

# Patriot Girls Take Second In Leonard

The Patriot fems achieved much success over the holidays as they won four games and lost one to win second place in the Leonard Holiday Tournament.  
The Patriots won their first game in the tournament Thursday morning as they defeated Celina.  
The first half of play was a bad one for the Patriots as the early morning and long bus trip seemed to affect the Patriots. Klaressa Keys made a couple of freshshots and Paula Farmer made a layup in the final minute of the second quarter as Prairiland led at the half 21-17.

The Patriots, after trailing 4-0 early in the game, played some of their better basketball of the year. Anita Jaynes and Donna Vaughn got a combined effort of 18 points as Prairiland led at the end of the first quarter 18-12.  
The Patriots continued their excellence in the second quarter as they widened their lead to 35-22. Prairiland did everything well in the quarter and were paced by Anita

Jaynes six points.  
The Patriots found the going a little rough in the third quarter as Sabine narrowed the Patriot lead. Donna Vaughn grabbed many rebounds in the quarter and Deana Watson scored the last six points of the quarter as Prairiland led after the third stanza 43-36.  
Sabine rallied in the final quarter and nearly pulled off a win. Using a tough defense, Sabine pulled to within three points in the last twenty seconds of the game but they missed a shot and Kristi Bankhead grabbed the rebound to insure a Patriot victory at 51-48.  
Prairiland met Community, a less explosive team, in the third game of the tournament Friday morning. Prairiland scored 19 points in the game before Community got on the

board with 1:40 left in the quarter. Donna Vaughn scored ten points in the quarter and Deana Watson eight as Prairiland led at the end of the first quarter 23-4.  
Prairiland continued their comical lead in the second quarter as six different Patriots made points. Mandy Graves scored two points in the last 13 seconds of the game as Prairiland led at the half 39-12.  
The third quarter was like all the others in the game, a massacre. Donna Vaughn scored eight points in the quarter and Mandy Graves again made a basket with thirteen seconds left in the quarter as Prairiland led after three quarters 57-16.  
Tonya Burdine made six points in the final quarter and Mandy Graves again showed that she could make the last shot of the quarter.

Prairiland won the game 78-20.  
Prairiland achieved a trip to the finals Saturday morning as they defeated Howe.  
The first half of the game was a hard fought one, as the lead was forever changing. Anita Jaynes and Deana Watson scored six points each as Prairiland led at the half 24-20.  
Donna Vaughn scored six points in the third quarter as Prairiland finally broke away from Howe 38-27.  
Prairiland's poor freeshot shooting in the last quarter nearly dug their own grave. The ultra cold shooting caused reason for concern but Prairiland won the game 43-39.  
Saturday night Prairiland played Honey Grove for first place and was defeated.  
The early going of the game was an indication of how the game would

be. Prairiland scored an anemic four points in the quarter and trailed ten to four.  
Prairiland again trailed after the second quarter by six points. Tonya Burdine made a jumper at the buzzer and Prairiland trailed at the half 18-12.  
Donna Vaughn made the lone Prairiland basket in the third quarter as Prairiland trailed 26-14.  
Prairiland played a little better in the fourth quarter and made a few baskets, but they could not, however, get within range of Honey Grove. Honey Grove went on to win first place, 43-23.  
Anita Jaynes was the player chosen for the All Tournament Team from Prairiland.

## Prairiland Boys Compete At Paris Classic

The Prairiland Patriots got off to a good start in the Paris Classic Friday night as they defeated McKinney quite handily.

The Patriots got a first quarter lead of 1-0 and never trailed in the game. All five starters scored in the first quarter and Calvin Williams made a basket at the buzzer to give Prairiland a first quarter lead of 13-2.

McKinney did not fare well in the second quarter, either, as they fell further behind the Patriots. Scott Scudder scored six points in the quarter and Eric Stewart played well

also. Stewart blocked several shots in the quarter and dominated the boards. Kyle Martin made a shot at the buzzer to give Prairiland a halftime lead of 27-14.

The Patriots scored six points from the free throw line and six from the field in the third quarter as they increased their lead to 39-20.

The final quarter was a slow one as the game was delayed due to the numerous McKinney fouls. The strategy to foul at every opportunity went in vain as Prairiland went on to win 50-28.

