## Robbery Suspects Apprehended Near Deport

A Saturday afternoon chase led to the arrest of three men in connection with a jewelry store robbery, and the strong possibility that they may be tied in with other crimes. The chase ended on Hwy. 271 in Deport, with Constable Randy Boren stopping the suspects.

Late in the afternoon on January 7 one of the suspects reportedly entered Zales Jewelry Store and looked at some rings. He then left the store but returned, going to a showcase containing the rings. Reports indicate he shoved a female clerk backward, reached over the counter and grabbed a tray containing the jewelry.

Mike Huff, a reserve police officer, was inside the store and gave chase, as did another man. Outside they saw the three men leaving the parking lot in a tan vehicle with Arkansas License plates.

Constable Randy Boren heard the call come in and spotted the vehicle travelling south on U.S. Hwy. 271 near Pattonville.

Boren continued chasing the suspects and radioed their location to other departments. He pulled them over on the east edge of Deport city limits, detaining them until other law enforcement officials, including Paris City Police, Lamar County Sheriff's Department, and Red River County

Sheriff's Department officers.

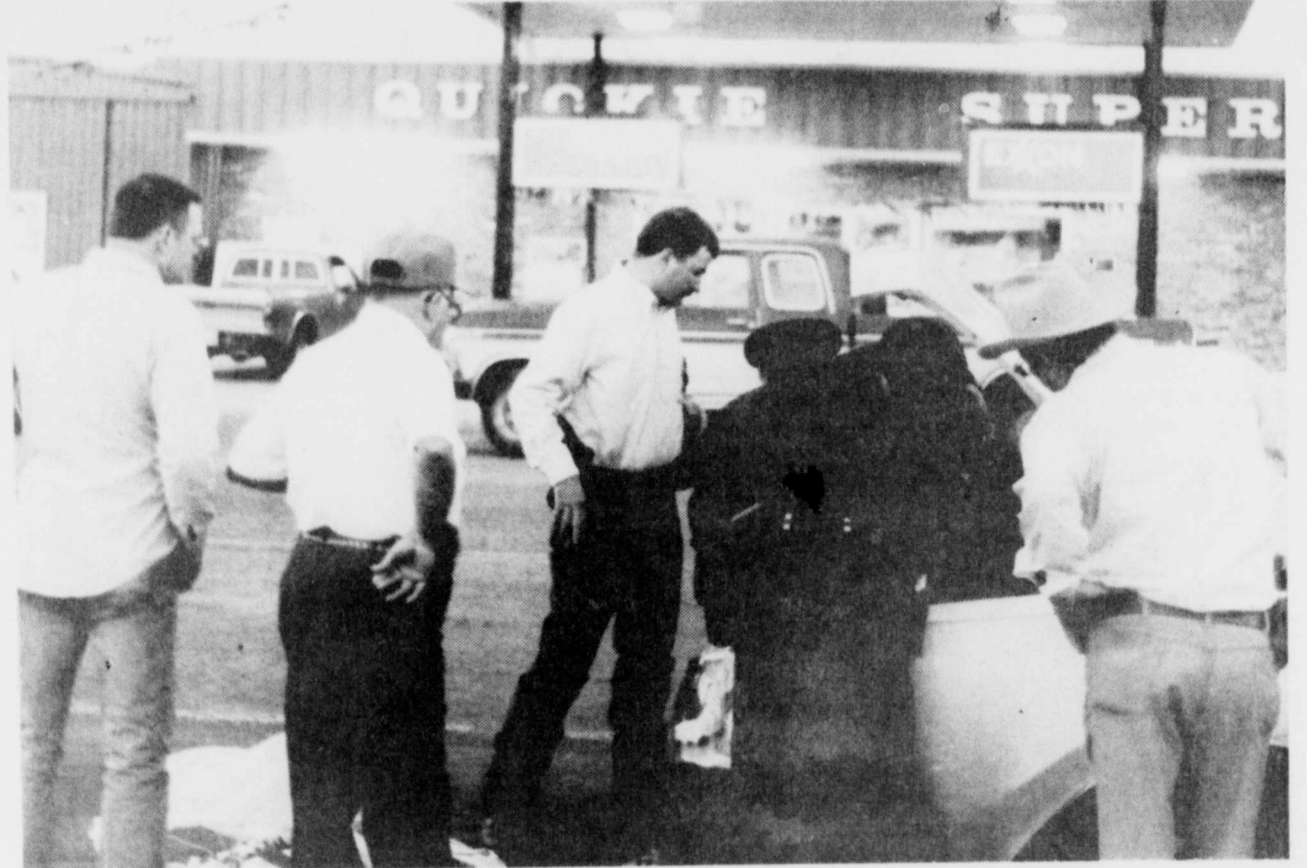
According to Paris Police Department reports all three are wanted in connection with a similar jewelry heist here several months ago, and additional charges are expected to be filed. Authorities are also looking into the possibility of the trio being connected to other crimes.

