Your office and our community is aware of recent, current and future visits to our community by inspectors from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Regional VI office in Ft. Worth.

The purpose of these inspections is in compliance of a Court Order for monitoring of all East Texas Housing Authorities. This Court Order is a result of a Class Action lawsuit filed ten years ago against Clarksville Housing Authority. That suit is known as the Young vs. Kemp case.

Yesterday, November 5, a team of four specialists came to Deport to evaluate, not only the Housing authority, but all local activities, for compliance of the Court Order issued by Judge William Wayne Justice in District Court, Tyler.

Budget Plans, Time Clock Standards Being Worked On By Deport City Council

The Deport City Council had a quiet meeting Monday night, tending to several items on the agenda.

Charles Rollins made the motion to pay Mayor Foster's expenses of \$65.86 for attending the TARC Annual Meeting, Regional L Review Committee and C.O.G. Meeting. It was unanimously approved.

Rollins is to set up standards for the use of the time clock for the next meeting, and Nancy Gresham and Sharon Francis are in charge of the Christmas Parade.

It was decided to get cost figures on some kind of radio device, and Jerry Burns, Water Superintendent was authorized to rent the Jet Stream Machine from Blossom if it is needed at any time.

A rough draft of the budget was looked at and discussed.

Melba Ladd came to give a report on the Deport Housing Authority on the progress and running efficiency of the units.

A copy of the report was included with the minutes.

Mayor Charles Foster it was decided, will attend a one day Hazardous Materials Contingency Planning Course, which will be held on November 28.

The decision was made and will be implemented to put in mail drop box for paying water bills with checks only.

In executive session it was decided to give employee Randy Weddle a raise as he was read his G.E. D. Minutes were read and approved, and financial report approved as presented.

In other action no changes were made to the athletic policies of Prairiland School.