Saturday night at Paris, Prairiland lost to the host team, the Paris Wildcats, in the finals of the Paris Classic.

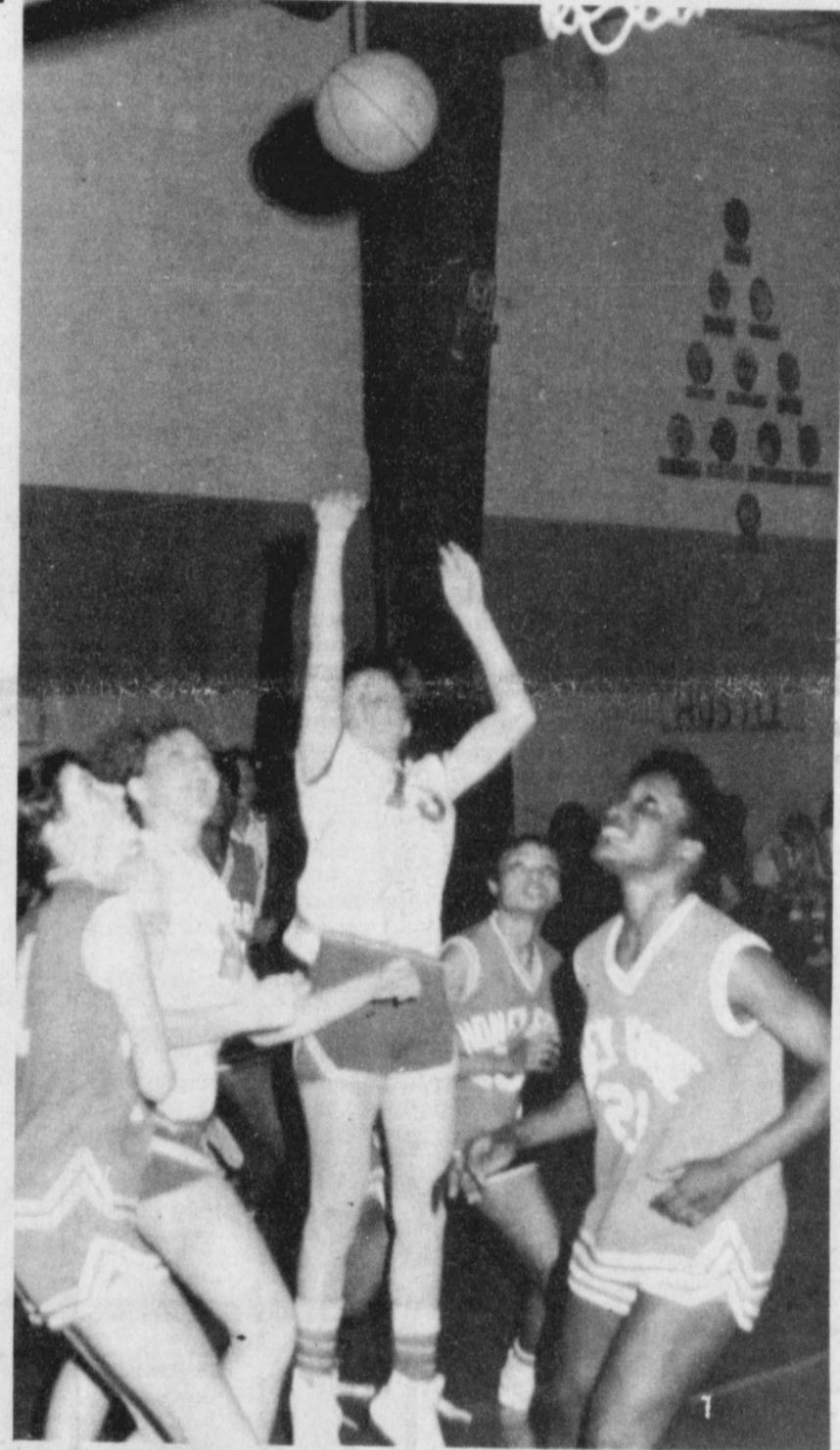
Prairiland trailed 25-12 after the first quarter and never really threatened the Wildcat lead. The game was a usual confrontation

between Prairiland and Paris, as far as the tempo was concerned. Paris was eager to play their usual helter skelter type of game as Prairiland played their ball control game.

