## Dr. L.C. Stout Is Named Rural Educator Of The Year

Dr. L.C. Stout, Superintendent of Prairiland Independent School District was named as Texas Rural Educator of the year in Mt. Pleasant on Friday, November 18.

He was attending the Prairiland Girl's State Volleyball Tournament in Austin and was unable to be there for the presentation.

In announcing Dr. Stout's honor, George Brown, Regional VIII associate executive director, said, "Dr. Stout has been instrumental in promoting the values of rural education in Texas."

The award will be presented to Dr. Stout at the December board meeting at Prairiland in recognition of his "outstanding work in rural education in the state of Texas and the nation."

As past president of TREA, Stout initiated the affiliation of the state group with National Rural Education Association. TREA membership is limited to schools with 1,000 or less average daily attendance.

The year, NREA recognized the Texas affiliate for having largest membership gain in one year. Texas, with a little over 100 members, also is the largest NREA affiliate.

At Thursday's meeting, Jim Hesson of Roxton, TREA president, accepted the chapter's award for NREA executive director Jow Newlin of Fort Collins, Colorado.

Hesson, in accepting the award, said, "Rural schools are the fibers keeping our nation together."

Educators, primarily from Region VIII Education Service Center, gathered to hear Jay Bouchard of upstate New York, NREA past president.

Bouchard told about 50 administrators that NREA is recognized in Washington as the voice for rural school districts.

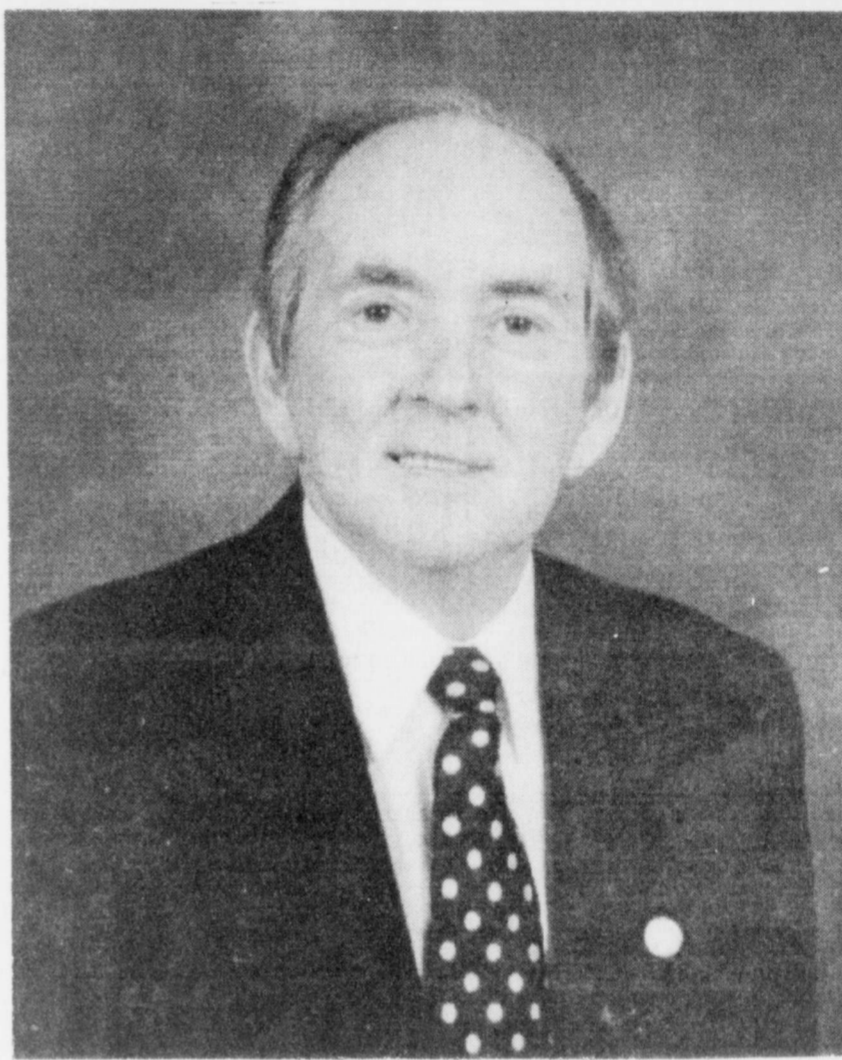
He said the 1994 Elementary and Secondary Education Act calls for a White House-Congress meeting with rural educators. In addition, the bill earmarked \$100 million for repair of rural school buildings.