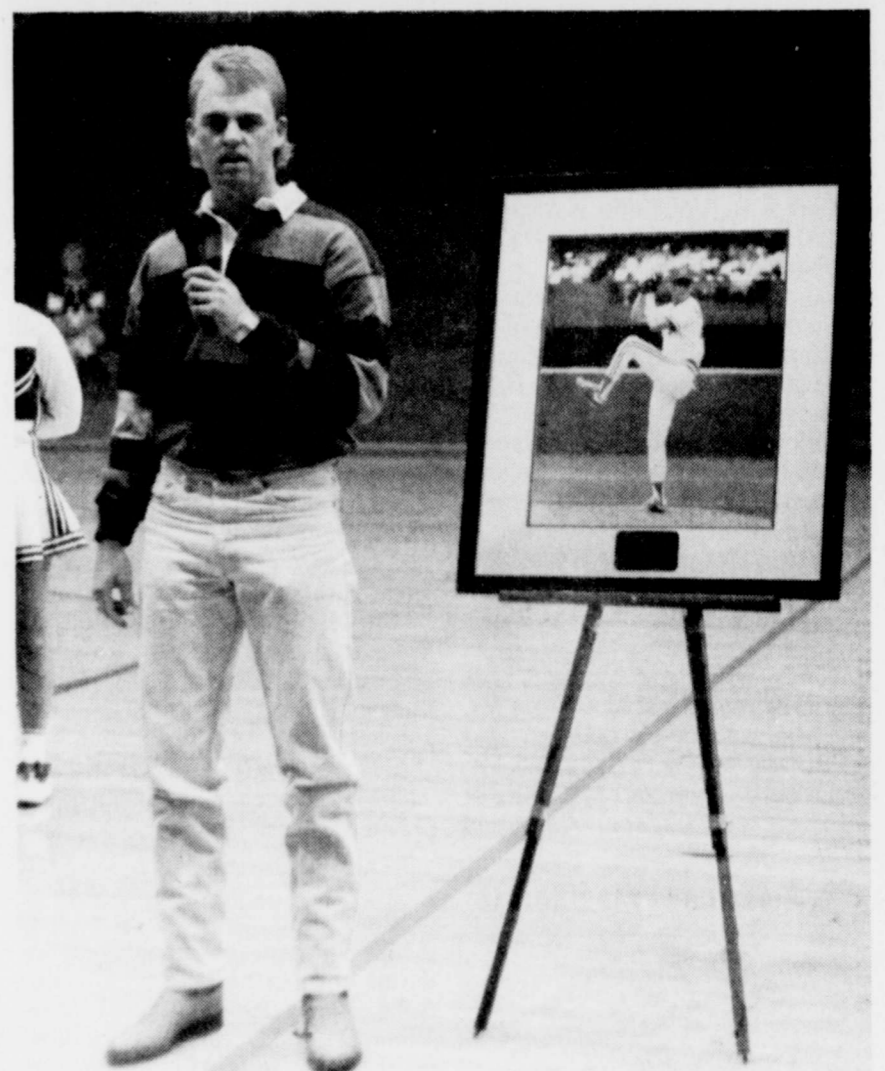

Country Cooking

"Country Cooking" comes from the home of Pete and L'Wanda McKnight, married for 39 years. They have lived in Cunningham most of their lives and have two daughters, Connie McKnight and Fran Patterson, a son-in-law, Johnny Patterson and two granddaughters, Johnna Shea, 4, and Jenna Rhea, 3 weeks old.

L'Wanda shares a delicious chicken/dressing recipe and Pete shares his country breakfast with us. Since Pete's heart attack, he has had to cut down on this type of diet, but cheats every once in a while and prepares his country breakfast.

Pete also shares a goulash recipe, that is quick and easy to make. L'Wanda says Pete's cooking is out of this world and is rated a definite "10".

Pete and L'Wanda attend Life Tabernacle Church where they are very active. L'Wanda has owned and operated L'Wanda's Beauty Shop in Cunningham for 25 years.

They enjoy eating out a lot, but on Sundays she cooks a huge meal and invites her family to join them for lunch. She tries to have everything cooked by 9 a.m. so she can go to church and while she's gone, Pete cleans up her mess she made. She says that having Pete help her in the kitchen is better than two women

because he knows what to do and where everything goes.

L'Wanda says there are a couple of secrets about her dressing recipe. She mixes the onions and celery with the cornbread mixture and cooks it all together. She just heats it thoroughly and doesn't have to bake it very long. She says cooking the dressing the day before you serve it makes a lot of difference. She makes the dressing a little thinner than normal, because it will thicken as it refrigerates overnight. Her dressing is never dry, it is always juicy.

Her other recipe is her Banana Nut Cake, that she makes at Thanksgiving and Christmas. She came across the recipe from a lady she worked with at Westinghouse in 1957 and has used it ever since.

Cornbread
1 1/2 cups meal
1/2 cup flour
1 tablespoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1 egg
1 tablespoon corn oil
3/4 cup diced onion
3/4 cup finely chopped celery
Mix all ingredients and pour into 9-inch greased and heated skillet.

Chicken
1 hen
6 chicken breasts
1 tablespoon salt
Boil hen and chicken breasts until meat falls from bone. Season well with salt.

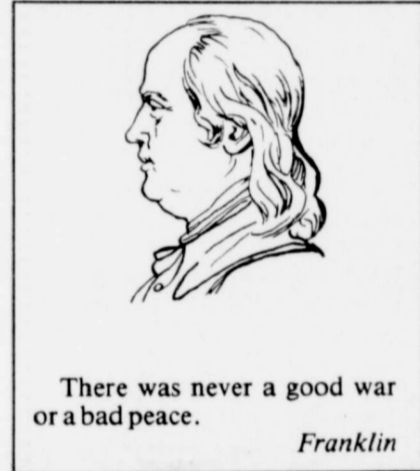
Dressing
2 9-inch skillets of cornbread
4 slices light bread
3 hard boiled eggs
Black pepper, sage and poultry seasoning to taste, chicken broth.
Crumble bread in large roasting pan. Pour enough chicken broth over bread for a thin consistency. Season to taste with black pepper, sage and poultry seasoning. Mix ingredients with mixer. Add chicken and 3 chopped boiled eggs. Stir. Refrigerate overnight. Bake at 350, approximately 1 hour or until hot throughout.

Pete's Goulash
Brown in a large skillet one pound ground beef, onion and salt and pepper to taste. Drain.
Add approximately 12 oz. boiled and drained macaroni. Add 1 can of tomato paste. Add 1 small can of chopped green chilies.
Grate cheese and spread on top. Put in oven long enough to melt cheese.

