Robbery Suspects Apprehended Near Deport

A Saturday afternoon chase led to the arrest of three men in connection with a jewelry store robbery, and the strong possibility that they may be tied in with other crimes. The chase ended on Hwy. 271 in Deport, with Constable Randy Boren stopping the suspects.

Mike Huff, a reserve police office, was inside the store and gave chase, as did another man. Outside they saw the three men leaving the parking lot in a tan vehicle with Arkansas Licencse plates.

Constable Randy Boren heard the call come in and spotted the vehicle travelling south on U.S. Hwy. 271 near Pattonville.

Boren continuedchasing the suspects and radioed their location to other departments. He pulled them over on the east edge of Deport city limits, detaining them until other law enforcement officials, including Paris City Police, Lamar County Sheriffs Department, and Red River County


