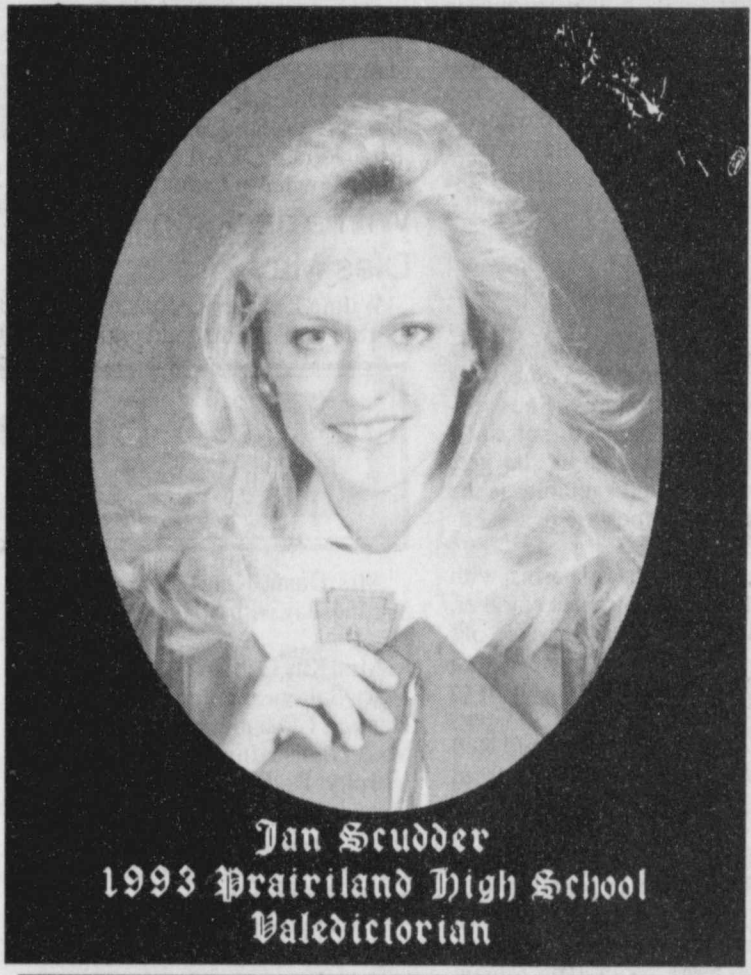

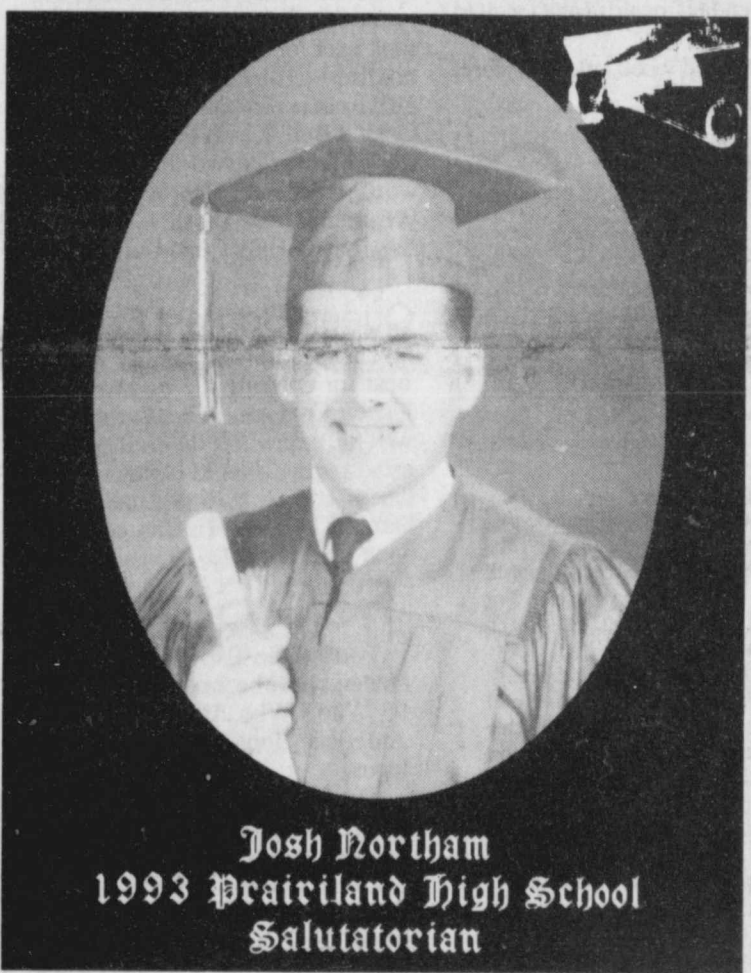

The Prairiland Patriots advance to the area round of the playoffs with a 2-1 win over the Ore City Rebels. An exciting game which was a pitcher's duel from the beginning as Prairiland's ace Mark Farris and Ore City's Chad Stanley pitched excellent games.

