
Lena Marie Skeen Dies At Age 87







Coyle won in all precincts but the Ir-White and son, Tommy Don of ving High School poll, where Dunn Lewisville, have been attending her had 465 votes to Coyle's 431. Dunn also had more absentee votes than Coyle, picking up 429, while Coyle had 405. Coyle said she thought the race would be closer

> "I didn't ever take it for granted," she said. "I never did go to bed thinking I had it sewed up. They were good competitors.'

> Coyle's largest margin of victory came in the Johnston precinct were she had 143 votes more than Dunn. She also collected 140 more votes in the Thomas Haley precinct.

The farine and J.R. Good precincts were close as Coyle had 13 and 19 more votes than Dunn respectively. Dunn said the difference in the campaign was Coyle's years as a school teacher.

"Judy Coyle has been in the school system many years," he said. "She's touched many lives and many families. She certainly had a great deal of loyalty from many of the citizens of Irving and that certainly showed on election day.'

Coyle agreed that her years as a school teacher made a difference in the campaign.
