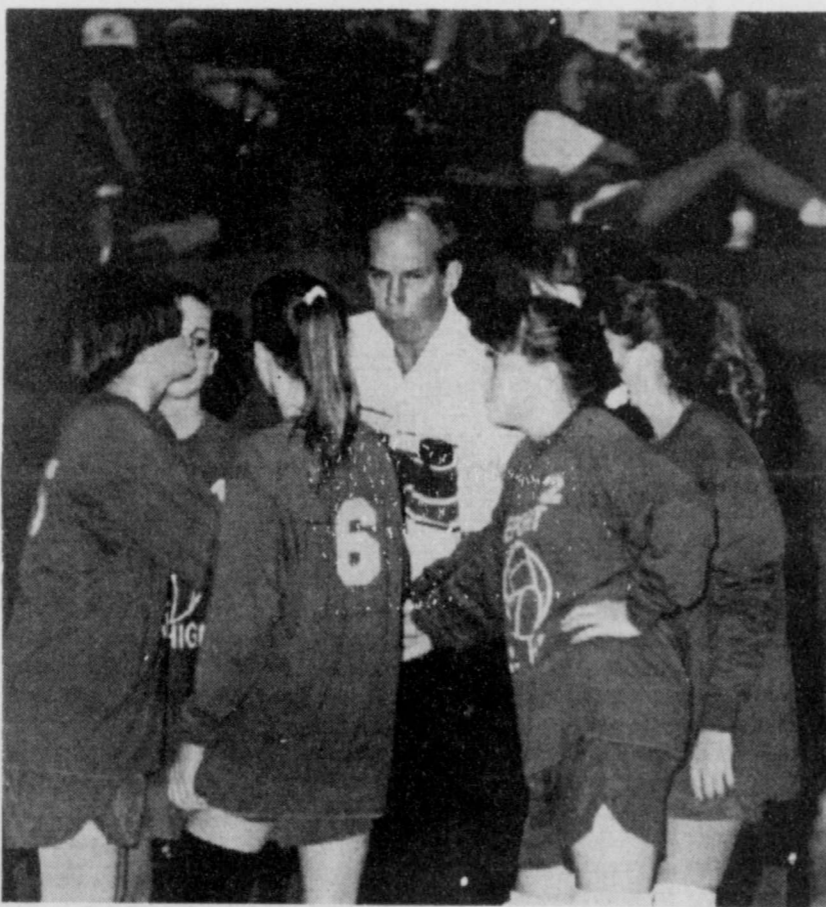
Refreshments were served by the Future Homemakers of America.

Prairiland FFA Selling Pansies And Other Plants

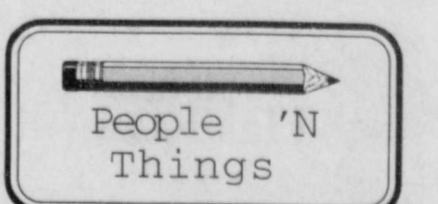
The Prairiland FFA Chapter is raising funds by selling Majestic Giant Pansies from their greenhouse.

Rarely do I ever find myself at a loss for words, I can usually think of something to say whether it's interesting or not, but I am totally without words today. I'd write a poem, but I can't think of one which applies. I could sing a song but that wouldn't put any words on this paper. So I'll

just not embarrass myself further, and will let you read the recipes.

Please, in the coming weeks, if you have some favorite holiday recipes, I'd really like to hear from you.

October 7, 1993

Tony's Tiger Bites
1 10 oz. pkg. (about 40) regular marshmallows
1/4 cup margarine
1/3 cup peanut butter
7 1/2 cups or one 10 ounce package Kellogg's Frosted Flakes cereal

- Melt margarine in large saucepan over low heat. Add marshmallows and stir until completely melted. Remove from heat.
- Stir in peanut butter until mixture is smooth. Add Kellogg's Frosted Flakes cereal, stirring until well coated.
- Using a buttered spatula or waxed paper, press mixture into a lightly greased 13 X 9 X 2 inch pan. Cut into 1 1/2 X 2 inch bars.