Prairiland finally scored on Stanley in the fifth inning as Mark Farris drew a walk with two outs. The Patriots leading hitter, Chad Whitley, then put Prairiland on the scoreboard as he slapped an RBI double off the center-

field wall scoring Brandon Johnson, who came into pinch run for Farris.

The Pats added their second run and what turned into the game winner when the games leading hitter, David Singleton, led off the sixth with a single, stole second, and moved to third on Cody Bowen's single to left. Jason Whitley then put Prairiland up 2-0 with an RBI single that scored Singleton.

Leading 2-0 in the bottom of the seventh, Chad Stanley hit a two out

double, then scored as the pickoff attempt sailed wide, allowing Stanley to score making it 2-1.

Mark Farris (9-4) went the distance on the mound, giving up two hits, two walks and striking out nine.

The Patriots got seven hits in the contest, four of which came in the final two frames as David Singleton was the leading hitter, going 2-3. Others receiving hits were Mark Farris, Chad Whitley, Pat Williams, Cody Bowen and Jason Whitley.

Degrees Awarded At ETSU Spring Commencement

The greatest challenge facing today's college graduates is to achieve racial harmony and justice, Dr. Stuart Anderson told spring graduates at East Texas State University.

Speaking to the graduates in three ceremonies on May 15, Anderson urged his audiences not to become complacent.

"Individuals must instigate harmony and justice; we must each find our station and act now to mend and to heal," said Anderson, head of the ETSU department of mathematics.

Those who have obtained an education need to be leaders speaking up and helping others, the ETSU faculty member said.

"Help because you have evaluated your obligation to society. Be heard, not because you are an obnoxious squeaky wheel, but because you are articulate. Lead, not because you are part of an elite, but because you have well-formed opinions about where society should go," Anderson com-

mented.

"If each of you contribute to a solution, there is cause for great hope. If we can solve these embarrassing and ruinous racial problems, other difficulties will dissipate," he said.

Of the 550 degrees conferred, 395 were bachelor's degrees, 135 were master's, and 20 were doctoral degrees.

To graduate with Academic Distinction, students must earn a grade point average of 3.75 or higher on at least 54 semester hours at ETSU.

Cream together:
3 cups Sugar
1 1/2 cup Butter
Add and mix well:
1 cup corn meal
4 Tablespoons Flour
4 Tablespoons Milk
4 Eggs
2 Teaspoons Vanilla or 1 Teaspoon Vanilla and 1 Teaspoon Orange Flavoring

Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until done in the center.

Squash Patties

3 Cups Grated Squash
1 Cup Flour
1 Teaspoon Sugar
1/2 Teaspoon Salt
1/4 Cup Oil
1 Egg
1/3 Cup Milk
1 Medium Onion (chopped)
Dash of Black Pepper

Mix above ingredients and fry in oil or in pam coated skillet. These freeze well.

