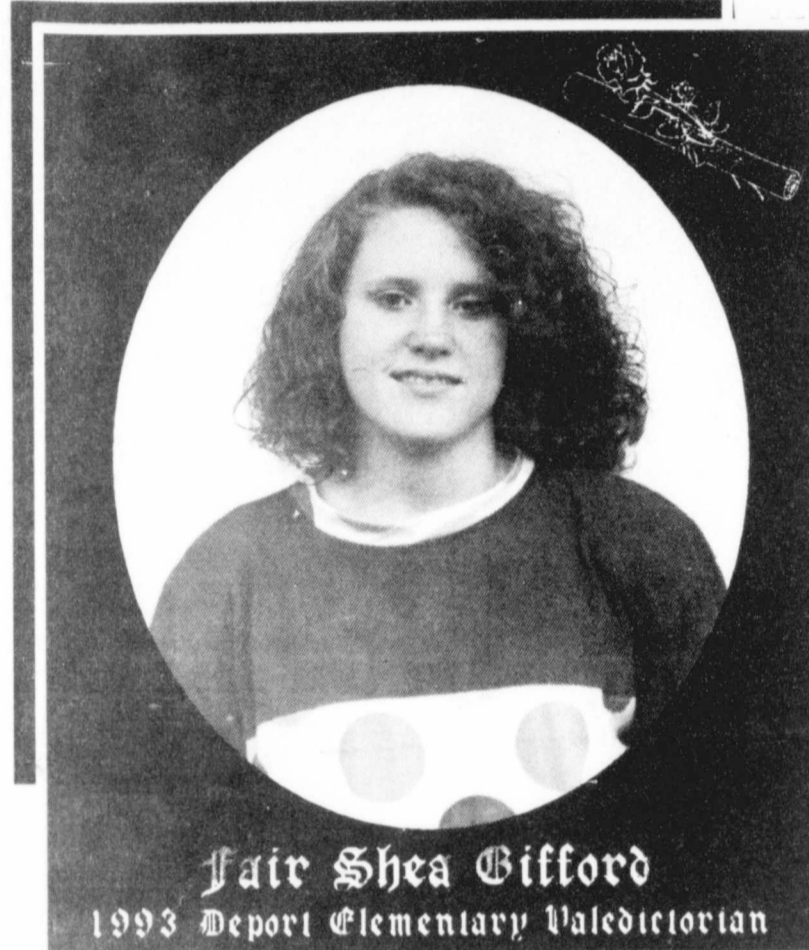
Prices of this year will be \$3.00 per dog for the dip and \$7.00 for the rabies vaccination.

No cats will be dipped. No exceptions. All dogs must be on a leash

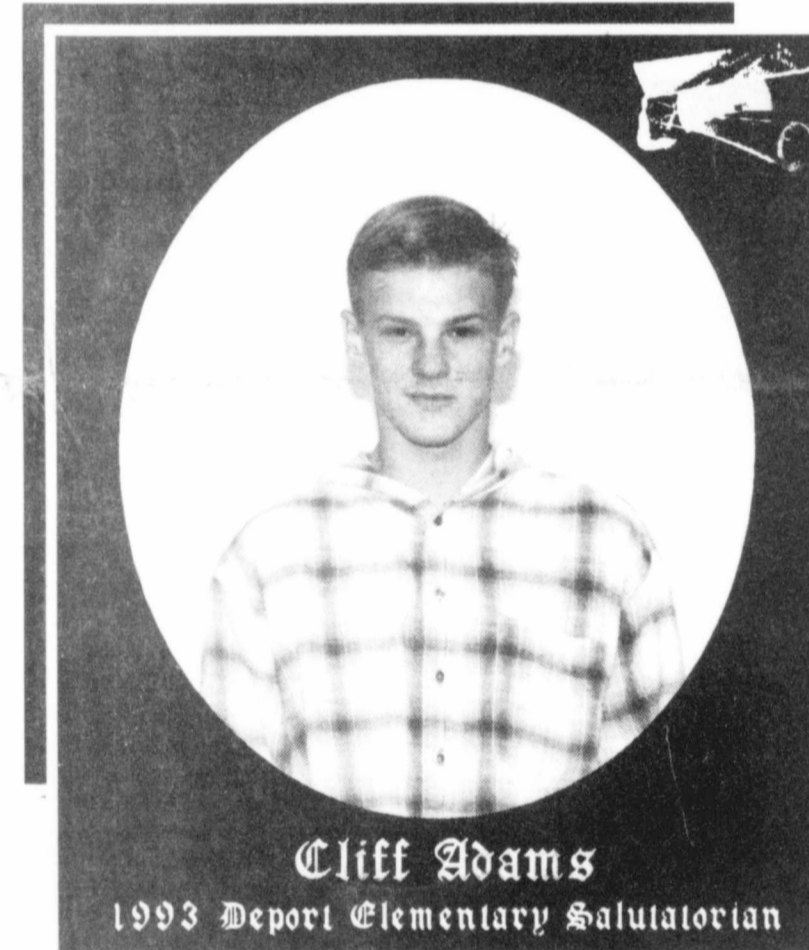
before entering the dip area and kept on a leash during the dip and vaccination.

Beat steaks until tender. Leave the bone in them. Mix egg, milk, salt, and pepper. Dip steak in batter and then the flour. Fry in deep oil until brown and as done as you like them.