Although Prairiland played a hard game, they lost 70-56. High point scorers for the Patriots were Scott Scudder with 16 and Heath Kennedy with 13, Joel Ballard, Mike Connot and Calvin Williams each made eight points.

Prairiland kept their District record unblemished at Daingerfield last week. Prairiland won the game 59-57 in double overtime.

Patriot Coach Dan Harris commented, "We were tickled to death to come away with a win."

captured second place in the prestigious tournament, losing only to Honey Grove. (Staff Photo by James VanDeaver)



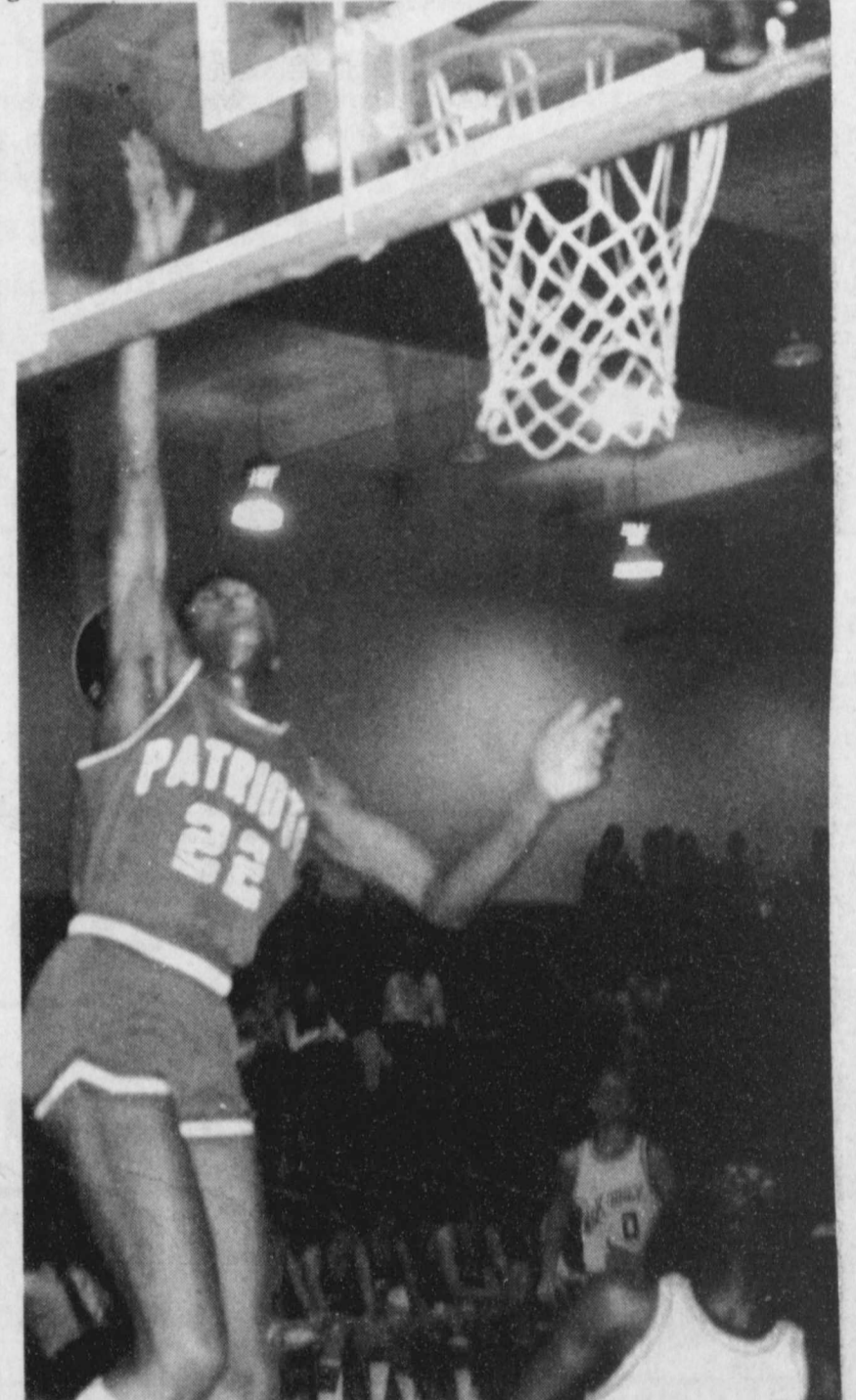
### To The Editor:

## Burglary Attempt And Suspected Arson In Deport

An apparent burglary attempt, and probably arson disturbed Christmas week in Deport.

