Have you ever reached the point where some little something that ordinarily wouldn't matter at all can nearly make you cry?

Such is my situation. It may come under the heading of a "panic attack". I went to Paris Monday with three Christmas items in mind. They are no longer available anywhere in that town!

I went from store to store, door to door...the things I needed, which are simple, common and not expensive, were sold out.

I came home, and discovered that I had to open a new box of tea to make myself a nice glass of iced tea. Just the simple task of opening this box made me whine in frustration.

Of course, it wasn't breaking out the tea that was the problem...it was the overall weariness and frustration of being unable to find what I needed.

Then, there was the problem with the \$12.95 diskette full of Christmas designs.

We use graphic designs that are purchased from various companies to make borders, eye catchers and designs in ads.

We got a "bonus" diskette from a new company that had about fifty pieces of Christmas artwork.

Now, we have installed these graphics onto our computer harddrive routinely. This little floppy disk, however, was different. The instructions were so garbled, and the sequences so strange, that we tried three separate times to install it...to no avail.

I hereby offer a sample of these instructions. "The compressed "Dumbart" (not it's real name) images are compressed. Make a backup copy and store the originals in a safe place.

To extract or decompress use the following image extraction or decompression instructions. Locating your image with the Visual Graphics Reference Index (this is the fancy name for the piece of paper which shows you what the disk has on it) then note the name of the file and the archive where it is located. Insert the Dumbart disk and the archive file appears. Double-click the desired archive. The Extractor Application appears with the archive folder displayed. Then Choose Desktop from the Folder Popup menu, select your hard drive in the scroll box, click open, click extract, double click the folder, hold down the command key while clicking file names and select more than one file".

Well, we wrestled. We tried following it step by step. We never could get the machines to do what it said.

Cindy and I struggled, cussed, fussed and fought over this stupid, \$12.95 diskette, determined that it wouldn't get the better of us. Finally, we threw away the instructions and began trying to do it exactly the way we have always done the other diskettes. Guess, what, it worked.

But, by that time, we were both so confused and unhappy that every little problem that arose for the rest of the day brought on attacks of near-panic!

I have a feeling that with the holidays fast approaching there are lots of people out there suffering from this problem.

If there are...take heart...it'll all be over soon, and things will get better. I just keep telling myself this over, and over and over!

