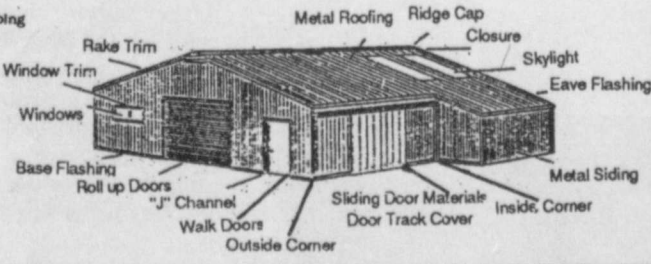

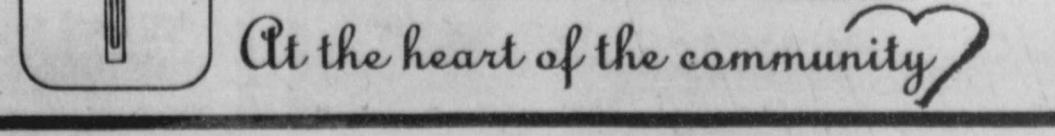

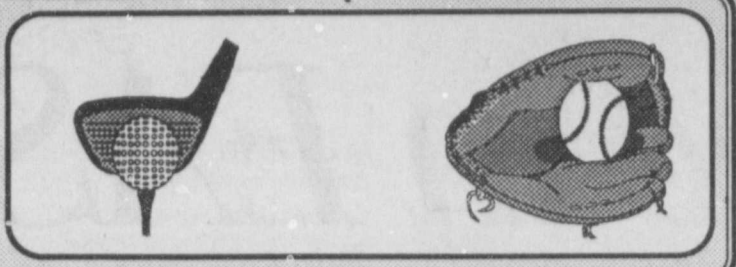

Pats Go 1-2 In First Week Of District

The Prairiland Patriots found both the win and loss column in the first week of District 13AAA play. The Winnsboro Red Raiders invaded Pattonville on Tuesday afternoon to open the week. The Pats opened with a 2-0 lead in the bottom of the first, but Winnsboro scored three in the top of the second inning. Jimmy Little and Steve Morton hit back to back doubles scoring Little and Chad Whitley followed with another double, scoring Morton. The Patriots led 4-3 at the end of two. But the Raiders could not be held in check, and they managed four runs on four hits to take the lead 7-4 in the third. Neither team scored until the bottom of the fifth when James Freelen doubled in Patrick Williams, closing

the gap to 7-5. In the bottom of the sixth, Larry Smith plated three runs by driving a home run over the left field fence. Once again, Winnsboro slipped away scoring three runs in the top of the seventh, clinching the victory 10-8. In Friday's contest, the Patriots traveled to Mt. Vernon to face last year's district champion Purple Tigers. Both teams managed a run in the first inning. The Tigers scored three in the top of the third to open a 4-1 lead. The Pats countered with three straight singles from Little, Morton and Whitley, but managed to only cut the deficit in half, 4-2. Mt. Vernon posted a fifth run in the fifth inning. In the bottom of the sixth, Whitley blasted a homer over the centerfield fence. Larry Smith

singled to right, and pinch runner Jeremy Pasquil, stole second base. James Freelen reached first on a dropped third strike, and David Singleton plated Pasquil with a single to right field, making the score 5-4. The Patriots tied the contest in the seventh when Morton singled and Whitley reached safe on an error, and was driven in by Cody Bowen's fielder's choice. In the top of the eighth, Freelen and Singleton singled, and Little walked to load the bases. Morton reached first on an error scoring Freelen from third. Whitley reached first on another throwing error, and Singleton scampered home for the seventh score. Whitley took the mound in relief of starting pitcher, Brandon Bell, and recorded a save as the Patriots held on for a 7-6 victory.



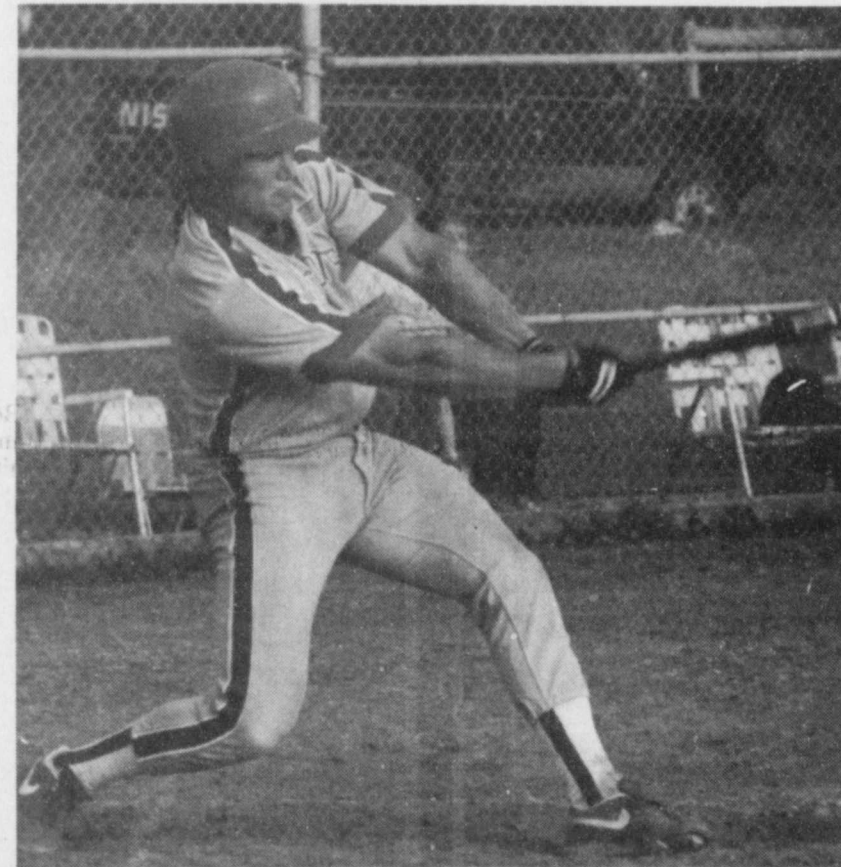

The young Patriots had only two hits and no runs through the first four innings. After Paris took a 7-0 lead the Patriots decided it was time to score a few of their own.