Squaw Corn

Mix Together:
2 Cans Creamed Corn
3/4 Cup Corn Meal
1/4 Cup Oil

1 Jar Chopped Pimientos
1 Medium Onion (chopped)
1 Can Chopped Green Chilies
2 Eggs Beaten

3/4 Teaspoon Garlic Salt

During 1992 Connot was the Junior Varsity Coordinator and assistant

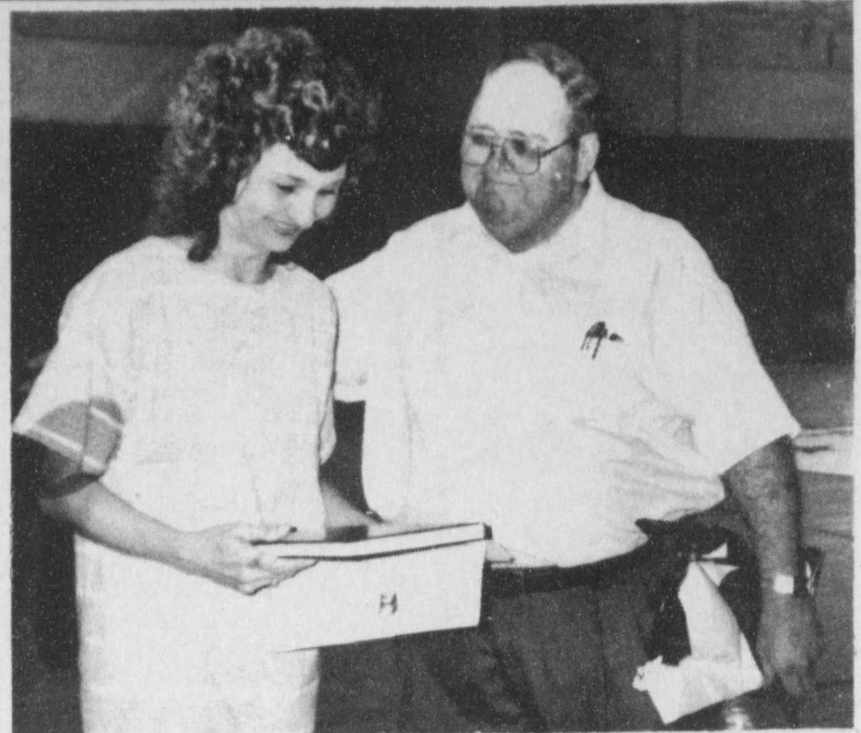
head coach from the press box and Varsity Golf instructor at Crowley High.

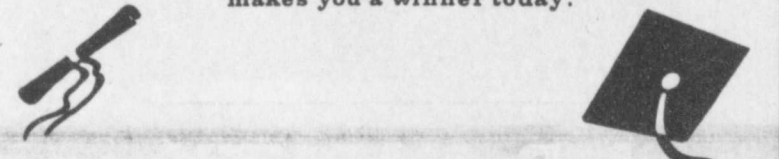

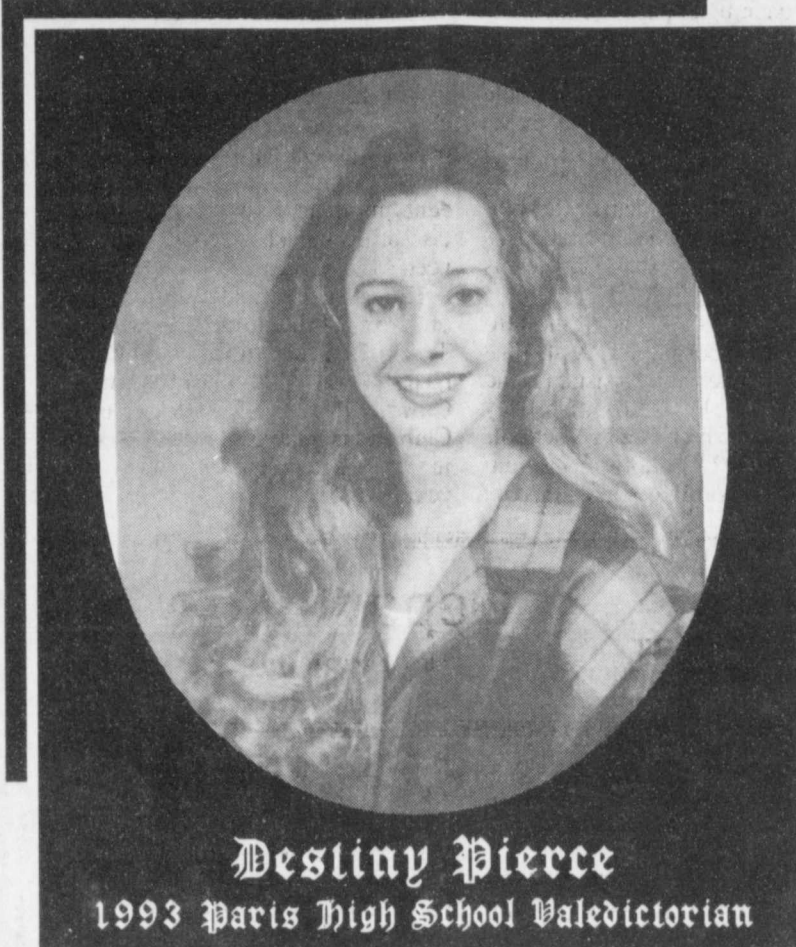
Destiny Pierce has been named valedictorian of the Paris High School graduating class with a grade point average of 5,7814 and an overall average of 98.2791.

