Who then, is electing these officials? People who do have a direct interest? Folks who close their eyes and pick a candidate? Folks who vote because someone has an appealling name?

Of course, that led me to think about elections in general..and the good old American apathy that accompanies them.

And, though it's all been said a million times, I began to think about all those millions of people in Eastern Europe who are streaming into the streets in jubilation at the prospect of free elections, and of those who have braved incredible dangers for the right to vote.

Have we simply had the right for so long that we just don't know how to appreciate it? Have we grown so used to our

rights and freedoms that we think they can't be taken a way?

# Loughmiller, Bolton, Miller Take **Top County Spots In Primary**

Primary election results in Lamar County put Deane Loughmiller in the county judge's position with 5,256 votescounty-wide over Gene Buster's 1,997 votes, a decisive win.

A very close race for Lamar County Tax Assessore-Colletor resulted in Kathy Bolton capturing the position with 3,571 votes obver Jean Brown's 3,470.

In Pct. 4 there will be a runoff election held to determine who will be the justice of the peace for that precinct. Arvie Stevenshad 637 votes, Gene (Dode) Wheeler had 484, and Ruthardt 330. Stevens and Wheeler will be in the final battle.


In Pct. 2 Carl Steffey garnered 770 votes to Ronald Dockray's 542 and Holberts 174.

Bill Barber and Allen Weatherford will be in a runoff for the Commissioner's position in Pct. 4, as a crowded race saw Barber with 851 votes, Allen Weatherford 896, Jimmy Later 118, Gary Nash 537, B.N. Brown 126 and James Anderson with

The new Democratic Chairman will be Terry Hill, who received 3,523 votes to Martha Castlebury's 2,948.

On the state-wide scene for the Democrats the governor's race will be in a runoff with Jim Mattox and Ann Richards vying for the right to run against Clayton Williams, who easily captured the Republican spot on the ballot.

Individual box totals were unavailable at press time.

One vote does make a differance. One informed vote makes an even bigger differance. Think about it.


#### Beware Of "Fly By Night" Work, Currently In The Area

**Texas Crime Rate** Decreased In 1989


The Texas crime rate decreased in down, including burglary, down 1989 and the number of major crimes reported increased only 0.1% compared with 1988 figures, according to the Texas Department of Public Safety.

The 1989 crime rate---the number of major crimes reported per 100,000 population---dropped 1.2%, from a rate of 8019.6 in 1988 to 7926.8 in 1989.

The total number of major crimes in Texas, which include murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft and motor vehicle theft, edged up from 1,345,688 to 1,346,846---an increase of 1,158 offenses.

Motor vehicle theft, which has been a major problem in Texas for several years now, increased by 12.4 percent. That was the largest gain in any of the categories.


#### Buster Scarborough Dies In Tyler

# Donna Rozell Brings High Tech Treatment To The Barn Lot!

She walks into the horse lot lugging a big silver suitcase and a smaller black case. A tall woman, she is surrounded by a variety of dogs, from a tiny Italian greyhound to a huge part St. Bernard.

The horses are lined up with their heads over the stall doors, paying no attention to the dogs, showing only delight in her prescence.

Donna Rozell of Bogata is about to give her "patients" their treatments. Donna has an unusual machine

tucked away in that big silver case. It's called an Electro-Accuscope,

and is used in the treatment of soft tissue damage, cartliage damage, pain relief, muscle spasms, arthritis, neurological injury and emotional trauma in animals.

Actually, the machine was developed and is in wide-spread usage for humans...it's only fairly recently that it's use began to become more widespread for treatment of horses, and even dogs.

Donna stresses that this treatment

Soon she had purchased a state-ofthe art machine, and was spending days and weeks learning about it's proper use at Wraparound Farms in Bossier City, Louisiana.

She waxes enthusiastic when she launchs into her explantions about the machine.

"It works by duplicating the body's own electrical currents" she says. "Damaged tissue doesn't have good electrical conductivity. This machine returns the tissue to it's normal conductivity by bringing blood and oxygen to the area of trauma". She stresses once again that the ideal situation is to have a veterinarian diagnose the exact problem, and treat it, and her machine works in addition to the other medical treatment.

She admits that she wants to make some money with the accuscope. With treatments ranging from \$10 to \$35, sit's a cinch she won't be getting rich! But there's a lot more to it than that. One of the first uses the machine

was put to was to provide pain relief


Watching her in action, sheapplies gel to the treatment area, tapes on two brass plates, and adjusts her machine. Treatment lasts from eight to thirty minutes. Her equine patients literally sag with relaxation when the treatments begin.

"A horse can actually be sedated with this machine" she grins. That's fairly obvious, as the animals cock a hip and enjoy the relief!

It may seem like an odd ambition, providing electronic accuscopic treatments to horses, but Donna Rozell is serious about it.

This machine is used in human athletic training rooms, and physical therapy at hospitals. It's even used on Olympic athletes ... so why not on some of the best athletes of all, horses?", she queries.

isn't meant to be a cure-all and that she very definitely wants to work under a veterinarian's supervision, as most people do.

"This machine isn't a miracle machine, but it is an excellent form of therapy when combined with good veterinian care" she states.

The use of the accuscope in pain relief and therapy comes naturally to

Donna, who has always been devoted to horses and has a weak spot for any animal in pain.





## Soil Temperature Is Critical When Planting Garden The temperature of the soil is criti-

cal to the success of newly planted gardens, says a horticulturist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Marty Baker.

"Many vegetable transplants and seed will not tolerate cold soil," said Baker. "However, cool season transplants may be planted in soils with 45 degree temperatures. Cool season seed crops need a soil temperature of 50 to 55 degrees."

"Most seeds are stored at a room temperature of approximately 70 degrees," Baker said. "Research has shown that putting the seed in the refrigerator for a couple of day s may trigger the seeds to have a better germination percentage."

## "Warm season crops, such as tomatoes, can be set out when the soil

temperature reaches 60 to 65 degrees," Baker said. "Hold off on certain crops like okra, sweet potatoes and southern peas until the soil temperature is well above 65 degrees."

Soil thermometers are available fora few dollars. If a thermometer is not available, touch the soil with your hand to determine if it is warm.

Baker suggests using two soil thermometers in the garden. Place one at four to five inches deep and the other at one to two inches deep. By using both depths, the gardener should be able to gauge the right temperature for both transplants and seeds.


