Top Hands Enter Bogata Rodeo Competition

When entries closed on Monday evening for the upcoming Bogata Rodeo, June 22-23-24, over 200 cowboys and cowgirls had entered the competition in the seven championship events sponsored this year at Bogata.

With added money increased to \$400.00 per event this year, sponsored by the Bogata Rodeo Association, the total purse is expected to exceed \$12,000.00, the largest pay-off for the Bogata rodeo since 1985.

Scheduled to compete in the bareback riding is the 1986-88 C.R.R.A. Bareback Riding Champion, David Worden of Cooper, TX; and the 1987 C.R.R.A. Bareback Riding Champion Scot Mitchell of Lake Creek, TX. Worden leads the 1989 season for the title again this year. Ranked second in the championship standings is Rickey Rhodes of Talco, TX who will compete at the Bogata rodeo during the third performance.

The 1988 C.R.R.A. Saddle Bronc Riding Champion, Keith Morgan of Sapulpa, OK will be in competition on Friday evening, along with his

wife, Julana, who is the 1988 C.R.R.A. Barrel Racing Champion.

Other barrel racing hopefuls entered in the Bogata competition are Ann Bateson of Texarkana, TX, the 1987 C.R.R.A. Champion; Cindy Billingsley of Wewoka, OK, the 1987 runner-up to the championship; and Connie Lynn Cooper of Broken Arrow, OK, current leader for the 1989 Barrel Racing Championship.

In steer wrestling, Kenneth Prater of Checotah, OK, the four time C.R.R.A. Steer Wrestling Champion will be entered in competition on the opening performance Thursday night, along with the current leader for the 1989 Steer Wrestling title, Willie Crooch of Boynton, OK.

Team ropers heading the list of entries are Paul Foreman of Barnsdall, OK, six time C.R.R.A. Team Roping Champion and current leader Todd Markham of Vinita, OK.

Bull riding will be an exciting event at the Bogata rodeo, as three-time champion David Wesson of Delaware, OK will be featured in the opening performance and the reigning Bull Riding Champion, Terry Don West of Henryetta, OK, will be competing in the final performance on Saturday night.

In addition to championship rodeo action, the Bogata rodeo will feature "Gizmo" the one-man show from Branson, MO and three-time C.R.R.A. Bullfighter of the Year, Donny Sparks of Texarkana, TX.

The Arigo Riders 4-H Horse Club will be setting pivots two nights at the rodeo and the band "Texas Express" will be entertaining the rodeo audience nightly.

Two parades will be featured this year, one on Thursday afternoon and another on Saturday afternoon, through downtown Bogata.

On Thursday night, the annual Hub Whiteman drawing will be held for a \$100.00 savings bond and a calf scramble will be held nightly for the youngsters attending the rodeo.

All you have to do is bring yourself, entertainment and concessions will be provided. Just sit back, relax and enjoy!



ASCS NEWS

By James B. Allcorn
Applications for cost sharing on needed conservation work totaled 37 as of Tuesday noon and continues through June 30. The actual dollar amount of requested assistance is \$103,850 since the first day of sign-up, June 15. Since this figure represents the government's share of the cost, the farmer or landowner will be digging in their pockets for at least \$61,849 as they have to pay for everything above the ASCS payment level. A look at the type and number of requests is as follows: 7 grass establishment requests on 215.0 acres; 2 diversion terraces systems; 10 pools; 8 erosion control structures (drop structures); 1 waterway; and 10 critical area shaping requests covering 57.6 acres.

Since there are only 7 requests for grass establishment on file so far, I think folks need to look toward the spring of 1990 and see if you need to play now for grass establishment at that time. Traditionally, we don't think about grass planting until February, and that always causes problems. If you want to do a good job, you need to start seedbed plowing this fall and not wait until time to plant. This sign-up allows you to receive your approval now to plant grass next spring. That means you can properly prepare the area and hopefully obtain a good grass cover.

