Ice, Snow, Bitter Cold Inflict Hardship On Area

Near-record temperatures, a glaze of ice and fine snow combined to create havoc throughout the area when the much talked-about "Siberian Express" pulled into town last Friday.

After several days of eighty degree sunshine temperatures plummeted Wednesday afternoon, and gray skies and rain moved in.

Thursday night turned into a winter nightmare as sleet and freezing rain began to pelt down, coating power lines, roads and sidewalks with a glaze of slippery ice.

Temperatures fell to 8 degrees, with wind chill factors to well below zero.

Accidents, falls and cold-related incidents kept hospitals and law enforcement agencies busy, with no relief in sight.

Temperatures have continued to stay between 10-18 degrees through

out the weekend and early part of the week.

Strangely, the worst of the ice cut off between Deport and Bogata, and Prairiland schools were forced to turn out while Rivercrest remained in session Friday.

A Saturday night session of light snow however, caused Rivercrest, too, to turn out Monday.

With temperatures still low, water pipes began to succumb, and many households have found themselves without water, with broken pipes, or heating water on the stove.

Others listen to the steady drip drip as they leave faucets running to prevent freezing.

Houses without much insulation are almost impossible to heat, and local fire department officials urge caution for people using wood stoves

or kerosene heaters as supplemental heat.

Sunny skies Monday afternoon and Tuesday did much to reduce danger on area roads, but steps and areas in the shade were still slick and hazardous.

Up until this cold spell the winter has been extraordinarily mild.

Flies and even mosquitoes were still active. Pruning of fruit trees and roses was delayed because of a lack of suitable weather.

Unlike most snowy, icy spells in this part of the world, this one is likely to continue for a while.

Weather forecasters are predicting bitter cold at night, but there is a predicted chance of above freezing temperatures later in the week. After that, however, it's still "anybody's guess".

Mayor Hears "Green Carpet" Proposal In Austin

Deport Mayor Charles Foster was one of the officials who were in Austin Monday, January 30, 1989 for the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation meeting on improving the "Green Carpet Route" of highways.

The improvement of the route would include making four lane highways from Paris to Mt. Pleasant as Hwy. 271 went through Deport, Bogata, Talco and other smaller, non-incorporated towns.

The project would come under a 20 year plan or a 10 year plan, with most officials hoping for the ten year

plan. Four lanes would provide for safer traffic passage through the towns, plus in is proposed that income from diesel sales, travelers spending money as they traveled through and an increase in businesses would be helpful to the area.

The proposed project from Franklin County to Lamar County would cost about \$68.1 million.

Of that, \$339,000 would come from local governments for right-of-way and utility relocation and the rest from the state.

Two Arrested On Burglary Of Building

Princt I Constable Randy Boren arrested two Paris men, who have been charged with burglary of a building.

The arrests stemmed from the theft of farm equipment valued at \$2,800,

and belonging to G.R. Woodard of Deport.

Some of the equipment was recovered, and the rest had been cut into scrap metal after being sold to a Paris scrap metal business for \$197.70.

Patterson Files "English" Bill

State Representative L.P. (Pete) Patterson, today filed HJR 48. This legislation proposes a constitutional amendment to establish English as the official language of Texas.

Rep. Patterson said, "My goal in establishing English as the official language is that every citizen will learn to speak English. In our English speaking society, only those persons who are proficient in English have

the opportunity to obtain their highest life potential and reap the benefits our society has to offer.

"The people of the State of Texas want this amendment. Polls indicate a large majority of Texas voters said they support making English the official language of Texas. The passage of this joint resolution by the legislature will give our citizens the opportunity to decide this issue.

From 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays, hotline staff members provide information to anyone who calls 1-800-252-9600. The department helps people obtain information or assistance on a variety of topics ranging from obtaining the address of their state legislators to how to get a copy

of a birth certificate. The hotline also serves as a liaison between the public and state agencies or programs.

During the legislative session, hotline workers expect to field thousands of telephone calls about pending legislation. A summary of the legislative queries will be presented to the governor for his consideration as he reviews bills sent to his office by lawmakers.

The girls placed 3rd in the first half of district with a 3-2 record, and 2nd in the latter half of the season with virtually no hope of the playoffs.