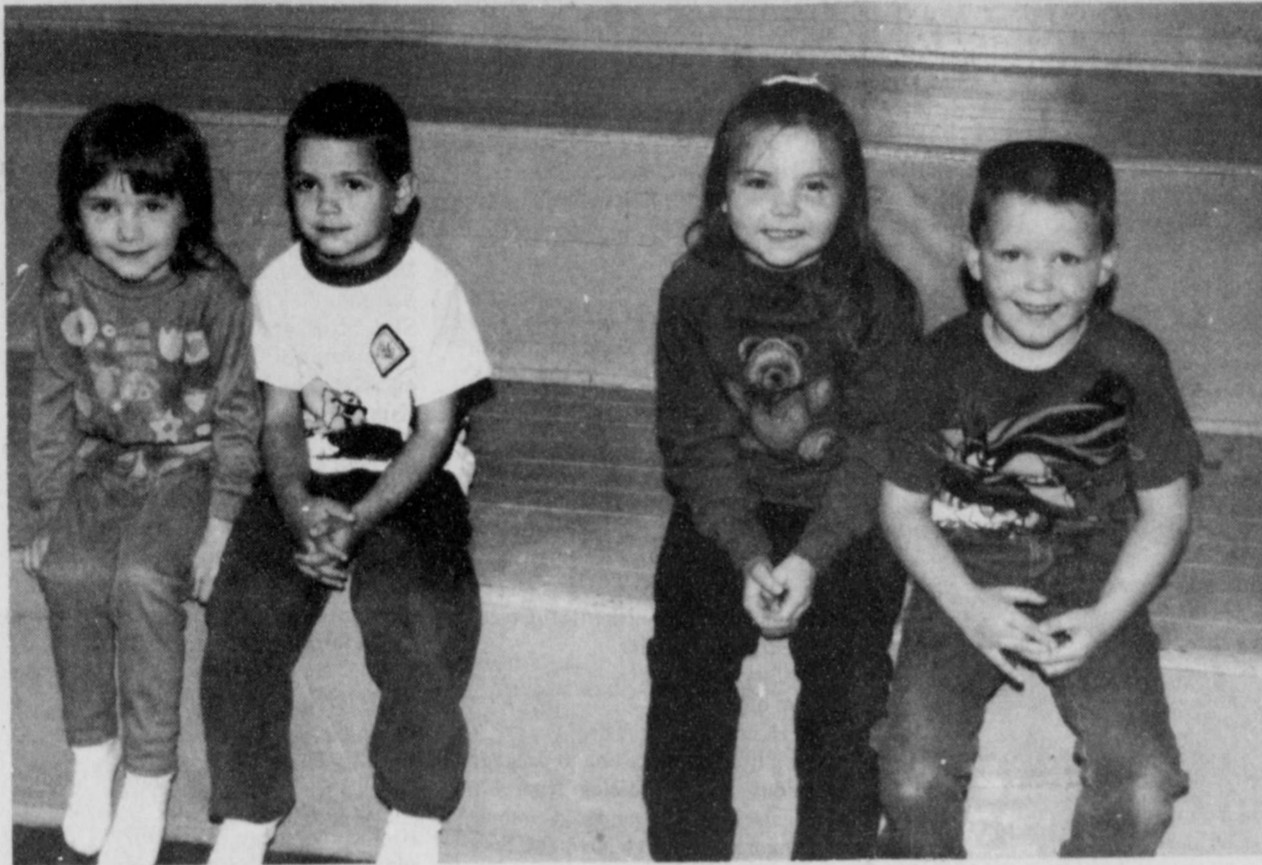

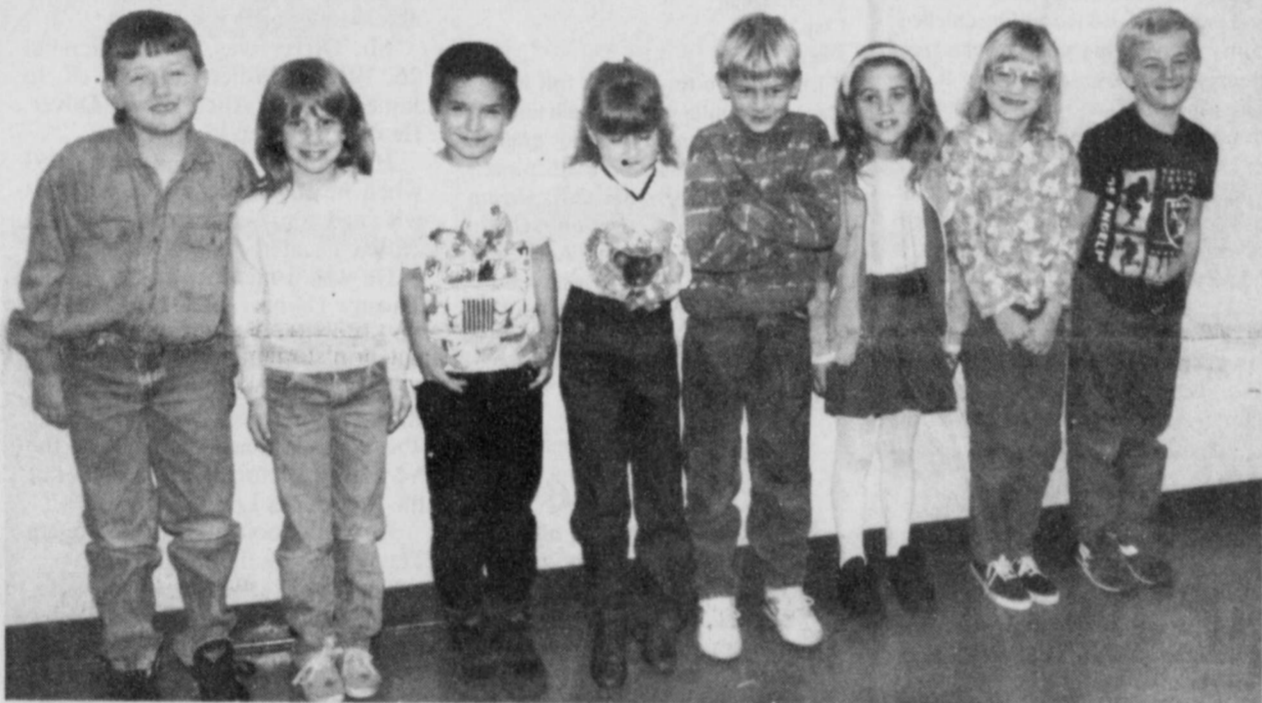

Dr. Mavis Kelsey Publishes Book On Courthouses Of Texas

Dr. Mavis Kelsey, long-time Houston doctor and relative of lots of Deport folks, has distinguished himself with a rather unusual accomplishment. He has published a book on the courthouses of Texas. The book features a wealth of living history with pictures of 254 courthouses in the state's county seats. Kelsey is an amateur historian, art and book collector, and a founder of the Kelsey-Seybold Clinic in Houston. The historic courthouses are a valuable architectural heritage, he says, and he wants to see them protected and preserved.

Kelsey also feels that the courthouses stand for a way of community life that is mostly in the past.

At 81, having retired from his medical practice in 1985, Kelsey has spent the last several years and logged

over 10,000 miles taking all 254 courthouses in Texas. His color pictures are all included in the book, "The Courthouses of Texas" which has just been published by Texas A & M. The 342 page guide includes essays and text by Kelsey and by historian Donald Dyal. The color photos of the graceful, stately courthouses are reported to be remarkable.

Kelsey has been featured in a lengthy article in the Houston Post. He also was on hand to sign autographs at the Brazos Bookstore Monday, Dec. 6th.

Dr. Kelsey is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Roger Kelsey, long-time Deport residents.

Marilyn Kelsey Glover reports that she several of the books coming, and hopes to have them on display at City Drug Store soon.

Deport VFD Christmas Party Is Monday Night

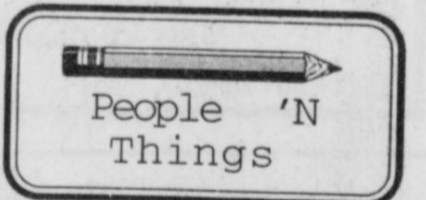
The Deport Volunteer Fire Department will host its Annual Christmas Party December 20th at 6:00 p.m. at the Deport School Cafeteria.

