

# Tornado And High Winds Lash Area

As tornado sirens wailed in Paris, Lamar and Red River County residents sought shelter from heavy storms and tornadoes Monday afternoon. After the storm had moved through, heavy damage and power outages were reported throughout the area.

Paris residents in certain areas were still without power Tuesday, after a large concrete tank was slammed across the road into a power

sub-station, and a number of houses and businesses received damage from the twister as it then tore its way towards Blossom and Red River County.

The funnel cloud set down again just north and northeast of Blossom, tearing up huge trees, moving trailers and destroying barns.

O.W. and Faye Mauldin of Rt. 1, Blossom had their home destroyed. The mobile home of Lisa and Dale

Hunold of the Red Oak Community was moved from its place, and Bobby Rater's barn in Post Oak was torn down. Trees in front of Rater's Dairy were uprooted and a barn on the Homer Flatt Ranch was destroyed. This, and much more damage was reported throughout that section of the area.

The frightening cloud then moved into Red River County, slowly angling northeast as it hit Woodland, ruin-

ing broiler houses, barns and ripping up trees. In Manchester, it destroyed a barn, put trees down on several houses, ripped much of the roof off a house belonging to Cindy Allen, and unroofed the Manchester Store and Cafe.

From there the storm apparently lifted, and most of the rest of the reports were apparently from straight wind damage.

Throughout the Pattonville, Deport,

Bogata, Talco and Cunningham areas, reports of high winds and heavy rain poured in.

Large trees were broken down, huge limbs pulled loose, and sheet iron from barns and outbuildings was torn up.

A barn just north of Deport was destroyed, the structure belonging to G.W. Dickson. Several other barns were also basically ruined.

Bogata and Talco apparently were

lighter hit than areas slightly more to the north, but still there were broken windows, limbs torn off and light weight objects completely carried away.

The weather forecast predicts no severe weather in the near future, but area residents have had their caution renewed, and will be keeping a close watch on the skies again for a while.

## Prairiland Baseball Team Heads For Bi

The Prairiland Patriots will play their bi-district game Monday afternoon at 5 p.m. against their old nemesis, the Hooks Hornets. The game will be played at the neutral territory of North Lamar.

The district champs of Prairiland brought to a close their district season Thursday afternoon at Prairiland as they won 4-3 over North Lamar. The win gave Prairiland a record of 12-2.

In the top of the first inning, North Lamar appeared to have Patriot pitcher Mike Blackburn on the ropes. With one out in the inning, Blackburn gave up back to back singles which resulted in a 1-0 North Lamar lead. Blackburn, though, came back with hard inside fastballs to stifle the rally and did not give up another run in the inning.

Prairiland was quick to reverse a one point lead in the second inning as Prairiland got going offensively. Jay Ingram started the rally with an infield single and moved on over to second when Jon David Loyd reached on an error. Robbie Connot then got the first Patriot RBI of the game with a sharp single to score Ingram. After

an out, Mike Connot hit yet another single up the middle to score Robbie Connot. The Patriots were unable to score any more runs in the inning but they led 2-1.

After both teams were unable to score runs in the third and fourth innings, North Lamar came up with two runs in the top of the fifth inning. Blackburn walked the first batter before getting the next two batters out. Blackburn then walked another batter before issuing a single to make the score 3-2 in favor of North Lamar. The third out came on a ground ball to Robbie Connot.

Prairiland was again able to reverse a one-point lead in the bottom of the fifth inning. Joel Ballard started off the inning with a fly ball to rightfield which resulted in a triple. Scott Scudder then drove in Ballard with an infield single to tie the game up at 3-3. Scott Scudder then stole second and third base and came in to score when the catcher threw the ball into left field. The run gave Prairiland a 4-3 lead after five innings.

Neither team was able to pick up runs in the sixth and seventh innings and Prairiland went on to win 4-3.

## City Of Deport To Get Street Repairs

Street repairs and perhaps a new bridge for the Deport Creek were the main topic of business at the Monday night meeting of the Deport City Council.

Lamar County Judge Brady Fisher and Commissioner Jimmie Sparks were there to help discuss these matters at the meeting.

A block grant for Kelsey and Beville Streets has already been approved and the construction bid approved. Work will begin in the near future. The streets will be resurfaced in the same manner as church street, which runs in front of the Deport Elementary School.

Judge Fisher discussed the block grants for 1986.

To meet income criteria and number of people served and cost estimates to complete the project, the only street that will qualify is Pecan Street, which is approximately 3/10's of a mile long and will cost approximately \$39,000 to resurface.

The city is making application for this grant and agreed to fund 10% of the cost locally.

Application has already been entered for a two lane bridge across Deport Creek at the north end of Main Street.

This bridge will cost approximately \$60,000 and could require local participation of 20%. The city council agreed to meet these requirements.

Delinquent taxes were discussed but no action was taken. Payment of the audit bill was approved and Larry Whittle's contract to haul trash was renewed.

Approval was given to purchase three touch-tone call-waiting phones for the city offices and the meeting was adjourned.

Pam Allen, PhD candidate in German Studies at Indiana University, Bloomington, has been awarded a full fellowship by the Fulbright Commission and the Germanistic Society of America for study in West Berlin during the academic year 1985-86. This particular fellowship is awarded annually to five candidates in the U.S. who specialize in the study of German/American relations. Ms. Allen's concentration focuses upon the cooperation to the U.S. and the Federal Republic of Germany in the area of "Ostpolitik", as well as relations between the Federal Republic and communist East Germany.

The particular project for which Ms. Allen received this award is a comparative study in both West and East of the reception of East German dramatist Heiner Mueller and his presentation of the theme "Vergangenheitsbewältigung". Ms. Allen was also chosen as the Indiana University recipient for the year-long fellowship from the German Academic Exchange Service and the IU-Berlin-Exchange fellowship.

Before leaving for Berlin in October, Ms. Allen will read a paper at the National Convention of the German Studies Association in Washington, D.C. The paper is called "Conquering the Myth of Glorified

Prussian Militarism-The Plays of Heiner Mueller."

Ms. Allen has received a grant from German Academic Exchange Service for participation in a summer seminar on "German National Identity Since World War II" at the University of California at Berkeley. Her contribution to the seminar deals with German identity in the unique case of Berlin.

Ms. Allen was a respondent in the session "German Tragedy" at the Midwest Modern Language Association conference last November and was selected at that time as a Midwest representative for a three-year term on the National Delegate Assembly of the Modern Language Association.
