They have eight grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. One grandson, Michael, is leaving for Army duty on June 12. They had a going away party for him on June 9.

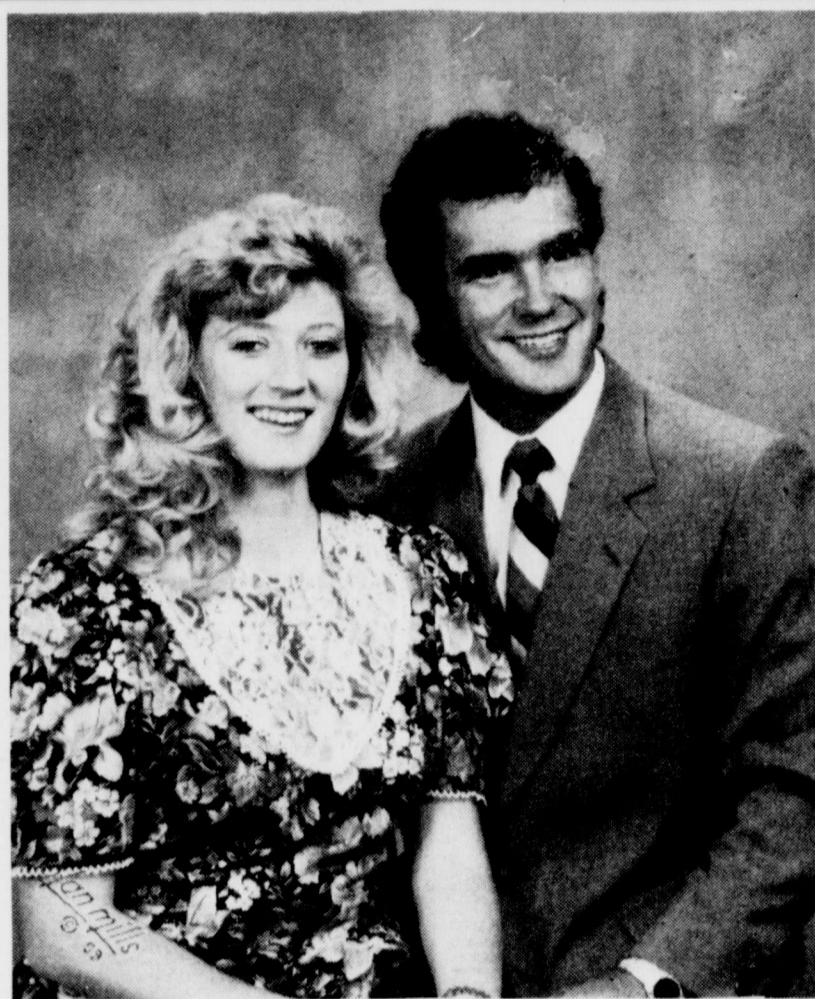

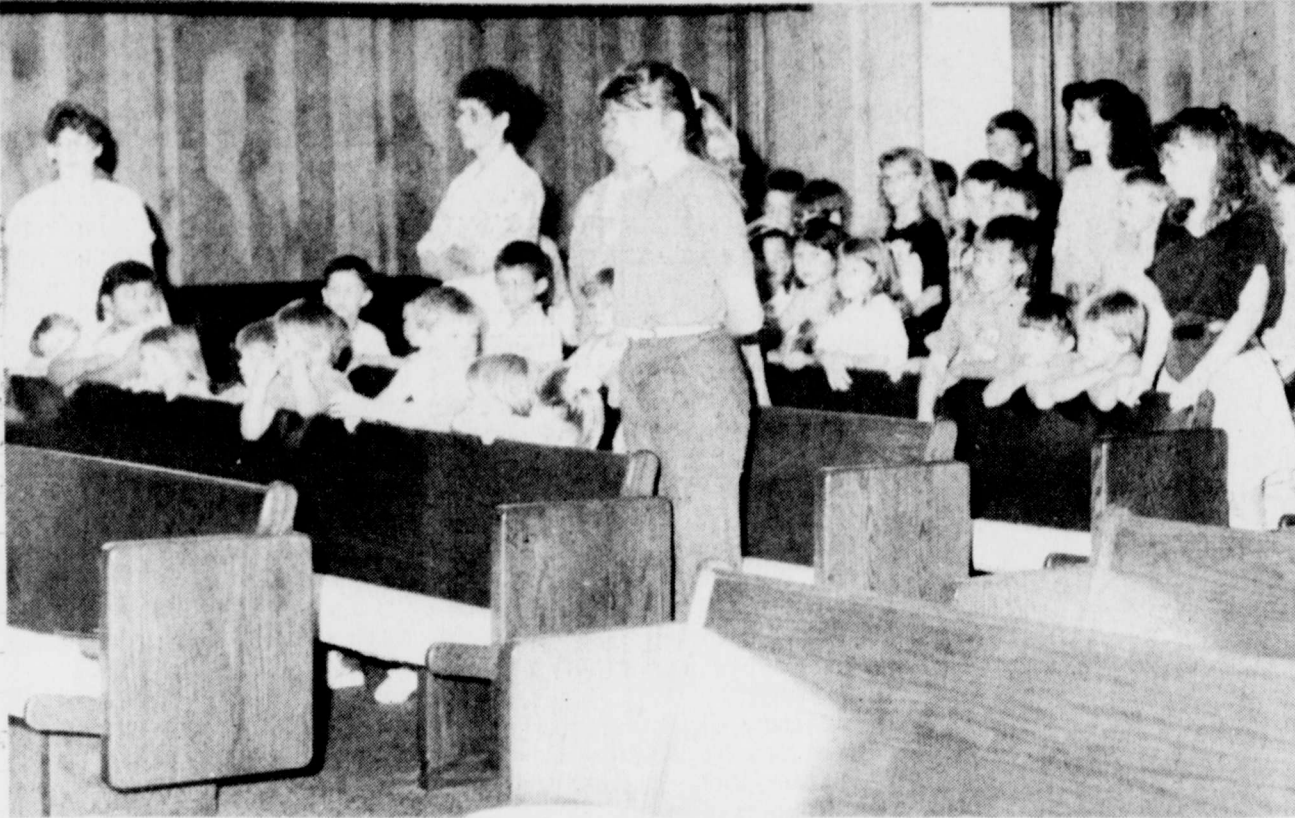

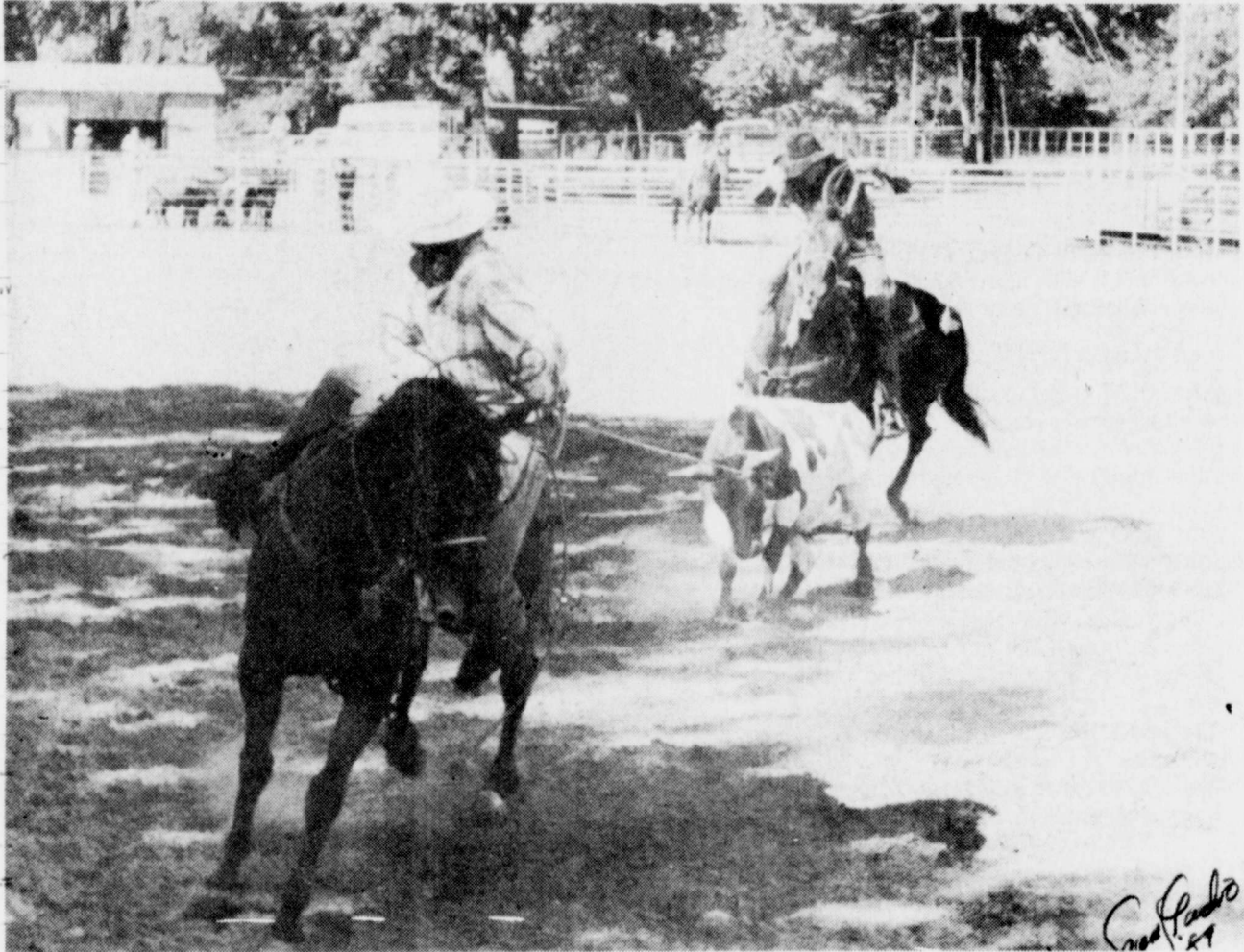