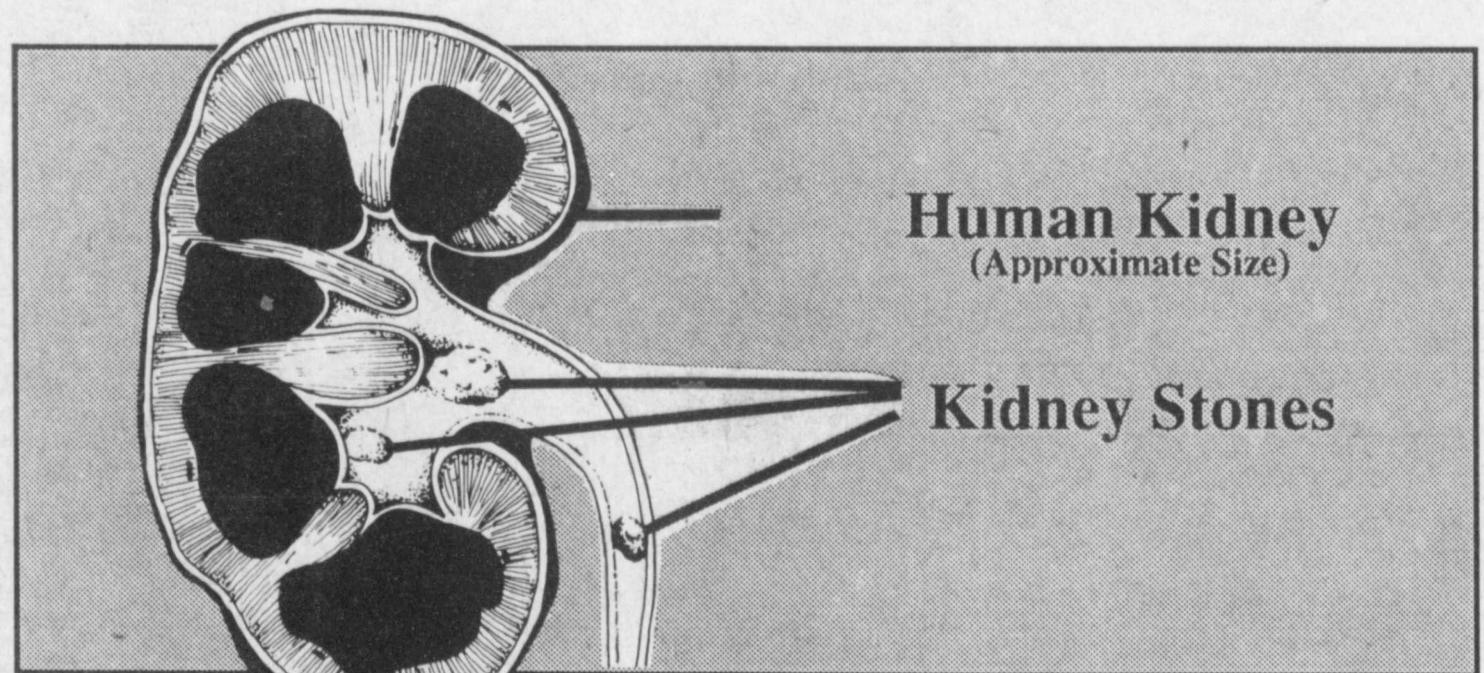

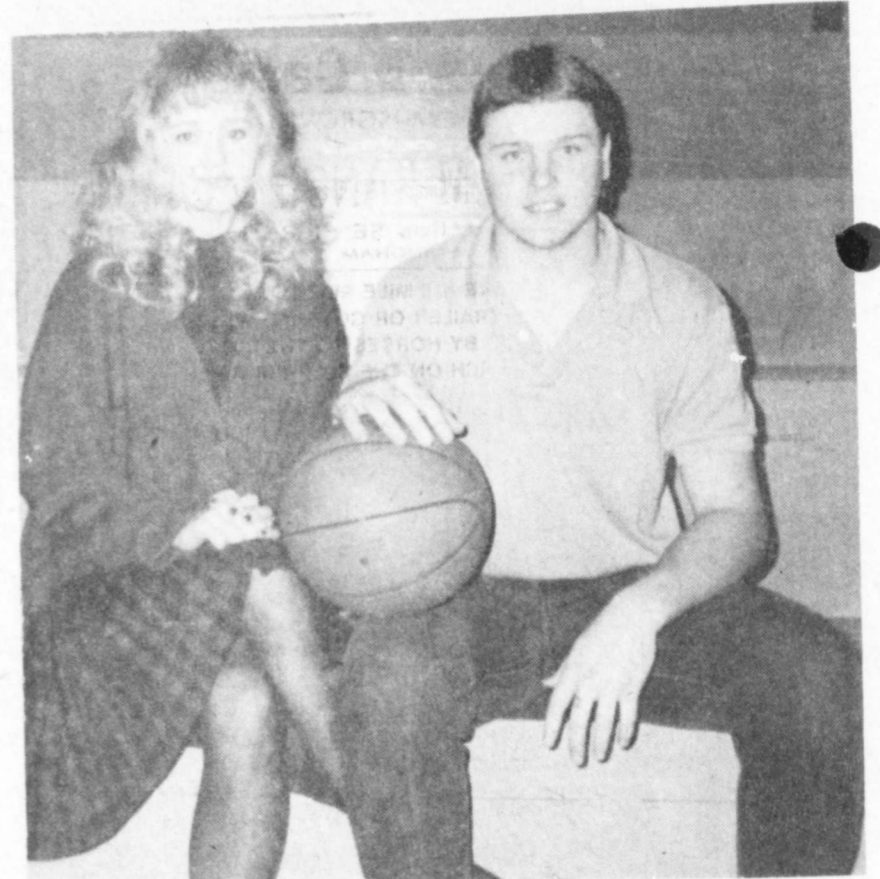

4-H News

By John Senter

It's cold, has been and may continue to be. If you are not completely sure, ask your livestock projects! It may be too cold to brush, comb or walk or spend extended time outdoors with your projects, but they need a different type of attention while we are in super cold weather.