Ham Balls
1/2 lb ground ham
1/2 ob. ground lean pork
1/2 cup Pet milk
1 or 2 eggs
1 cup bread crumbs
1 Tbsp. flour
1/2 cup warm water
1 Tbsp. prepared mustard

1/2 cup Brown sugar
1 Tbsp. vinegar

Mix first 6 ingredients and shape into meat balls. make a sauce of the remaining ingredients and pour over meat balls. Let set for 1 hour in refrigerator. Bake at 325 degrees for 30 minutes - turn and cook for another 30 minutes.

Jalapena Chicken
Boneless chicken breast fillets
1 large onion chopped
1 bell pepper sliced
1 Jalapena pepper diced
About 1/3 cup soy Sauce
2 heaping tablespoons brown sugar
1/2 tsp garlic powder

Spray Wok or large skillet with Pam. Roll chicken fillets which have been cut into bite sized pieces in flour and brown in Wok. Add onion and peppers. Cook and stir until chicken is done. Add soy sauce and brown sugar and garlic powder. You really shouldn't need much salt because the soy sauce is salty. If this is not hot enough for you add more peppers. Let mixture cook until liquid is reduced. Serve with rice.

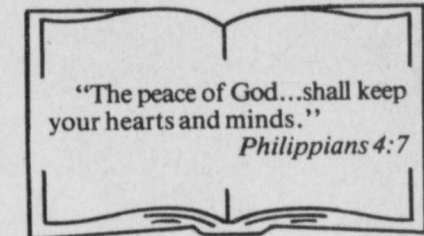

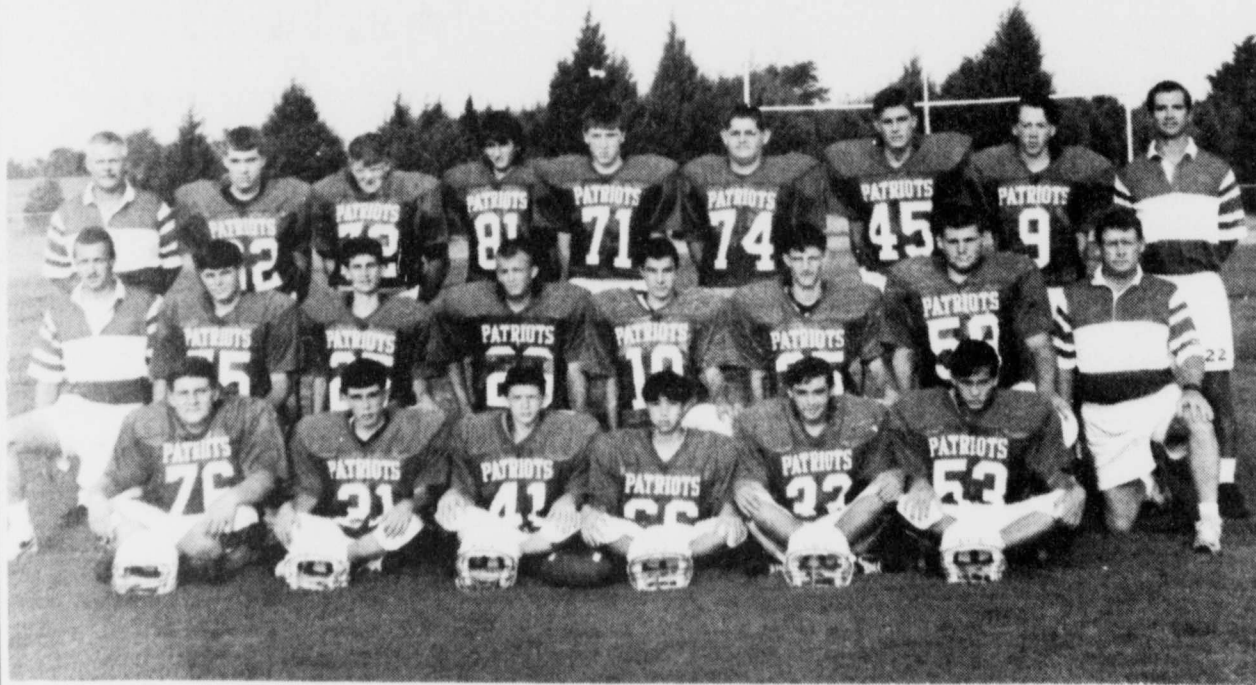


