While at Prairiland, Rosina was on the yearbook staff, a member of

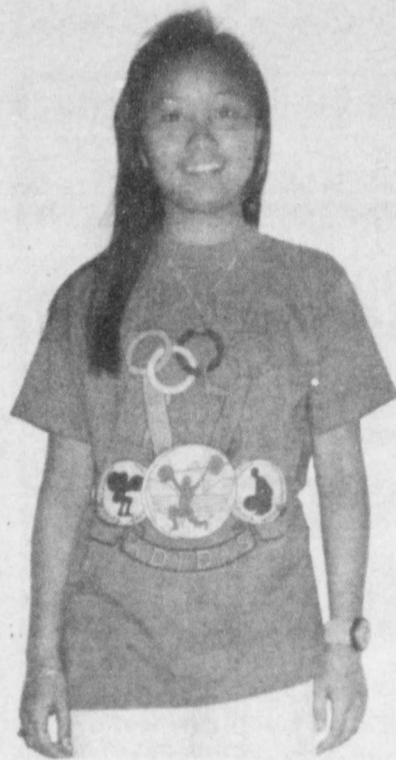

Pats Win Bi-District, 4-3!

The Prairiland Patriots struck early and then hung on as they defeated the DeKalb Bears 4-3 for the bi-district championship before a packed Prairiland crowd at Mt. Pleasant.

With the win, the Pats improved their season mark to 19-5 and moved on to an area game with #1 ranked Linden-Kildare.

Prairiland scored all four of their runs in the bottom of the first inning and used a beautiful P.G. Morrison to Martin Babb to Shannon Osborne double-play in the seventh inning to save the game.

Things looked rough for the Pats in the top of the first as Babb had to relinquish his pitching job to shortstop Jack Kindle on the second batter of the night when he developed soreness in his right elbow.

Kindle reminded the Pat faithful of a day in June in Austin as he battled and clawed his way through the first inning jam and fired a complete game.

The offensive fireworks for Prairiland began and ended in the home half of the first inning.

Shannon Baker led off with a walk

and advanced to second when Bear ace, Brandy McGill, plunked Wade Sparks with a pitch.

Babb then ripped a shot to center for a single to lead the bass and get the crowd buzzing.

Kindle blasted a line drive into right centerfield to drive in Baker and Sparks. Giovanni Scarano grounded a fielders choice to short that advanced Babb to third and forced Kindle at second.

Kevin Mowery then drilled a drive high off the tall, green centerfield wall to score Babb and advance Scarano to third where he would score what would prove to be the winning run when McGill unleashed a wild pitch to the base of the screen.

P.G. Morrison drew a walk in the second inning and that was the Pats' only other baserunner in the ballgame but the damage had already been done.

The remainder of the game was a story of Kindle reaching inside for that extra something and Pat fielders continually making terrific plays to stove off Bear threats.

Rightfielder Baker fired a strike to Scarano to nail catcher J.D. Wilsford at the plate in the third inning and Scarano threw out three base runners to help save the game.

DeKalb battled and pecked thanks to Wilsford, McGill and first baseman Paul Landreth (who blasted a home run in the fourth), and cut the Pat lead to 4-3 going into the seventh with these three men coming to bat.

Wilsford led off the seventh with a single and this brought McGill who had singled and drove a double off the centerfield wall, to the plate.

This at bat, he hit a screaming one hopper to Morrison, who started the double-play.

With two outs, the Bears were still not through, as Landreth drilled his third base hit of the night to centerfield, stole second base for a very controversial call and advanced to third on a Scarano passed ball.

This set the stage for a confrontation between Kindle and shortstop Brad Hall and Kindle struck him out to end the game and advance the Pats on to the next round.

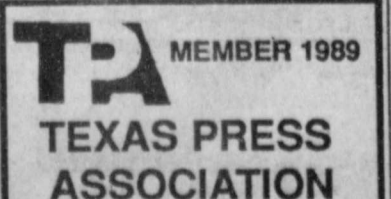

Cut Hay When The Sun Shines

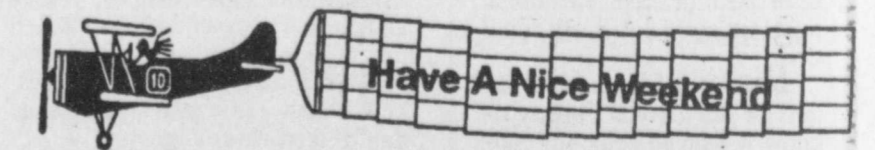
As soon as the soil dries enough, cut hay immediately, says an agronomist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

"Since hay supplies are low in Texas, producers need to harvest excess forage whenever possible from both pastures and hay meadows," said Dr. Sim A. Reeves, Jr., extension agronomist at Overton. "Producers with ryegrass in their pastures or hay meadows should harvest the forage for hay and also to release the warm season perennial grasses. If it is not cut, the ryegrass blocks the sunlight and thus keeps the warm season grasses from growing."

Ryegrass baled at this time of year

should have high quality and high energy values. However, said the Texas A&M University System specialist, it loses quality and tonnage rapidly when stored outside in a round bale. "If at all possible, store ryegrass hay in a barn or under a shed," Reeves said. "When you start feeding hay, feed the ryegrass first."

After the ryegrass is harvested, fertilize the bermuda by soil test or use a 3-2-1 ratio fertilizer. With the heavy rains experienced in much of Texas, any nitrogen applied as late as three weeks ago has either been used by growing plants or has leached out of the soil.