Christmas eve, a young man and woman, seeking relatives, went to Gifford's Food Store and saw two men standing huddled by the front door. Thinking they might be store employees locking up, the young man approached the pair. When he came close, one whirled and hit him across the face with a crow bar, then the two jumped into a vehicle and fled.

The store had closed early for Christmas even, and the incident occurred around 7 p.m.

The injured man was not hurt seriously, but cannot identify the burglary suspects.

On Thursday, December 27, at around 3 a.m. the Deport Volunteer Fire Department responded to a call

A building located on the north end of main street was ablaze. The firemen extinguished the fire, saving two grain trucks, belonging to Kenneth Thomas of Deport. The trucks were uninsured.

The building, which had housed a dairy-ette type of business, is owned by Hooker and Jo Bryant of Deport.

Arson is suspected in the case, and

also in a burning dumpster, located at the Deport Elementary School, found blazing at the same time. Also on that night, someone broke into the milk case at Roach Oil Company and stole two cases of milk, dumping it out on the highway. The same vandals are suspected in all three incidents.

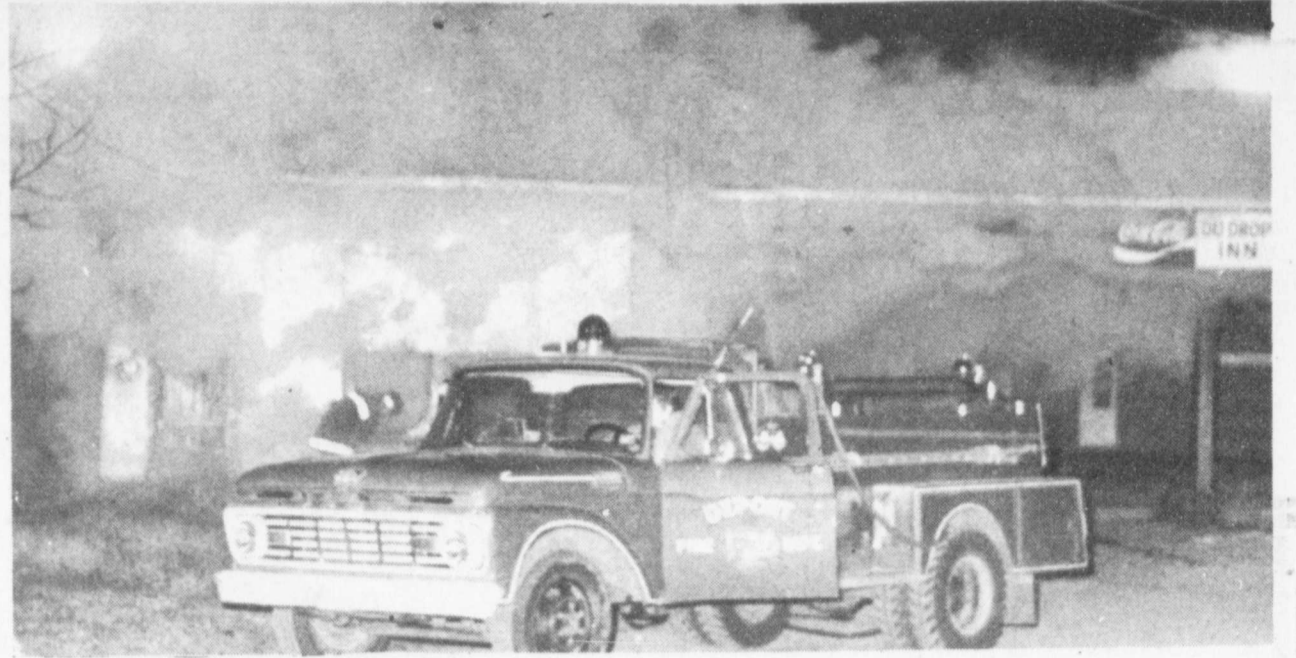