One thing is critical for all types of animal projects and they need it now! They have got to have a dry house to allow them to get out of the wind. Regardless of the kind of project you have, if it's wet and in the wind, you are asking for trouble you will probably get.

Supply dry, fresh bedding such as straw, hay or wood shavings every few days. Cattle, sheep or horse folks

need to become unconservative on the hay. Feed an abundance of hay. Hay will stimulate an animal's stomach and produce internal energy. Do not be concerned about a hay belly because that can be fixed later.

All animals must have water, even when it's this cold. Take an extra few minutes outside and bust the ice on the trough or replace a frozen water pan with a thawed waterer.

Examine your animals daily for early signs of sickness: repeated or excessive coughing, runny nose, lack of appetite and/or energy and sharp rise in temperature. If any of these conditions worsen or persist, call your vet. This weather is bad on people and animals alike. It will end sooner

or later, and when it does, the folks that put their animals first in care will be way ahead.

Don't forget the County 4-H Swine Project Group is sponsoring a Lamar County Swine Classic on Saturday, February 25. The show is open to all Texas counties and it should be a doosy. The event will be held at the Fairgrounds, with weigh-in at 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. with the show starting at 12 noon. There is no minimum weight limit and the maximum is 200 pounds. The show is open to any sex of pigs.

Breeds to show are Hampshire, Crossbreed and Other Pure Breeds.

Early entry fees by February 21 are \$10 per head. Late fees are \$10 but no checks will be taken.

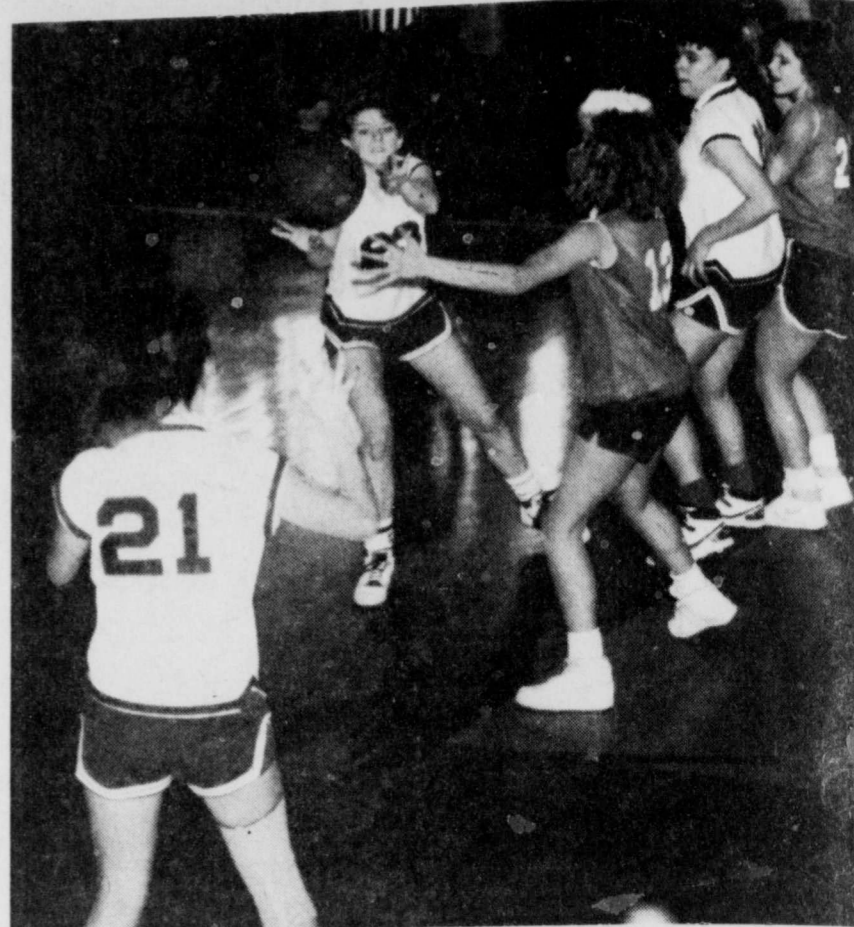