TREA members also recognized Patsy Johnson of Sulphur Springs, recently defeated District 9 State Board of Education member. The group applauded Johnson for work in representing Texas rural schools.

"Rural schools are child-friendly places," she said. "I have not dropped off the face of the earth," Mrs. Johnson said, "but will continue to work for the good of the kids and for rural education."

"I think we have been headed in the right direction and I hope things don't change too much," she said. Republican Randy Stevenson of Tyler defeated Mrs. Johnson in her November bid for re-election.

Attending Friday's meeting from Red River Valley school districts were superintendents Hesson, Dr. Donald Frye of Detroit, Donald Robbins of Fannindel, H.L. Milton of Honey Grove, Freddy Wade of Talco-Bogata and Dr. Charley Jones of Avery.

Now, I know everyone is full of turkey and all the trimmings as you read this.....probably reading it between the dishes and watching the parades and football games....but it is time to think Christmas! You know what that means.....no, not gifts or presents...fruitcake! Yes, that wonderful concoction that everyone loves, known as the fruitcake. The wonderful concoction that has everything in it, but the kitchen sink. Now, don't say you don't like fruitcake. As many varieties as there is out in this great world, there must be one that you can find that will tempt your taste buds.

There are fruity fruitcakes, nutty fruitcakes, heavy fruitcakes, light fruitcakes and the people I work with at the paper fruitcakes(just kidding), and just a great variety of fruitcakes.

Personally, I love fruitcake, but getting back to the story. The time is right to get some baking done and as you know the longer a fruitcake sets, the better it is. So, now is the time to go out while you have a few days off

and get everything you need and start baking. Oh, and let me know how they turn out or if you need another recipe.

The first recipe is the Texas Fruitcake. This one has orange slices in it and is very chewy with lots of pecans.

The Japanese Fruitcake has 8 eggs and not as much fruit as some of the others.

The Southern Fruitcake is loaded!...with everything! 12 eggs, 10 pounds of fruit and 3-1/2 pounds of nuts. Can you imagine stirring this one! You definitely would need help in the kitchen...from everyone!

The German Fruitcake uses more nuts than fruit and only three eggs.

Also included is a recipe for Fruitcake Cookies. These are very good and can be stored all the way up until Christmas...that is if they last!

- Texas Fruitcake**  
1 cup powdered sugar  
1 cup flour  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon baking powder  
2 cups chopped pecans  
1/2 pound candied pineapple(cut up)  
1/2 pound candied cherries(cut up)  
1/2 pound candy orange slices(cut up)  
1 pound dates(cut up)  
4 eggs  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
Sift together sugar, flour, salt and baking powder. Combine with pecans and fruits. Beat eggs well. Add vanilla; pour over first mixture and blend well. Grease and flour baking pans. Bake at 325 degrees for 35 to 40 minutes.
- Japanese Fruitcake**  
1 cup butter  
2 cups sugar  
4 cups flour  
2 teaspoon baking powder  
1/2 cup milk  
8 egg whites-stiffly beaten  
1 cup raisins  
1 cup chopped cherries  
1 cup chopped pecans  
1 teaspoon allspice  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1 teaspoon ground cloves  
Cream butter and sugar. Sift flour and baking soda. Add to creamed mixture alternately with milk. Fold in egg whites. Pour part of batter into 3 layer pans, reserving enough batter for 2 additional layers. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. To remaining batter, add raisins, cherries, pecans, allspice, cinnamon and cloves. Pour into 2 layer pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.
- Southern Fruitcake**  
4-1/2 cup flour  
1 teaspoon baking powder  
1 teaspoon apple spice  
2 teaspoon apple pie spice  
2 cups butter  
2-1/4 cup sugar  
2 tablespoon lemon juice  
1/2 cup honey  
12 eggs-well beaten  
1 tablespoon almond extract  
1-1/2 cup strawberry preserves  
1 cup fig preserves  
2 pounds cherries-chopped  
4 pounds pineapple(2 yellow & 2 green)  
2 pounds dates  
1/2 pound figs  
1/2 pound orange peel
- German Fruitcake**  
1/2 cup brazil nuts  
1 cup English walnuts  
2 cups pecan halves  
2/3 cup almond package whole dates  
1/2 cup whole marachino cherries-red green  
1/2 cup seedless raisins  
1/2 cup sifted flour  
3/4 cup sugar  
1/2 teaspoon baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
3 eggs  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
Grease bottom and sides of loaf pan. Line with waxed paper grease paper. Place nuts and fruits in large bowl. Sift dry ingredients together over nut mixture and mix well. Beat eggs until light and fluffy. Add vanilla and blend into nut mixture. Dough will be stiff. Spoon into prepared pan and spread evenly. Bake in 300 degree oven for 1 hour and 15 minutes. Cool for 10 minutes in pan and turn out of pan.
- Fruitcake Cookies**  
1-1/2 cups raisin  
1/4 cup citron  
1/2 pound of cherries  
Chop and mix with 1/4 cup of rum and cover for 1 hour.  
1/2 cup butter  
1/2 cup brown sugar  
2 eggs  
1-1/2 cup flour  
1/2 teaspoon baking powder  
2 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 teaspoon cloves  
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/8 teaspoon salt  
1/2 pound pecans  
Mix all above ingredients and let stand overnight. Place on cookie sheet and bake at 325 degrees for 10-12 minutes.