Country Cooking

We are planning to go to a program Saturday night. I asked what to wear, and was told to wear something nice but comfortable and casual, just a little dressy, but not uncomfortable. To me, nice means church clothes, comfortable means COMFORTABLE, and dressy means I DON'T GO. I have not yet decided what to wear. Usually if I get all dressed up, as dressed up as I get, everyone else has on warm-ups. If I get COMFORTABLE, other folks pick that night to dress to the hilt. This is not major to most folks, but to a person who has clothes in every size there is, this is major. Of course, when I say every size there is, I assume everyone knows that I do not mean Barbie sized clothes. Did you know that there is a size 0? How can a person exist and wear a 0? It seems that it would take enough material to make a hanky, it qualifies for a 0. It would definitely have to be less than one

yard of material. Then there are the 3s, 4s, and 5s. I see a woman carrying on like a nut on TV because she has lost 9 pounds and no longer has to buy a size 8. Bless her heart. Can you just imagine the anguish that poor woman has suffered, worrying that someone will find out that she wore a size 8? All of this torture over what to wear was brought on by the recipes for the week. They are some of the favorite Intermission Buffet recipes from The Old Church Theatre in Clarksville, where I plan to go Saturday night if I can find something to wear. The planned menu this week is spiced meatballs, dilled cheese sandwiches, vegetable platter with creamy dip, red velvet cake, and coffee and tea. I definitely plan to leave off the coffee and tea.

This week's recipes are Broccoli Cheese Soup, Pasta Salad, and Mini Cheesecakes. I appreciate the folks' letting me use their recipes.

