# Wet Winter Has Farmers Far Behind

Area farmers will find themselves going day and night when it finally dries up, after one of the wettest winters in recent history.

After a very dry fall, the rain set in early in October, and since that time, farmers have been unable to get into

Winter plowing is undone, and getting the ground ready for planting this spring will be a big job.

Hard freezes and the extreme damp have had cattle producers feeding out more hay than they had anticipated, and many report that their supplies are running low sooner than expected.

The ice which paralyzed the area two weeks ago softened the soil, and mud has become a serious problem for many people feeding livestock.

Most livestock is reported in good

condition, however, and if the area can avoid more serious ice storms, spring grazing will begin to come up within a month or so. Winter is far from over, however,

as weathermen predict more bitter temperatures after the current warming trend.

Armchair gardeners are ordering seed and potato and English pea planting time is fast approaching.

Now is a good time for building new flower beds, if the weather allows, or fertilizing old ones. Rose growers are busy pruning, and the cold freeze may reduce insect populations enough to be a benefit during the coming spring and summer months.

Economists predict that cotton will be in big demand again this year, and local ag specialists expect to see more







A framed map of early Lamar County was presented to the Deport Junior High School in honor of Lamar Day, January 26. Presentation was made by Mrs. James Lowry, Historian of the George Washington Stell Chapter of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas. The Paris chapter sponsored the gift to the school.

In September, 1836, in the first national election, Mirabeau B. Lamar was elected vice-president. He was inaugurated as president on December 10, 1838. An important event of his administration was to select the site of capitol of Texas. A little place

led Waterloo on the Colorado River was chosen. The place was named Austin in honor of Stephen F. Austin, the "Father of Texas"

Lamar's proposal that the congress establish a system of public education endowed by public lands resulted in the act of January 26, 1838, which set aside lands for public schools and two universities. Although it was decades before the school system was established, Lamar's advocacy of the program earned him the title of "Father of Education". This date has become Lamar Day, one of the honor days of Texas.

The town of Lamar and Lamar County, created in 1841, were named for President Lamar.







Crime is a problem affecting everyone. And everyone has a responsibility for crime prevention. The Americaa Legion has a solution to help everyone meet this responsibility, The American Legion's Crime Prevention program, and members of the American Legion Auxiliary are encouraged to promote the Legion's program.

These groups do not take the law into their own hands, but simply extend a helping hand to their local law enforcement officials and neighbors. Several studies have credited such cooperation to crime rate decreases in recent years.

Educate citizens in practical crime prevention techniques. These can range from such simple steps as teaching children emergency phone numbers to joining with neighbors and law enforcement agencies to take collective action

Prevent the victimization of children, harness the energy of young people in crime prevention programs and focus local media and public attention on protecting young people and their futures.

Build partnerships, teenagers and senior citizens schools and law enforcement agencies, business and community groups, who work together in programs as previously mentioned.

Walking-Be Alert 1. Walk with another person if possible

2. If you must walk alone, take note of shadows, which can often alert you to a person some distance away.

3. Avoid narrow walkways between buildings at all times. 4. Walk at a distance from alley entrances or shrubbery.

5. Walk near the curb rather than close to buildings

6. Do not delay in deserted areas. Avoid parks.

8. Carry your purse close to your body or under your coat. Hold it so that the clasp will open toward you, not away. Walk on the side of the street nearest oncoming traffic. Facing traffic, you will see a suspicious car more quickly than if it slips up right behind you. You are safer, too, when there is

no sidewalk and you must walk in the 10. Never take a short cut through

poorly lit areas. 11. Watch for loiterers.

12. Be wary if people in a car stop to ask directions

13. Never accept a ride from a stranger. 14. If accosted by anyone in a car, run in a direction opposite to the way the

car is headed. Run to the nearest dwelling or place of business and summon help. 15. Avoid using public facilities at

night. 16. Allow plenty of time when cross-

ing a street at night, to move with caution and avoid falls. Be on the look out for uneven sidewalks, broken curbs and holes in the street.

Leaving And Returning Home-Be Alert

1. Install lights at dark walkways or driveways in your yard as needed to lessen the chance of falls and assaults

2. Use a flashlight in going to and from the house and garage if there is no yard light

3. Leave an entrance light on if you plan to return after dark.

4. Lock the doors of your residence when you leave. Have your keys out when you come home so you don't have to stand at the door and fish for them in your pocket or purse.