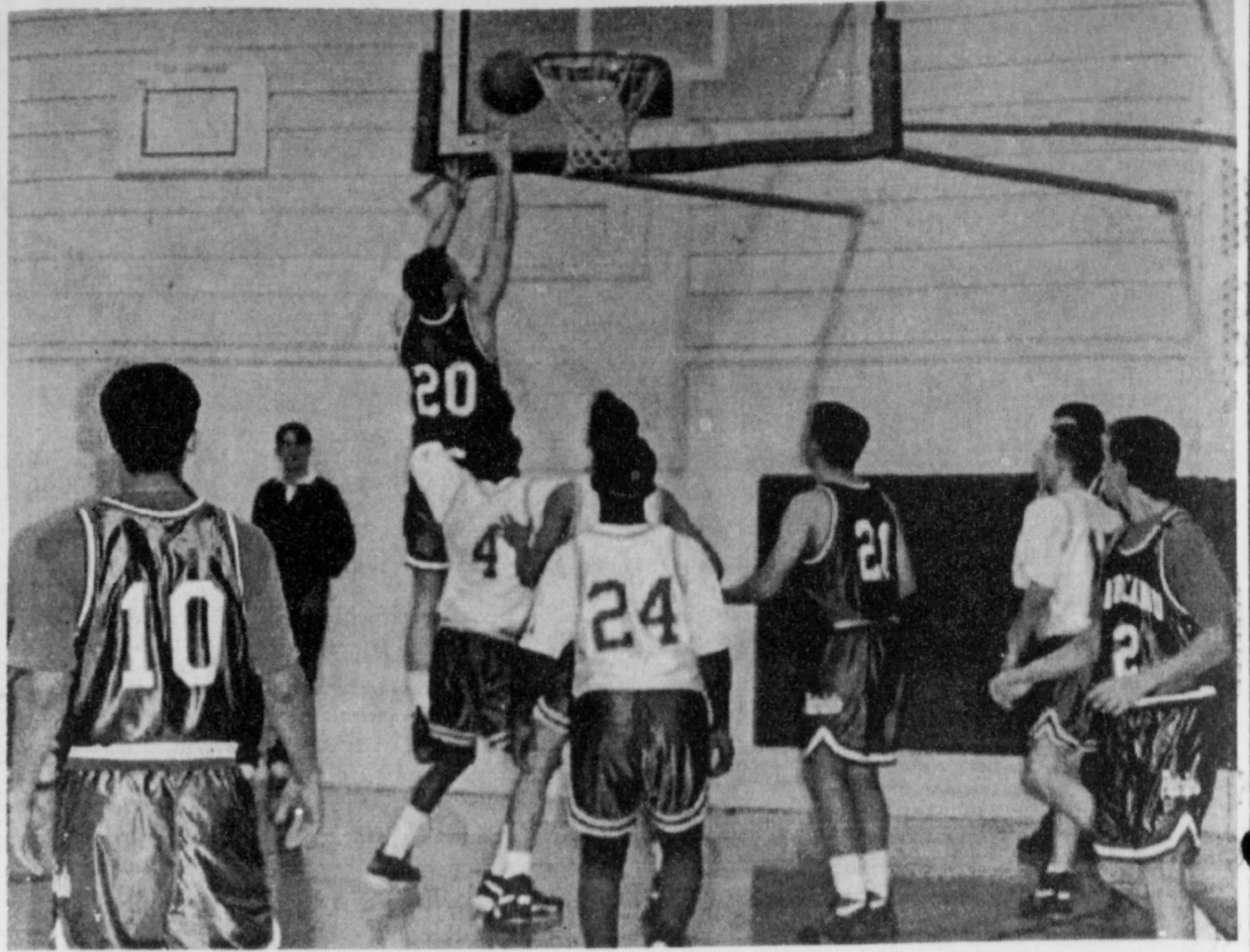

## Lady Pats Win Thriller In Roxton

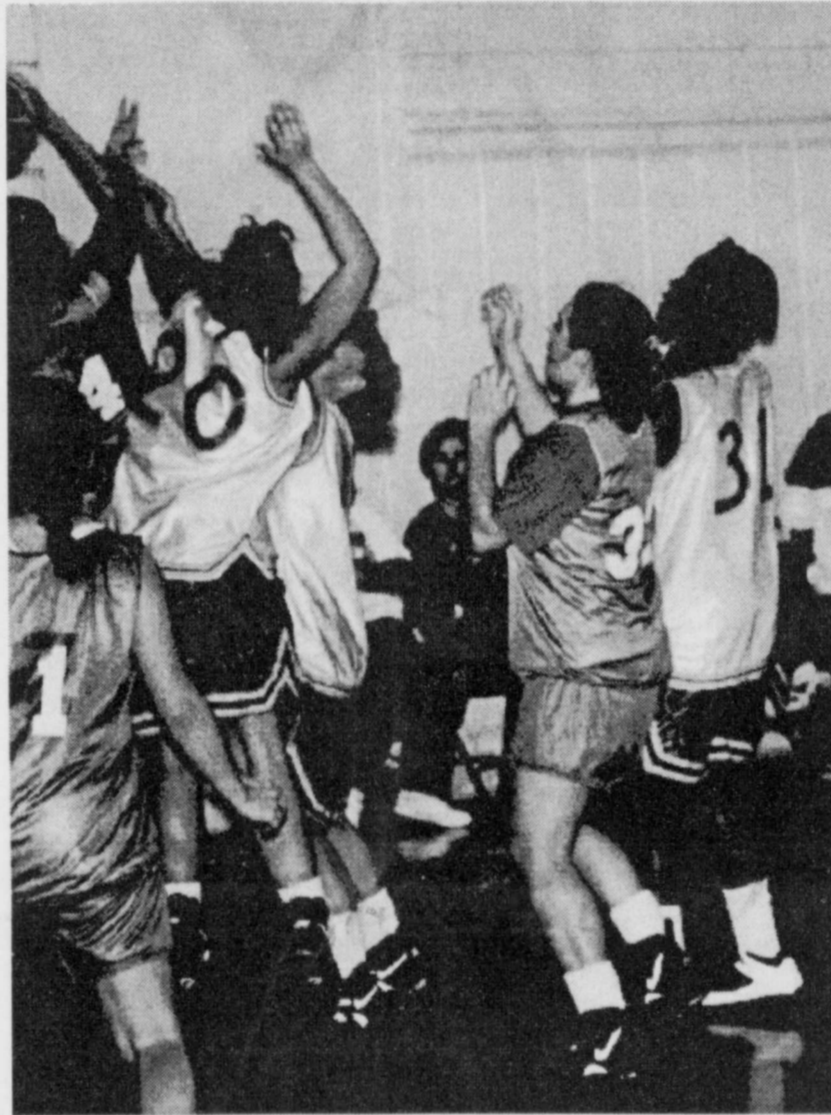

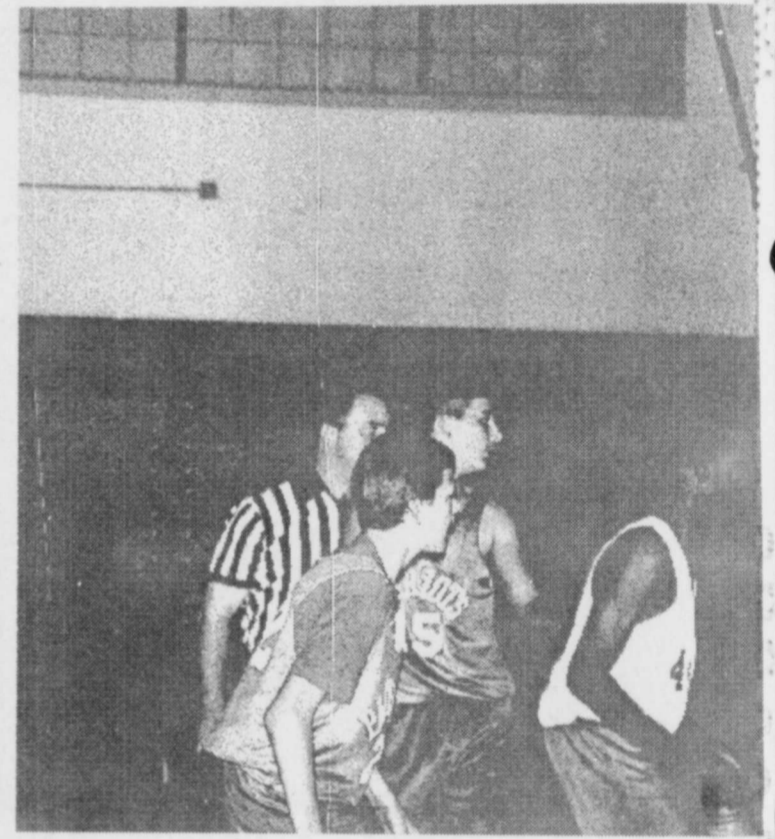
## Basketball-- 25 Years Ago

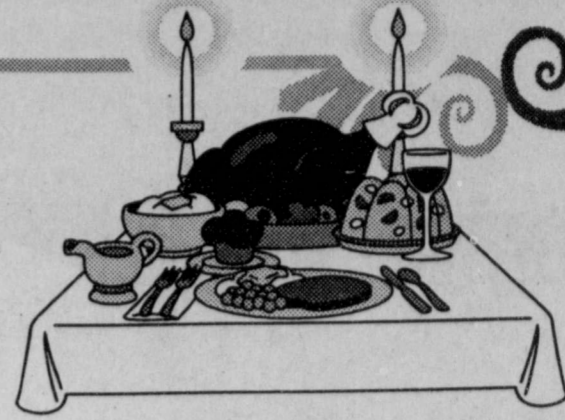

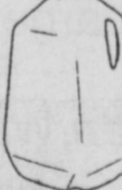

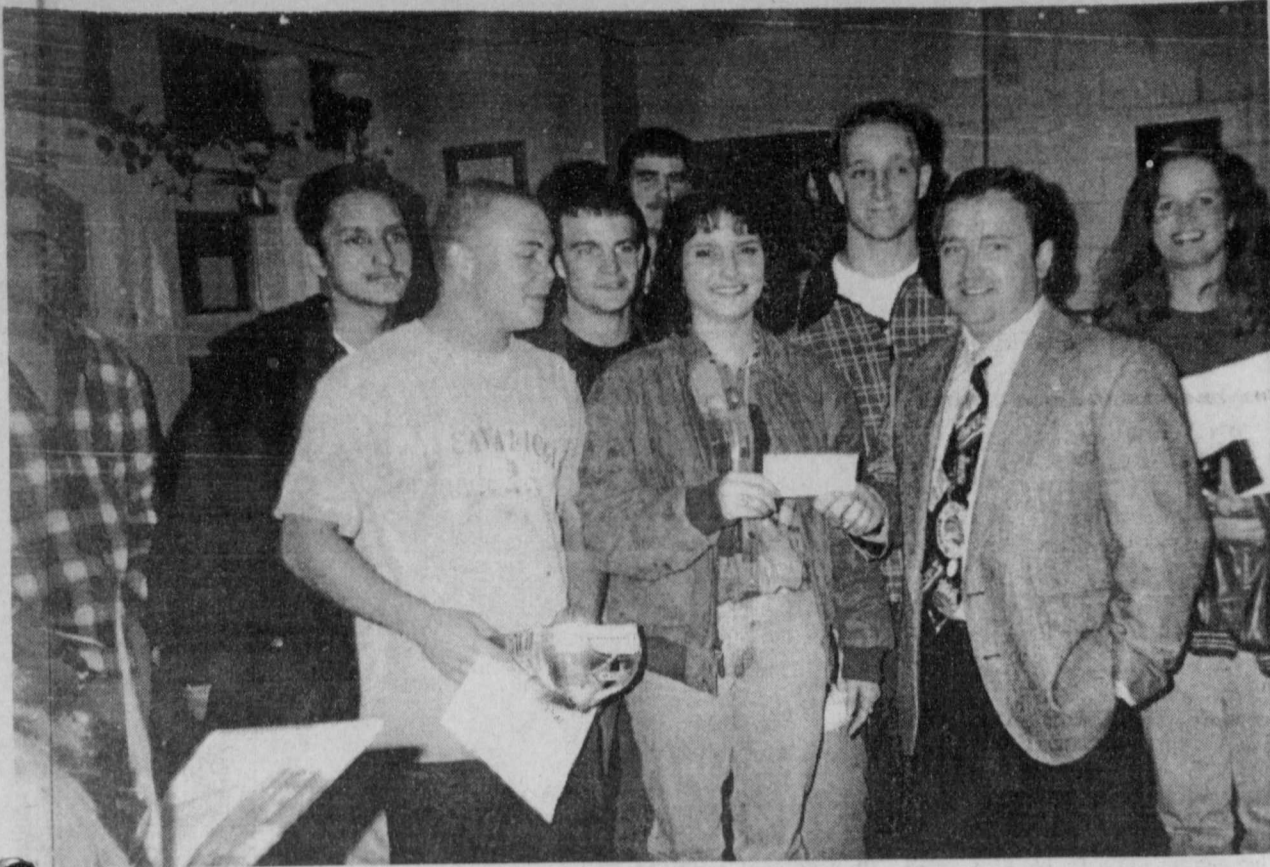

November Sales Tax Rebates Reported

"The Texas economy continues to improve along with employment, which grew by 3.1 percent since one year ago," State Comptroller John Sharp said, as he sent a