Bonds Of Friendship Didn't Dissolve For War Time Friends

Memorial Day for many people is just a holiday. For others Memorial Day sparks sad thoughts of loved ones lost in conflict. For Silas Clement of Blossom and three war-time friends, this Memorial Day was very special, indeed.

After almost thirty-eight years four former MP's were reunited at the Clement's home in Blossom over the Memorial Day weekend.

"It was an emotional experience" the soft-spoken Silas explains.

"It's a marvelous feeling, to see people you never dreamed of seeing again in your life...it's just a glorious feeling" he continues.

For over thirty-seven years Silas Clement and Richard Shank had exchanged Christmas cards. They never even included a personal note...just signed their names.

In December two years ago Silas and his wife Betty were talking about Richard Shank, the conversation set off by the annual Christmas card exchange.

Since they had the address Betty urged Silas to call information and see if he couldn't obtain the phone number.

It only took a moment, and then Silas was dialing to Williamsport, Maryland. He didn't think about it being 11:30 at night in Maryland, since it was only about 10:00 in Blossom.

Shank's wife answered the phone, and Silas said "you don't know me but we send Christmas cards each year."

"Who is this" she queried. At the reply of "Silas Clement in Blossom, Texas" the woman shouted for her husband in glee!

About every other month after that one of the pair called the other. One month it would be Silas who footed the phone bill, the next it was Richard.

And, during the course of this long-interrupted friendship, they began to talk of locating other "buddies".

A few were dead...others had just

vanished, long removed from the original name and address of so many years ago.

But a lengthy search for a friend called Brownie Watson turned up a helpful lady in Corpus Christi, who gave them information from a family name book. Watson turned out to be living in Mont Belvieu, near Houston.

Brownie's wife managed to help locate C.C. Haupt in Whitesboro, and then a reunion was set up.

There was no problem finding something to talk about as the four army pals seated themselves in the living room of the Clement's home.

Instead, one memory led to another, and yet another, as they recalled work and worries in the Korea conflict.

All four men were drafted. All four left the service as corporals.

Clement, Watson and Haupt were all in Military Police Basic Training at Ft. Hood and Ft. Sam Houston. Shank they met after being shipped overseas.

They recall that the troop ship that took them from Seattle to Japan was the "General S.S. Bellou" and took 19 days to make it's journey.

They also remember that the return trip took 10 days and four hours. It was on the "General Jim Randle" and was a rough trip.

"We were all as sick as dogs" they grin ruefully.

Interestingly, Shanks didn't get to return with the other three, just as he hadn't gone over with them.

He was in the hospital with yellow jaundice at the time they received orders back to the states.

He shed a few tears when he thought he would have to stay behind, but while his friends were loaded on to that troop ship for the return he found himself in an airplane and actually beat them home!

The young MPs shared the same barracks, and pretty much the same work.

They were security escort for the Neutral Nations Inspection Team that toured and inspected various facilities

and activities during the Korean fighting.

The Inspection Team consisted of two representatives of the Communists, and two from the Non-Communists. The Communist representatives were Czechs and Poles and the Non-Communists were Swedes and Swiss.

Fighting was still going on when they arrived in Korea from Japan. That was in the summer of 1953.

Of course, the four men and their families didn't speak only of the war, no, indeed.

There is a lot of catching up to do after 38 years. Marriages, children and grandchildren, jobs and troubles, all had to be taken into account. Pictures were shared, laughter abounded.

Of course, there was Betty's excellent cooking to be sampled too.

The group is still looking for more of their friends. They hope to have a centrally located reunion someday with a number of their old buddies on hand.

"There are some we just haven't located...yet" they smile confidently.

The Korean Conflict has never been given the official designation of "War". That makes it no less of one, though. Life could be uncertain and lonely for young men so far from home, and the bonds of friendship could ease that burden.

The amazing thing may be though, that each of these men, older, but otherwise little changed, had felt those bonds had been severed.

A Christmas card once a year was the only evidence that a bond had ever existed.

And yet, when Silas Clement picked up the phone to set a series of events in motion...the bond sprang back into being as quickly and naturally as if it had always been there...as if these men had remained in touch for the whole 38 years!

Yes, Memorial Day weekend was truly a time for memories...and the bonds of friendship...for four war-time pals who decided the time had come to meet again.

Dry Fire Hydrant First In This Area, Could Mean More To Come!

Depert and it's Volunteer Fire Department have yet another first.

Located at the north end of main street is the very first dry fire hydrant in this part of North East Texas, and perhaps in the state.

The dry fire hydrant is basically a simple idea whose time may have come.

They are being installed all over the state of Georgia, Alabama and Arkansas, and many other states are looking at them as a source of fire fighting water, and even road building, throughout rural areas of the state.