Toasted Coconut Pie
By Vickie Couch Ballard
3 beaten eggs
1 1/2 cups sugar
1/2 cup melted butter
4 teaspoons lemon juice (2 tsp. lemon extract)
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 can (1 1/3 cups) flaked coconut
1 9-inch unbaked pie crust
Combine eggs, sugar, margarine, lemon juice, vanilla. Stir in coconut. Bake in moderate oven 350 for 40-45 minutes. Cool before serving. Freezes well.

Banana Nut Cake
1 1/2 cups sugar
2 eggs
2 cups flour
1 teaspoon soda
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup pecans
1/2 cup Crisco
4 tablespoons buttermilk
1 teaspoon baking powder
3 bananas
Pinch of salt
Cream sugar and shortening. Add eggs and buttermilk. Then into the flour add baking powder and soda. Chop bananas into mixture and add vanilla, salt and nuts.

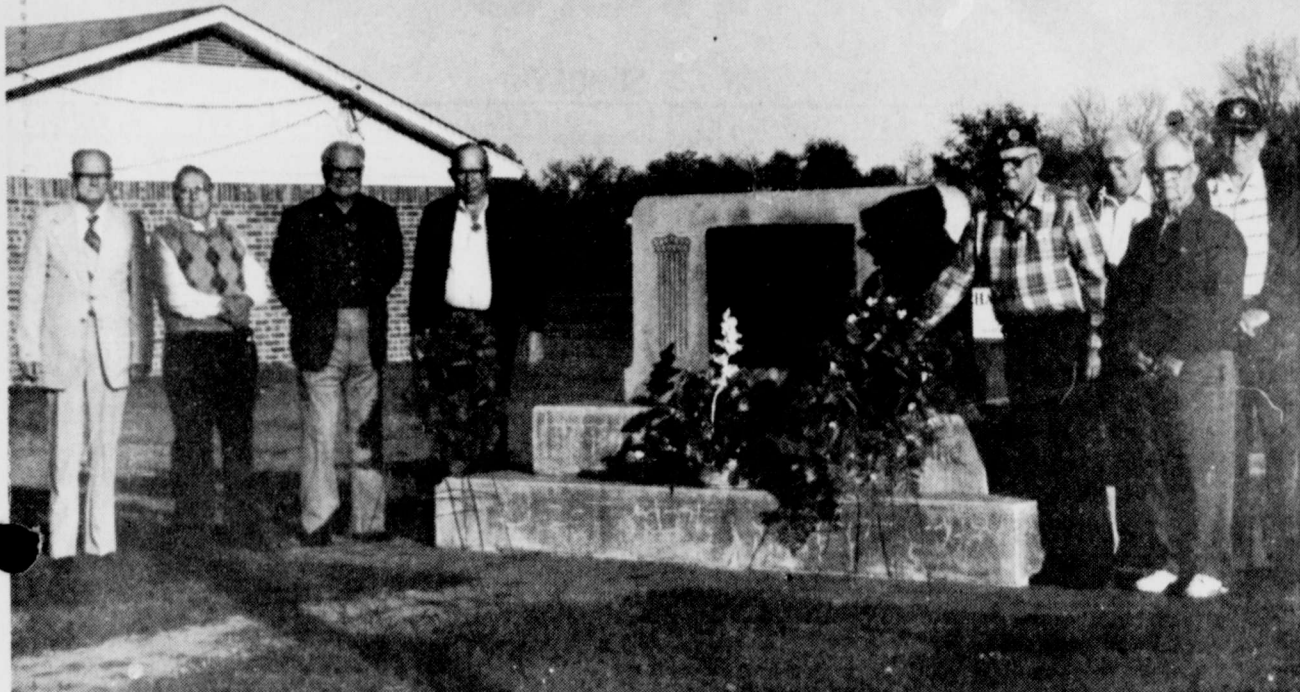

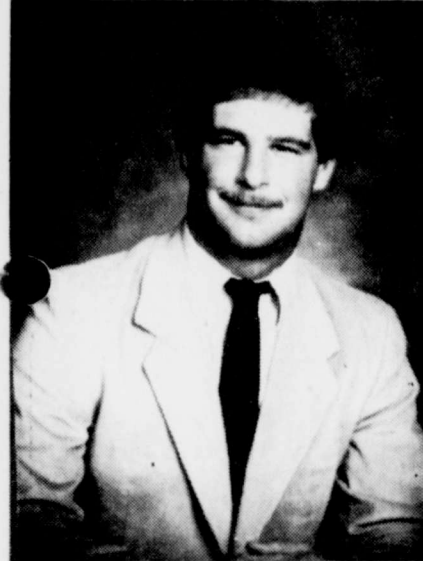

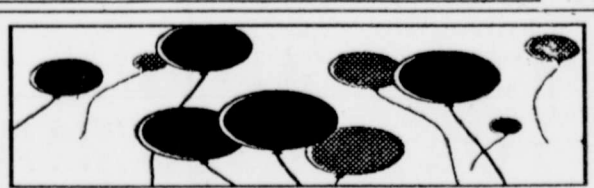

Dear Liz,
I feel compelled to write this letter to you, since you are the only news person I know. I am Ssgt. Charley Owens, son of the late Jack Owens of Blossom. I am presently stationed at Aziz Naval Base, Jabbal, Saudi Arabia. I left Morehead City, NC on August 26 aboard the U.S.S. Wright, a merchant Marine cargo container ship. We arrived in Saudi Arabia on September 18. Our base is set up next to an unused soccer stadium. We are allowed to use the facilities of the stadium so we have drinkable water and restroom facilities. We live in tents set up in the stadium parking lot. Everyone who visits this base says we have the best setup in Saudi Arabia. Although I haven't been off the base, I must agree, it ain't bad. We are served two hot meals a day, provided by our Marine cooks. Breakfast and the evening meal are served hot. For our noon meal, or mid-night meal, depending whether we work days or nights, we eat MRE's. This is a military version of a bag lunch. With our evening meal we get a choice of a Pepsi, Teem or Mirandi Orange soda pop. The drinks are made here in Saudi Arabia.

There is a Saudi merchant here on base where we can buy a few things at ridiculous prices. Sodas are 35¢ but 12 envelopes cost 75¢.

