Children lie-in bed at night with visions of toys, Christmas trees, and Santa Claus flashing before them.

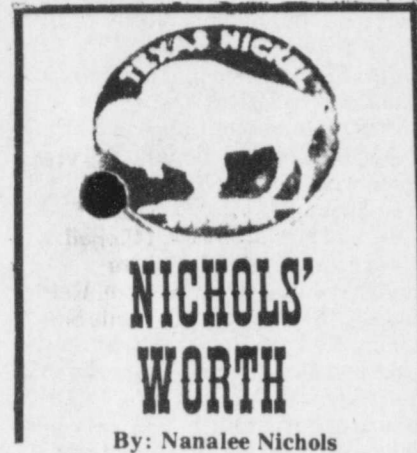
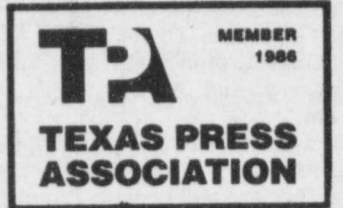
