

Leslie (Buddy) Taylor, superin-tendent of the Prairiland Consolidated Independent School District, will be honored with a retirement party on riday, June 23.


The event will be held at the school gymnasium in Cunningham beginning with a catered barbeque dinner at 6:30 p.m. Following the meal, a

Hay should be stored in a barn or under cover to prevent deterioration. If storing hay outside, place it on a high area with good drainage.




