I guess it's a little easier on the pocketbook than neutering because dog food can be bought a week at a time, but in the long run people spend more on food than on neutering. And, the problem of unwanted puppies and kittens is avoided with neutering.

Puppies and kittens are adorable, but sadly only a few will ever reach their first year because of illnesses that prey on the young, cars and the many other dangers that fill a small animal's world.

Out of a litter of five kittens only about one every makes that first birthday! The odds for a puppy aren't much higher. And those that do survive all too often are doomed to repeat the cycle of multiplication, endlessly overpopulating this world with unwanted pets!

But, if owners would neuter their pet or pets the population wouldn't be so overwhelming and the demand could more nearly meet the supply. As it is now the supplies are virtually endless and the demand for pets just cannot begin to cope with the overstock.

Please, if there is any way possible, have your dog or cat neutered, not only will you help in reducing the numbers of unwanted cats and dogs in this world, but you may find they make much more loving pets too! It is the responsible thing to do.

## Baseball and Europe provide quite an experience for Allens

When Zachary Allen was selected as one of 16 young athletes in Texas and Oklahoma to be on "Team Texoma" a baseball team that was to play exhibition and tournament games across Europe this summer, it seemed like a great thing to do. When time came to go, the step onto that plane was pretty big, but he made it. Some young men did not take that step...literally. They backed out at the airport!

Zachary's family, parents John and Phebe and brother Dustin and sister Hollie, decided that they would also fly to Europe, and watch Zachary and the other teams play. They even gathered their courage and drove a rental car in the Netherlands and Germany.

Zachary and the other team members and teams flew in to Rome, then traveled by bus across Italy, Switzerland and into Germany. They played games in Germany, but mostly in Holland.

"It rained every day, but the countryside was beautiful" Zachary states. Like his family, one of the biggest problems he faced was finding something to eat that wasn't strange and different.

"We ended up mostly eating at the ball parks" he grinned. "We would each snitzels (like large hot dogs) a toastee (grilled cheese with ham) potato fries and picantos (a cross between sausage and chicken)."

The young athlete, who graduated from Prairiland High School this past spring, enjoyed meeting new people.

His dad says that "I have always had a good sense of direction, but I completely lost it driving in Europe". The narrow streets and winding roads kept him turned around. "I would see something we wanted to get to, and it would look simple, but it would end up being a major deal to get there" he states. They made it, however, with some humor and lots of determina-

tion.

Zachary and the coaches and other boys stayed at Youth Hostels, which provide basic shelter, shared baths, dormitory style beds and not much else. That, Zachary says, wasn't too much fun. He really did enjoy playing ball, though.

"The little kids are just crazy about American baseball" Zachary says. "They ask for pictures taken with you, autographs, anything. They go nuts for American baseball cards. We gave away lots and lots of them" he grins.

Meanwhile, John, Phebe, Dustin and Hollie were staying in hotels which were a little more luxurious than the hostels. They found them pretty different, though, with small rooms.

One night the only lodging they could find was at a converted chapel. Phebe used a convertor to plug in the hair dryer. Something wasn't right, though, and the lights for the whole place were knocked out! Laughing, they relate her asking John a little later to try and turn up the heat in the room.

"No" he said firmly "we've already put out the lights, we're not going to mess anything else up". So, they slept cold.

Cold in July in Europe is something many Americans have trouble with. It's hard to go from nearly 100 degrees to about half that!

The whole family says they headed for every McDonald's they saw, as did most other team members and their families.

Zachary says his team was the only one made up of high school students, the rest were mostly college students. Many of the European teams are made up of adults. The Germans and Dutch have club memberships similar to a country club membership and the clubs make up teams.

Zachary said that his team place fifth which he felt was pretty good.

While the tams were practicing ball, the rest of the Allen family were doing things like going up in windmills and doing some touring of the countryside. The windmill they went up in was grinding meal to be mixed with cattle and horse feed, and the man who runs it gave them quite a tour.

One of the nicest things that happened, the Allen family agrees happened when they met a little boy who has just turned 13.