December 9, 1993

Broccoli Cheese Soup

- 8 cups chicken broth
- 3 carrots
- 2 potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 1 onion
- 3 stalks celery
- 1 box frozen chopped broccoli
- 1 stick margarine
- 3 to 4 cups milk
- 1 cup flour
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 Tablespoon dill weed
- 2 dashes Tabasco sauce
- 1 lb. box Velveeta Cheese

Chop carrots, celery and onion in food processor. Add to boiling chicken broth in large soup pan. Add cubed potatoes and broccoli. In a sauce pan use margarine, milk and flour to make a white sauce. When vegetables are tender, remove pan from heat and add white sauce. (Do not add white sauce while soup is boiling.) add cubed velveeta and seasonings. Heat gently and serve. (Serves 12.)

Pasta Salad

- 1 16 oz. box linguini pasta
- 1 cup sliced black olives
- 1 cup sliced artichoke hearts (canned in water)

- 1 cup smoked turkey or ham (julienned)
- 1 1/2 tsp garlic powder
- 3 T Italian seasoning
- 2/3 cup olive oil
- 1 cup Hellman's mayonaisse

Cook linguini according to package directions. Make dressing from oil, mayonaisse, and seasonings. Combine all ingredients in large bowl and toss. (Serves 8-10)

Mini Cheesecakes

- 2 vanilla wafers
- 2-8 oz. pkgs cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 eggs

Line muffin tin with 12 foil liners. Place one vanilla wafer in each liner. (1 Tbs. crushed vanilla wafer or graham cracker crumbs may be used in each liner instead of the wafer.) Mix Cream Cheese, vanilla and sugar on medium speed until well blended. Add eggs. Mix well. Pour evenly over wafers. Bake 25 minutes at 325 degrees. Remove from pan when cool. Chill. Top with cherry or blueberry pie filling.