The hydrant uses the water provided by existing farm ponds, heavy duty six inch PVC pipe, and a special fitting for connecting to the fire truck.

The hydrants can be located along county roads, or homeowners can even install them on their own property if they have a pond available.

Called dry hydrants because they have no water pressure, and cannot freeze, they mean that a fire truck doesn't have to attempt to cross frequently muddy ground, fences or rough terrain to draft water from a pond, but can hook up and pump water into the truck's tank at a rate 600 gallons per minutes, or more, depending upon the equipment used.

The City of Depert received their hydrant as an experiment from North East Texas RC&D (Resource Conservation District), who received it from Schlumberger Industries as a door prize!

The fire department has tested the hydrant and finds that it does exactly what it should do, providing water at a steady rate.

Mayor Charles Foster says that efforts are being made in Lamar County to obtain funding so that these hydrants could be installed at regular intervals throughout Lamar County. Several avenues of funding have been explored and the Ark Tex Council of governments is searching for the funds.

Last week the Soil and Water Conservation and RC&D representatives came down and inspected the hydrant.

In Georgia and some other states insurance discounts are being offered to homeowners when this system exists near them, or on their property.

However, Texas insurance underwriters say they know of no discounts available in this state, however, if the system were in widespread use it is to be hoped that discounts would be offered.

Mayor Foster says that a demonstration is being planned for the future, in which people form Lamar and Red River Counties would be invited to view how the hydrant performs.

Currently, anyone who is curious about this new idea can drop by the mayor's office on Main Street in Depert and the Mayor will show them the specs, and information on it, and take them to inspect the hydrant.

She loves to sew for her grandchildren and herself. She sews fancy baby quilts for her family, two of which are shown in the picture. Burnt Carmel Pie

1 cup sugar, put in iron skillet on a medium burner and melt. Mix 3/4 cup sugar, 1/3 cup flour Separate 3 eggs to the beaten yolks, add 2 cups milk. Then add the sugar and flour to the eggs and milk. When the sugar in the skillet is ready, add the other mixture, and stir quickly, it will caramelize, but will cook out in a few minutes. Have pie crust baked, then pour into crust. Beat the egg whites, put on top and brown.

Pie Crust
1 egg (break in measuring cup and add enough water to make 1/2 cup)
1 cup Crisco shortening
3 cups flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon vinegar (optional)
Sift flour, add salt and shortening. Add the egg-water mixture and mix thoroughly. Makes 4 crusts.

Pineapple Cookies
Cream:
1 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
1 cup brown sugar
Add 2 eggs, beaten, one small cup can crushed pineapple. Sift together and add: 4 cups flour, 2 teaspoons soda, 1 cup coconut, 2 teaspoons vanilla, 1 cup nuts. Mix well and drop on cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 10 minutes.

Broccoli & Rice Casserole

1 box 10 oz. frozen broccoli
2 cups cooked rice
1 can Cream of Mushroom soup
1/2 cup onions, cut up
1/2 cup celery, cut up
1/2 stick margarine
3/4 lb. grated cheese
In a large skillet, melt the margarine, add onions and celery, cook broccoli as directed on package. When the onions and celery are done, add rice, soup, broccoli and 1/2 cheese. Mix well and put into a baking dish and top with remaining cheese. Bake at 350 for 20 minutes.

Jeff Davis Pie from Louise Crossland

1-9" pastry shell, uncooked and chilled
1/2 cup butter or oleo
2 cups sugar
1 tablespoon flour
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla
4 eggs
1 cup milk
Cream together until fluffy the butter and sugar; add flour, salt and vanilla and beat well. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Stir milk in slowly. Pour into well chilled, uncooked crust and bake in hot 450 oven for 10 minutes; reduce heat to 350, continue cooking for 30 minutes, or until firm, serve slightly warm.

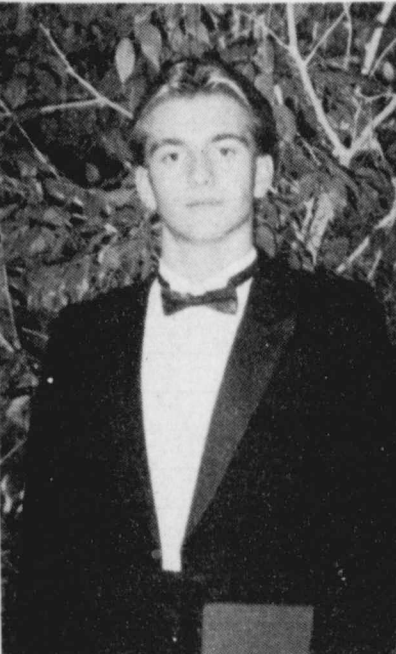