In addition to establishment of 1990 spring seeded/sprigged grasses, re-

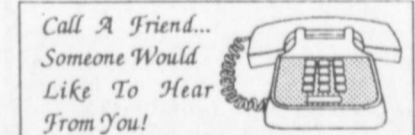
quests are also being taken for cool season grasses this fall, pools, drop structures and toe wall structures, waterway construction, critical area shaping and parallel terraces.

After the sign-up is completed, either ASCS or SCS personnel will visit your farm and determine the rate of erosion actually occurring on the area you are wanting to place the conservation practice. Requests will be approved based upon the degree of erosion. Those requests with the highest rate of erosion will be approved first.

Soil tests are required for all grass establishment practices and tests must have been performed within the past 12 months. In this area, most soil tests go either to Stephen F. Austin University in Nacogdoches or Texas A&M in College Station. All soil tests must be furnished to ASCS not later than July 15 for grass practices. All grass practice requests will be canceled on July 15 if you do not have your soil test results on file with ASCS by that date. The soil test must be taken from the area where the grass is to be established.

Soil test kits are available free from ASCS, SCS and the County Extension Service. Practices involving heavy equipment such as drop structures, waterways, critical area shaping, pools and terraces do not require soil tests.

Fertilizer Necessary For Hay Harvests

By Herb Brevard
Some hay producers in East Texas are scurrying to get the first cutting harvested while others are looking forward to the second cutting.

"Due to the shortage of hay, we need to produce as much hay as possible while we have adequate moisture," said Dr. Sim A. Reeves, Jr., agronomist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. "To get a good second cutting, fertilizer must be applied as soon as possible after the first cutting is removed from the field. By applying the fertilizer quickly, it has time to get into the soil and become active for uptake by the plants."

Reeves says one ton of grass hay removes 50 pounds of nitrogen, 14 pound of phosphorus and 42 pound of potassium from the soil.

"To keep from mining the soil to unproductive nutrient levels, we need to replace all the nutrients which were removed through crop harvest,"

Hay should be stored in a barn or under cover to prevent deterioration. If storing hay outside, place it on a high area with good drainage.

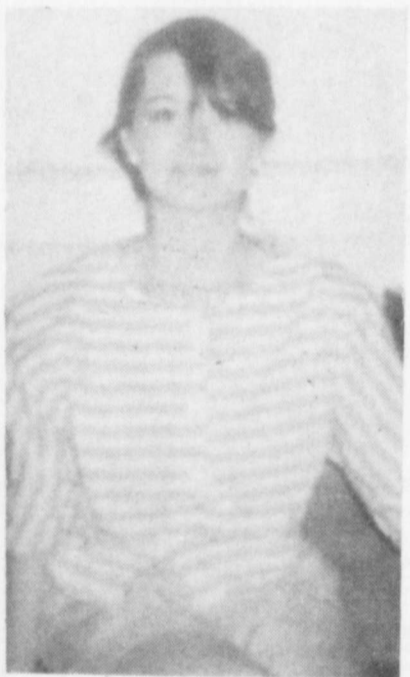

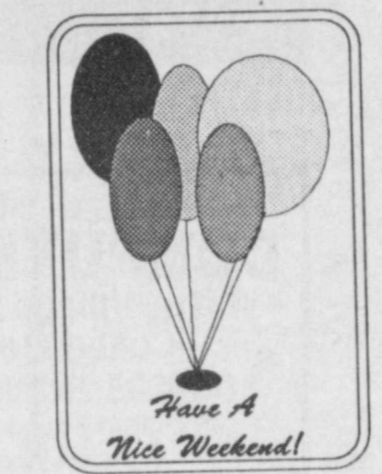

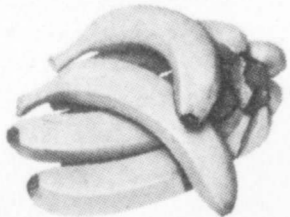