Roy Terry Barlow, age 22, of Texarkana, was charged with robbery, felony theft over \$20,000 out of Marshall and felony theft over \$750 out of Texarkana. The out-of-town charges come from similar jewelry store robberies, according to the police reports. Barlow was jailed in lieu of bonds totalling \$30,000.

Billy Ray Johnson, age 24 of Texarkana was also jailed, as was Cecil Randolph Carruth, age 22 of Ft. Townsend, Oklahoma. Both were jailed in lieu of bonds totalling \$20,000 on one count each of robbery.

Reports indicate that Barlow and Johnson were out on bail from Daingerfield on theft and robbery charges in connection with a similar incident there.

A search of the vehicle revealed nothing, but a search of one of the suspects revealed the rings hidden inside the underwear of the suspect.

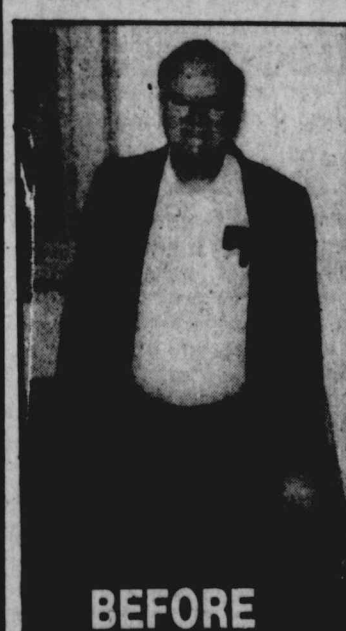
### Bonnie Alexander Dies January 5

## Girl Scout Cookie Sale Begins In Deport

That great American tradition, the Girl Scout Cookie sale, will kick off Friday, January 13 in this area. Girl Scouts will be taking orders through January 27, and customers can expect delivery between February 21 and March 7.

At \$2.25 a box, seven varieties will be available. A new chocolate creme sandwich is being introduced this year, in addition to the old favorites: shortbread, thin mints, caramel delights, peanut butter sandwich, lemon pastry cremes and peanut butter patties.

According to Betsy Mills of Paris, coordinator of the sales for Red River Valley Council, Girl Scouts have been selling cookies as a fundraiser for nearly 70 years, although it hasn't always been as well organized, she said. "The exact origin of the cookie sale has not been determined, but we do know that as early as 1920, just eight years after the founding of the movement in the United States, Girl Scouts began baking cookies and selling them to raise funds," said Mrs. Mills. Today, each council selects one of the three bakeries licensed by Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. to produce the cookies they sell. IN 1987, over 144 million packages of cookies were sold nationwide.

Mrs. Mills said that proceeds from the Girl Scout cookies sold in this area stay in this area. Girl Scout troops keep a portion of the proceeds and de-

cide themselves how they will use their profits. In recent years, the money has been spent on service projects, field trips, campouts and other troop activities.

The sale is also a major fundraiser for the council, which uses the proceeds to purchase equipment and materials, train leaders, maintain and operate Camp Gambill, and provide scholarships for summer camp and for national or international events attended by local members. The council will also be implementing a new drug education project this year, "Fight Drugs" through special events and materials for individual troop activities.

Girls can also earn individual awards according to the number of boxes they sell. Each girl who participates in the sale will receive a theme patch. Other awards include a carmousel horse charm, camping mug, ornament, stuffed animal, canvas tote bag, T-shirt, sweatshirt and a music gift certificate. The top salesgirl in each neighborhood will receive a photo album, and the top seller in the council's 13-county jurisdiction will be awarded a jam box. Girls can also earn up to \$125.00 credit towards resident camp at Camp Gambill.