"He's crazy about the U.S." Phebe relates, "and he wants to come to the United States so much. He thought that Team Texoma was 'it' and every day he came to the ball park in Holland with his camera, fresh fruit, waffles and other goodies. His mother drove him forty miles every day to get there" she remembers. He wants to come to the United States as an exchange student and one feels that he may have no trouble finding a host family!

Probably the least thrilled of the family was Dustin. He frankly didn't enjoy his trip much. He says the only way he would ever go back was if "there was a national emergency and I was drafted and sent there".

But, overall the family learned a lot. They enjoyed seeing how other people live. Zachary says he has made friends for life and would probably go back if invited again.

His parents agree they might go back if they could take a tour instead of trying to find their own way around, Hollie would go along too.

So, the Allen family has returned with souvenirs, memories and lots of experiences to chalk up.

Their's was an introduction to Europe few people have...though the sport of baseball.

Steve and Sarah Gibney from Lansdale, Pennsylvania will be holding the services.

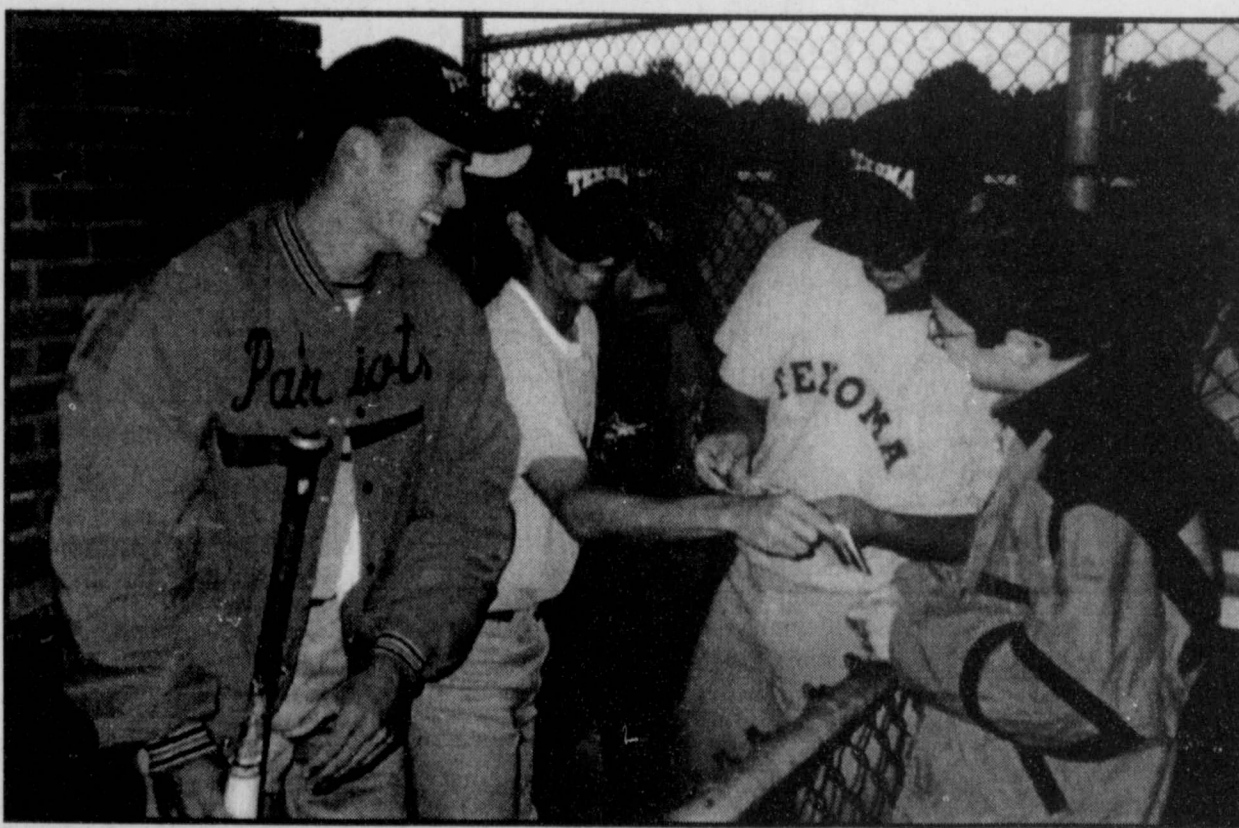

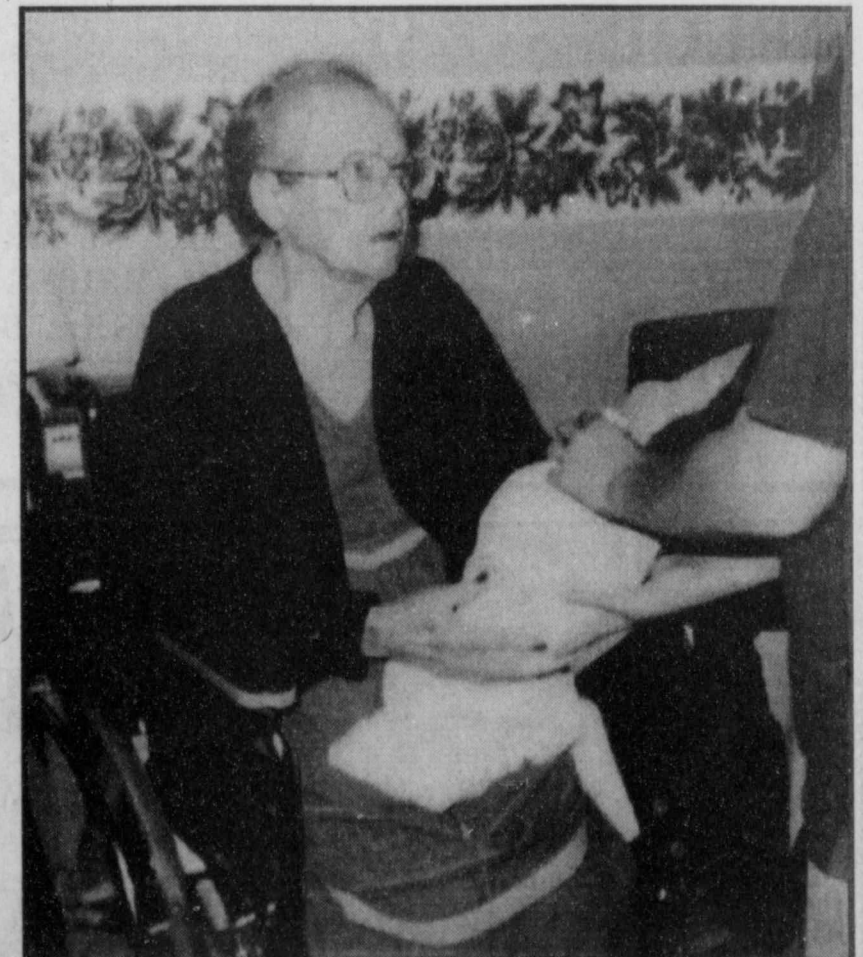

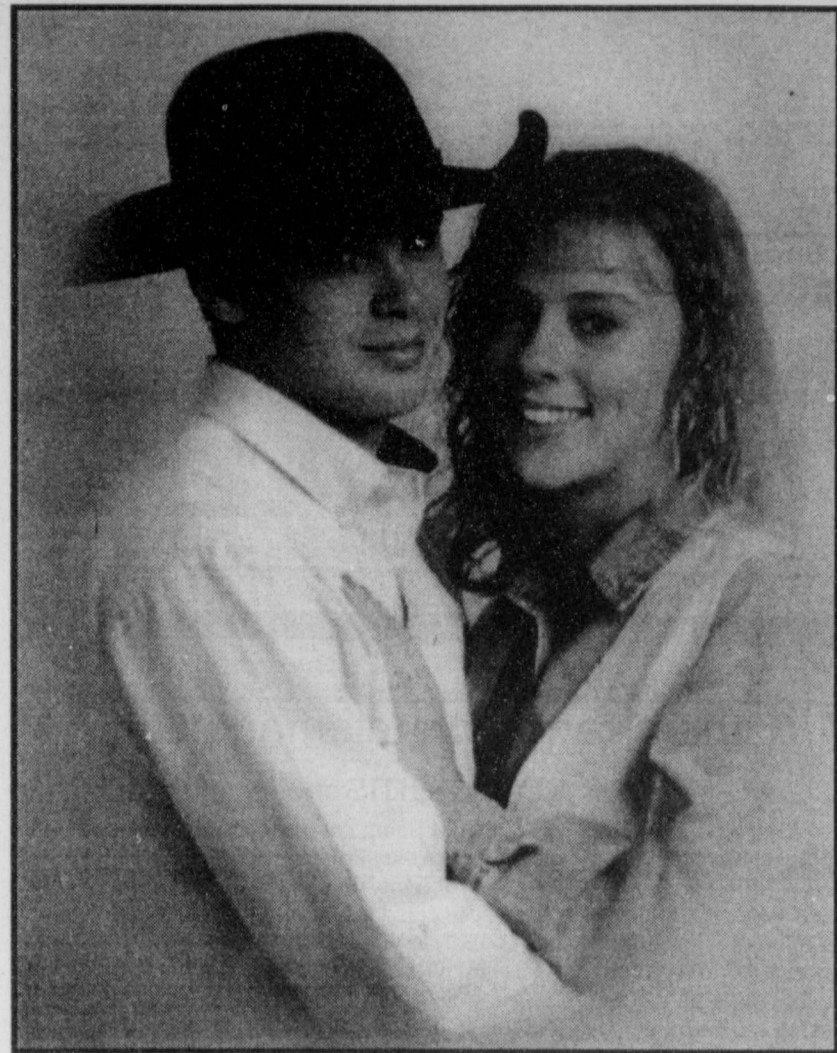

These recipes remind me of how truly innocent little kids are. **Pizza**  
Canadian bacon mushrooms pizza  
Put sauce on it... don't member how much. Get some Canadian bacon, then put it on the pizza and then you do this with a spoon. Well you put Canadian bacon and then you put mushrooms on it and do this (holds imaginary piece to mouth).

**Taco Salad**  
Like get... you get... you make it by getting some meat and you put it on and you get some cheese and then you have some tomatoes on it. Then you roll it up and then you have to eat it and then you got a big tummy cause you ate too much!