total of \$195.3 million in November sales tax rebates to 1,072 Texas cities and 111 counties. "Sales tax rebates reflect a 3.6 percent increase in consumer confidence over the same period last year," Sharp said.

Texas cities received \$178.7 million in local sales tax returns, up 4.1 percent over last November's payment of \$171.6 million. Counties received a total of \$16.6 million for their November rebates, 1 percent less than the \$16.7 million payment of one year ago.

This month's payments include taxes collected by monthly sales tax filers on September sales and by quarterly filers for July, August and September, and reported to the Comptroller in October.

Total employment in the last year rose by 3.1 percent in Texas, with the Austin and Dallas metro areas lead-

ing the way in total growth," Sharp said.

Mount Pleasant received a sales tax rebate of \$265,217.04, over \$164,480.52 last year, a 58.81% increase.

Talco received \$2,091.36 this year; \$2,089.88 last year; an increase of 18.75%.

Bogata received \$4,773.61, compared to \$5,037.33 last year, a difference of \$28.95%.

Clarksville received \$27,281.17 this year, compared to \$28,312.79, a difference of 7.71%.

Detroit received \$2,319.63, compared to last year's \$51,797.58, an increase of 16.22%.

Blossom received \$4,060.74 this year, \$3,648.49 last year, a difference of \$9.36%.

Deport received \$3,040.03 this year, \$2,895.13 last year, a difference of 1.19%.

Paris received \$494,374.00 this year, \$323,649.90 last year, a difference of 64.26%.