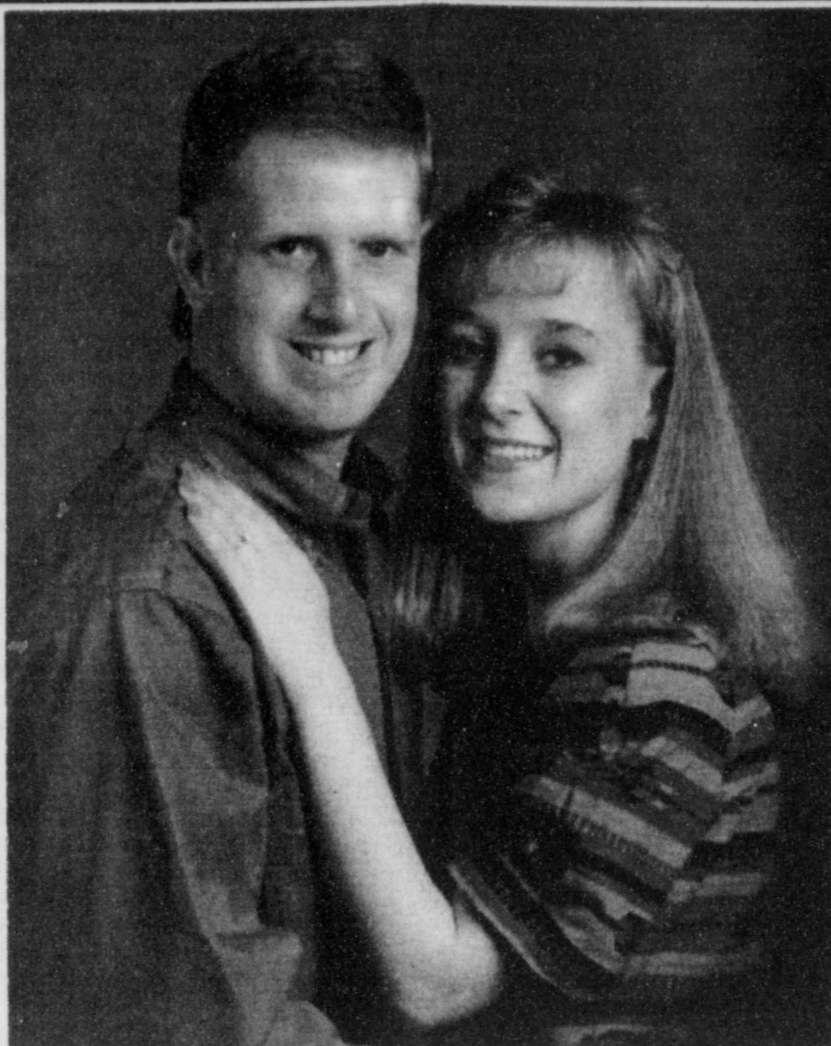

Lady Patriots Shock NL & Paris

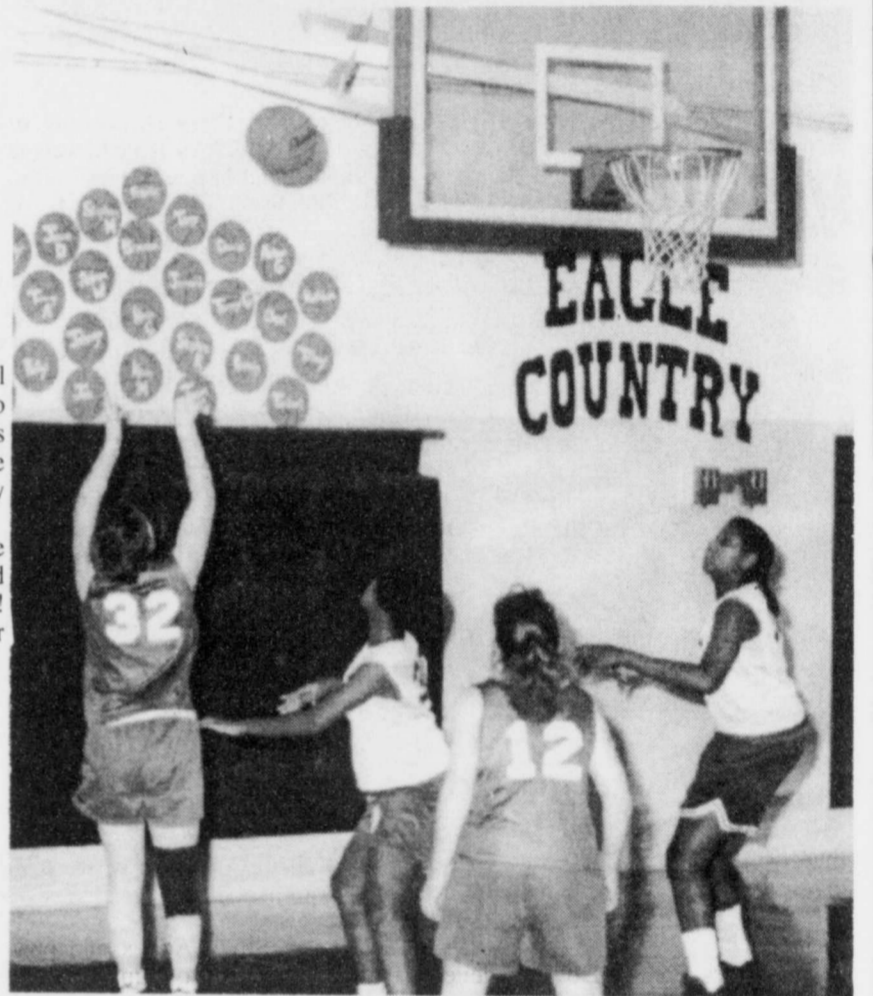

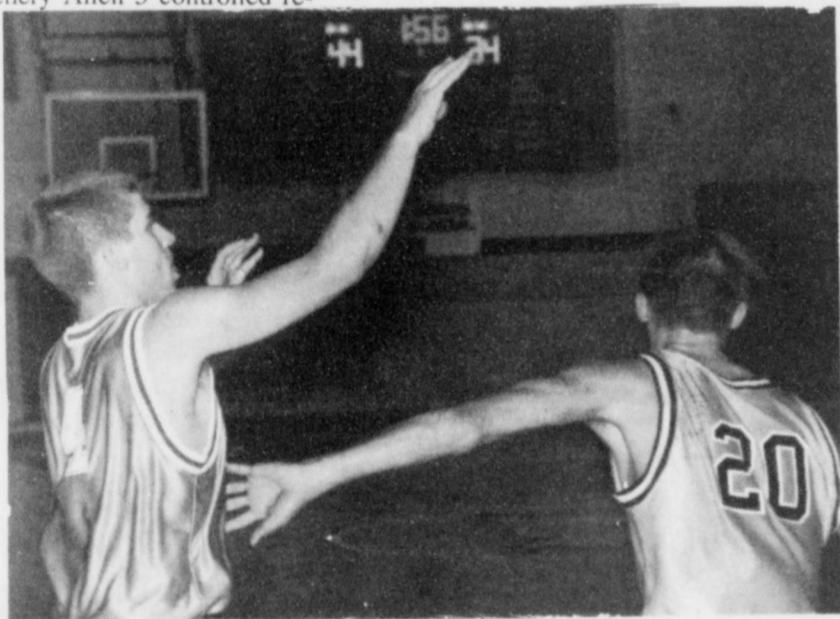

 The Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) has received an application for financial assistance from Red River County Water Supply