Cigars cost \$33 for a box of 50. There is no snuff, chewing tobacco or articles of clothing. I'm not knocking this man for trying to make a living. However, I get upset every time I read about some company in the U.S. giving something to the troops in Saudi Arabia. There are two things we have free here, free postage for our outgoing mail and USA Today provided by General. I read about donations from

soft drink companies, beer companies, and tobacco companies, but it is not getting here.

The only way to get those things we need or want is in care packages from home. Velma Pool and Margie Washburn from Blossom send my tobacco, soap, shampoo, toothpaste, razor blades and copies of the local newspapers. These fine ladies are deeply appreciated by all the men who work for me. Some of the other men also receive care packages from home. We all openly share what we receive because many of our necessities are not available here at any price. We are not allowed to go into any Saudi towns or stores.

There are restrictions on what can be sent in the mail to Saudi Arabia. No pork or pork products, no alcohol, no pornography and no religious material, contrary to the Islamic belief can be sent.

The only exception is that single Bibles can be sent as long as the

package is addressed to a specific serviceman or woman by name.

The thing that bothers me is the way the big companies get their names and products in the news for making donations that we don't receive. Well, I got that off my chest. We appreciate the care packages we receive from family, friends and neighbors back home. You all make me proud to serve our country.

Please enter my subscription for your fine indepth newspaper, The Blossom Times. I find your paper very heartwarming, although it does make me homesick. It is important that the address be exactly correct for us to receive mail. My address is:

I am not doubting that some big companies have made donations to us. I have not met one person here

who knows anyone who got any of their donations. There is a motto among Marines, "We take care of our own." I have found that the people of Blossom also take care of their own. I want to say Thank You. Continue to pray for us in this desolate land.

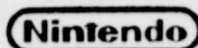

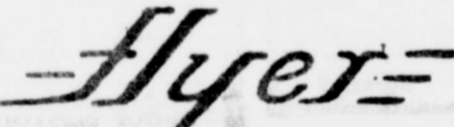