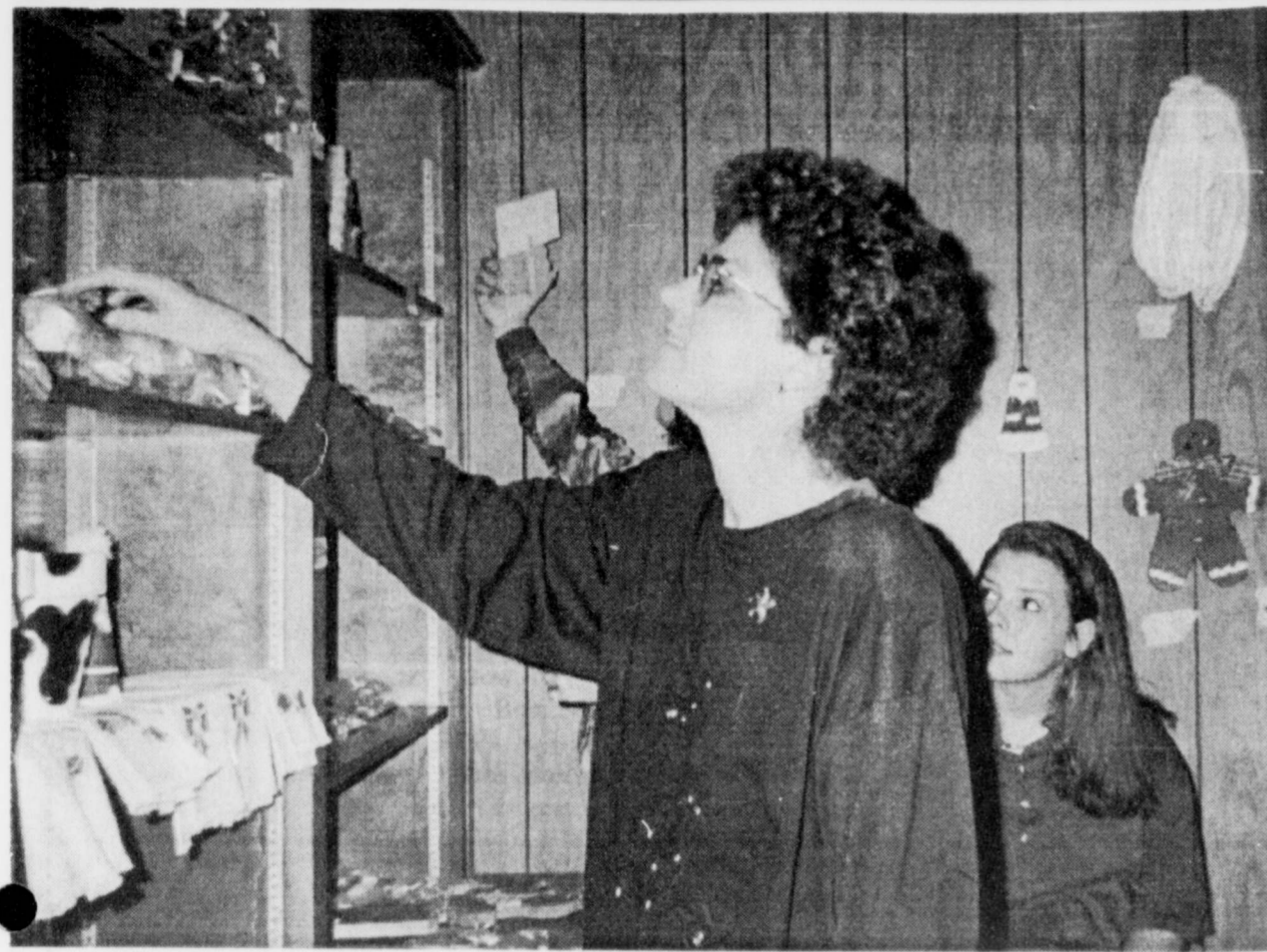

**Lt. Cmdr. Rodgers Returns From Western Pacific And Indian Oceans**

Navy Lt. Cmdr. Daniel J. Rodgers, son of Joe N. Rodgers of Blossom, recently returned from a four-month deployment to the Western Pacific and Indian oceans with the staff of Commander Destroyer Squadron 23 embarked aboard the destroyer USS Paul F. Foster.

Rodgers and fellow shipmates sailed from their homeport of San Diego to the Persian Gulf where they conducted maritime interception operations -- stopping, boarding and searching ships heading to and from Iraq in violation of international sanctions.

As part of the staff in charge of a group of ships, Rodgers supported the officer responsible for coordinat-

ing the operations and activities of a half dozen Navy ships supporting the Middle East Force in the Gulf. The staff also helped coordinate and direct exercises with the navies of

Bahrain, France, Kuwait, Pakistan, Qatar and the United Kingdom.

Rodger's involvement in the deployment underscores how the Navy-Marine Corps team still serves as the best option when a formidable force package is needed to remain on station for months at a time. Whether delivering humanitarian assistance, cargo, or troops from the sea, these highly trained naval forces provide a unique crisis-response option, which can be withdrawn quickly when no longer needed.

The 1972 graduate of Prairiland High School of Pattonville joined the Navy in December 1972. Rodgers is a 1983 graduate of Texas A&M University with a BS degree and a 1991 graduate of the U. S. Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, with a MS degree.