Corporation located in Clarksville, Red River County, Texas to improve/expand the existing water distribution system to serve existing and new customers in Red River County, Texas.

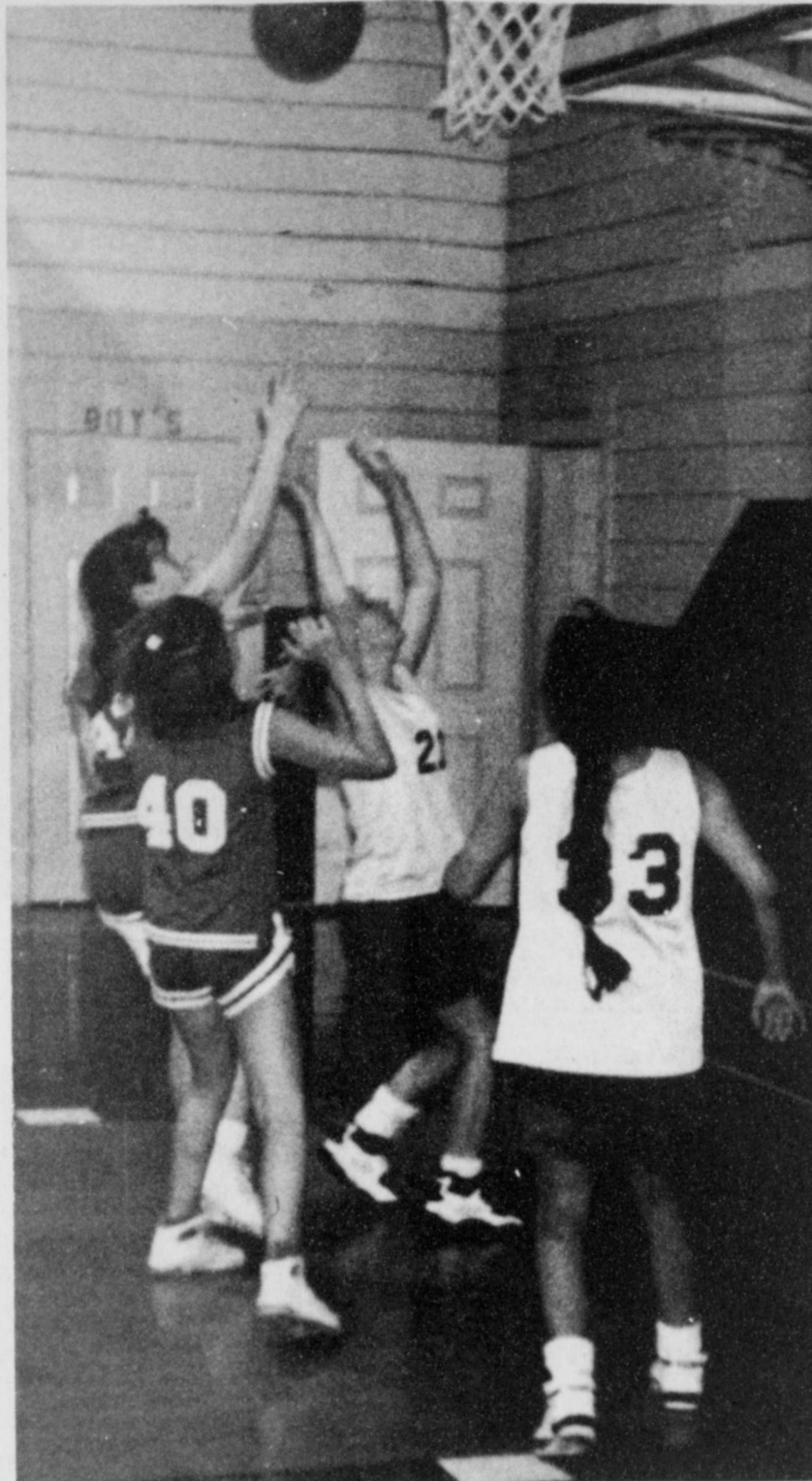
2. With this win the Patriots advanced to play Saturday morning against Rivercrest.