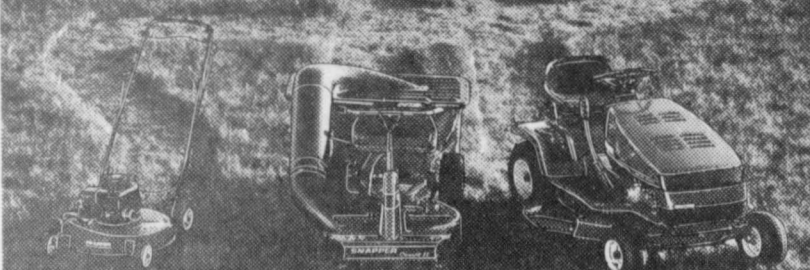

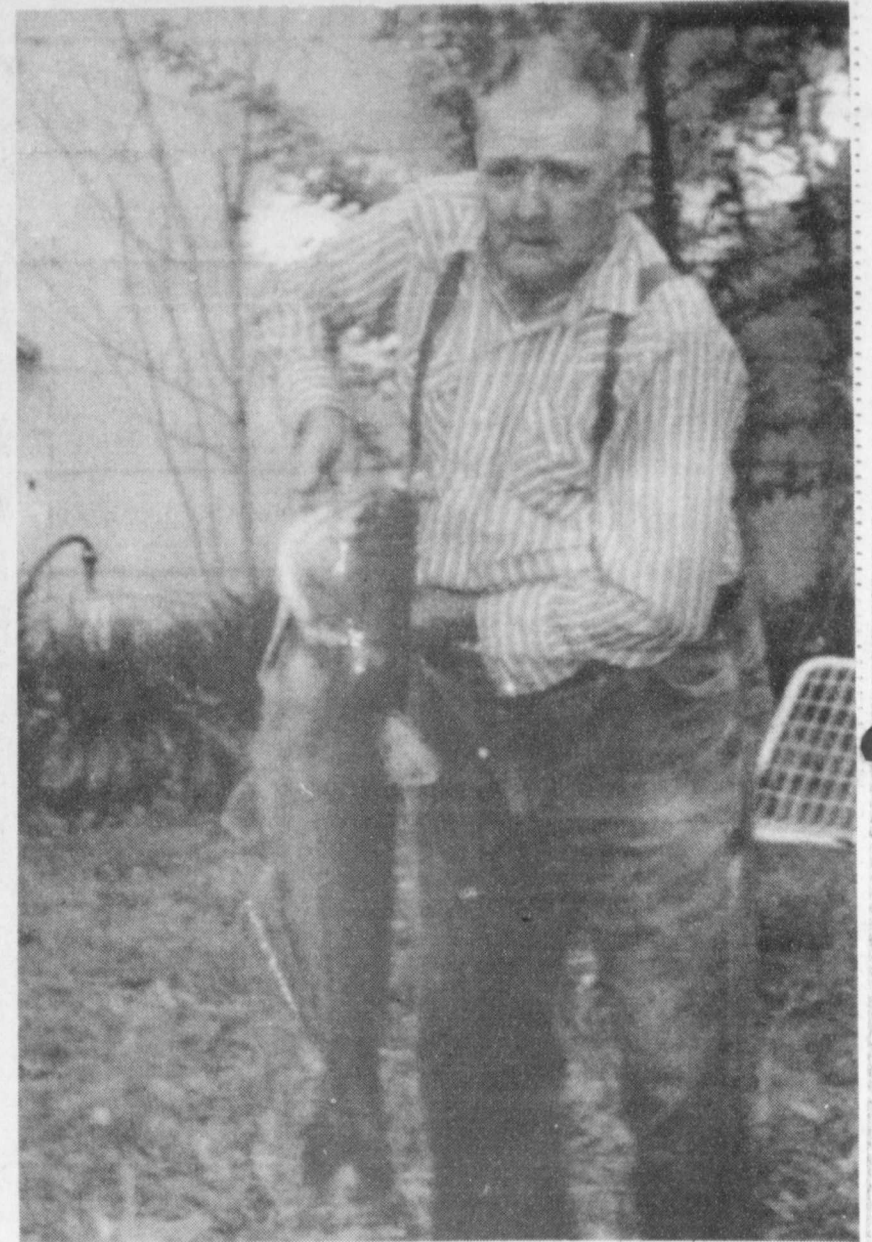
