We have become NON-OPLE. That's just about the only word for it. We count for nothing...we don't exist, and we can't be called on the telephone except by a select number of people...namely those who know our home phone number or keep very old phone books.

We now have the distinction of being left out of the Contel telephone book and (for the third straight year) the "Paris Area" phone book.

It all started when the Paris Area book failed to list our phone number back in 1987. We politely called these folks and were assured that the error would be corcted. Of course, there was noth-

that could be done about it in that issue. We were still in Contel's book, so we didn't worry about it too

much. Then the next issue came out. Once more we called and were told that it was probably the fault of the phone company. It seems that the Paris Area book consists of listings purchased from Southwestern Bell, Contel, etc. The listings are therefore one year old before they come out in the Paris

Area book! But, I said, we are listed in the phone company book, how come we got left out of your book?

She didn't know. Then the Contel telephone book came out for this year. Guess what?

No listing for Thomas Nichols! I called Contel and a very nice man apologized and looked up our number. He told me we didn'dt exist! I told him that was funny, because they managed to find us once a month at billing time!

He said that our "data base" showed only that we had had a phone installed back in 1972...and he didn't blame us for being upset at not existing.

Very carefully he restructed the data base to reflect our existence. Of course, we'll have to wait for a year to see if we really do!

Then Monday morning arrived, and with it the new Paris Area phone books. No listing for Thomas Nichols.

I called. The girl listened to my tale of woe and transferred me to someone else.

The someone else informed me in haughty tones that we didn't exist...the data base they had purchased didn't include us. I explained the whole thing.

She said "we cannot correct .. if you aren't in the data base we purchase you aren't in the data base....there is absolutely nothing we can do about it".

To say I was irritated puts it mildly. The people at the phone company were helpful, rational and apologetic. This woman made me feel as if we had done something wrong!

So here we are, we aren't in the data base...we aren't in the phone books, we don't exist.

It feels funny...this not existing. I feel real, I look in the mirror and every excess pound of me looks back! We walk, talk and pay bills...even phone bills....yet we don't exist. Somewhere out there the big wasteland of computers we aren't in the data base.

Oh woe is us!. In the meantime, if you need to call our number is 652-5823. (I wonder if OUR computer will manage to print this number out....surely we're in IT'S data base!)

"We have seen a continuous decline in recent months and our latest statistics place the state rate at 6.2% in mid-December. That's the lowest rate Texans have seen since December of 1984," Nabers said.

By way of comparison the September rate was 7.1%; October statistics indicated 6.8%; November's rate was 6.6% and in December a decline to 6.2%. The last time the rate was below 6.2% was in December 1984 when it was 5.6%

The number of unemployed Tex- over-the-month decrease was encouraging, but unemployment has been gradually declining throughout most of 1988. Total employment decreased moderately over the month but was still almost 100,000 above the yearago estimate.

The majority of the 27 Metropolitan Statistical Areas in Texas for which statistics were currently available mirrored the Statewide pattern, with unemployment decreasing in December. Only four major areas had rates which rose over the month, while one MSA's jobless rate remained unchanged. The current rates for four MSA's were slightly above their December 1987 rates, and one area's rate was the same as the year-

Only three MSA's had rates in December 1988 above 10%-McAllen-Edinburg-Mission's current rate was 16.4%, the highest among the MSA's. Laredo's December rate was 12.6% adn the Brownsville-Harlingen MSA's rate was 10.8%. Rates in these border areas generally tend to be higher than average, and unemployment normally increases in the winter months due to migrant workers returning to their homes there.