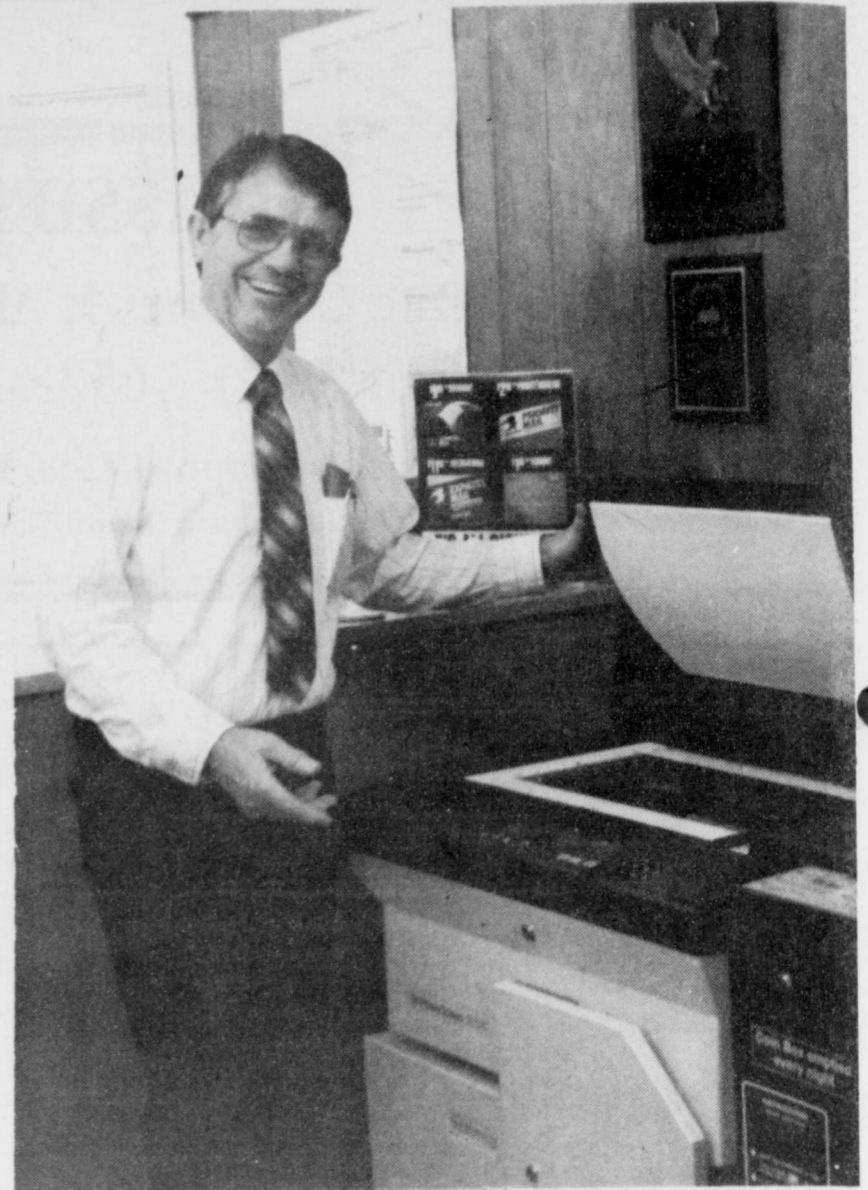
