

4 slightly beaten eggs 2 1/2 cups milk, scalded 19" unbaked pastry shell 1/4 tsp. salt 1/2 cup sugar

Thoroughly mix eggs, sugar, salt and vanilla. Slowly stir in hot milk. At once, pour into unbaked pastry shell. Dash top with nutmeg. Bake in very hot oven, 475, for five minutes. Reduce heat to 425 and bake until custard sets.

3 cups sugar 3/4 cup white Karo syrup 1 1/2 tsp. vanilla 2 1/2 cups pecans 1 1/2 cups homogenized milk

pinch soda

3/4 stick Parkay margarine or butter Cook sugar, milk and soda and karo over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture reaches soft ball stage. Test in cold water, even if you use a candy thermometer and remove from heat as soon as a small amount forms a soft ball in cold water. After removing mixture from heat source, add vanilla and margarine or butter. Stir until candy begins to hold its shape, then stir in pecans and drop onto buttered cookie sheet. Cooking time is extremely important. Cook too long and mixture will be too hard--for too short a time and the candy will not hold its shape.
