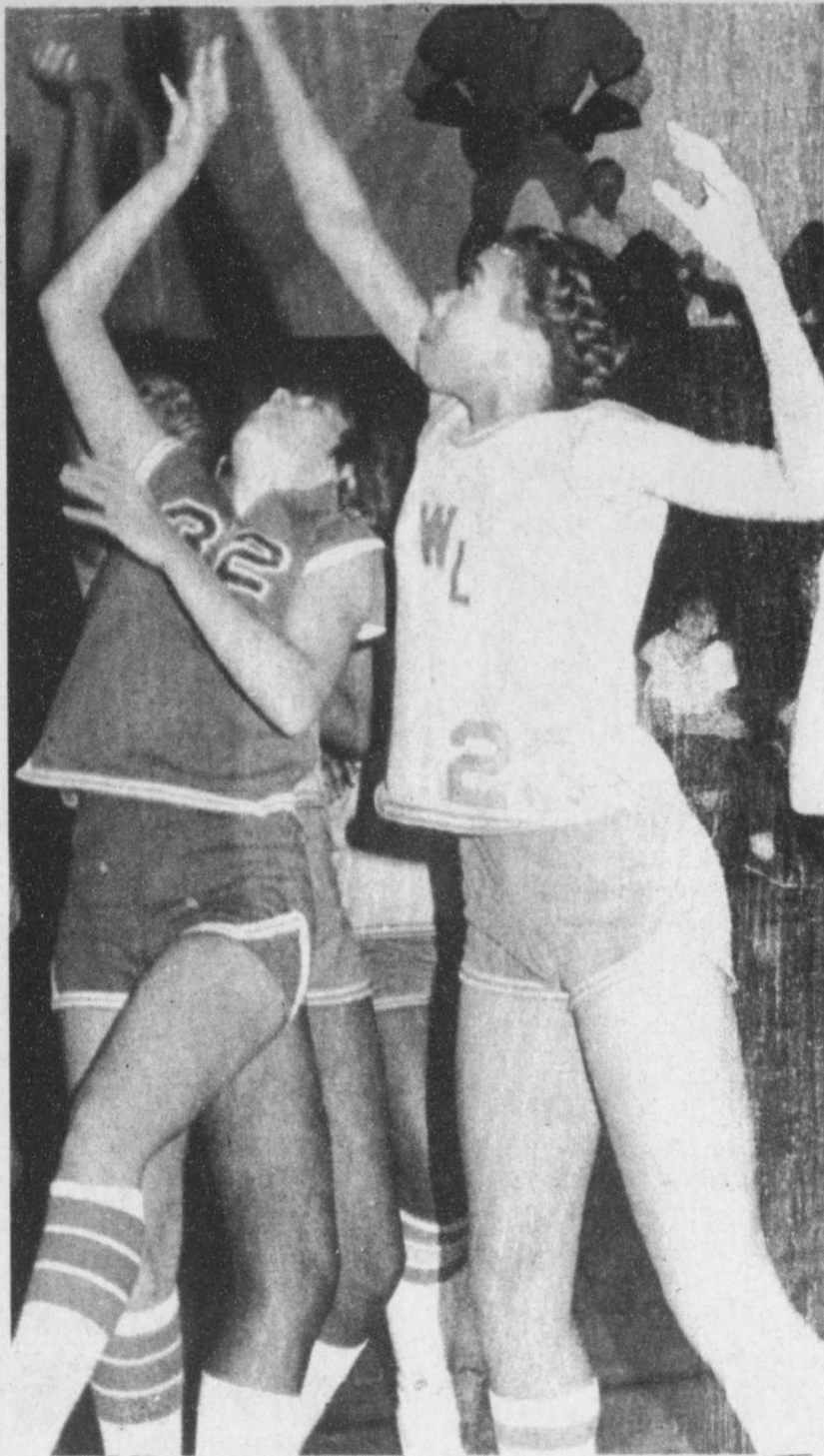