**Macaroni and Cheese**

The program will include many examples of the familiar uses of this book.

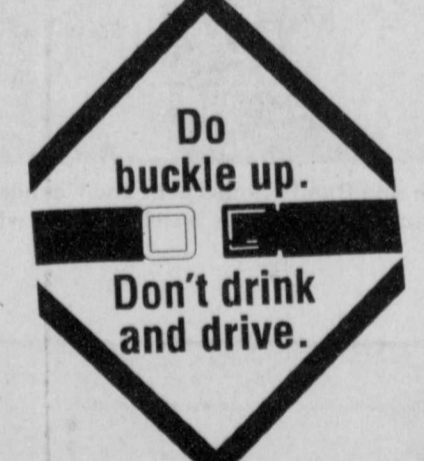

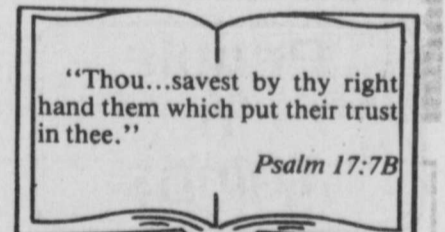
### Elva Heffernan dies July 26

## Prairiland Home Economics Teachers attend conference

Sandra Graves and Rhonda Bangs, members of the Vocational Home Economics Teachers Association of Texas and home economics teachers at Prairiland high school, joined a registration in excess of 1,800 teachers at the 1996 State Professional Development Conference for Home Economics Teachers, July 29-August 1, 1996 at the Hyatt Regency, Dallas/Ft. Worth Airport Complex. The annual conference is planned and coordinated by the Texas Education Agency's Home Economics Education Office Career and Technology Division.

The theme of the 1996 Conference, "Home Economics Education: Visionary Thinking and Teaching," provided the framework for the four day event. Attendees were offered training to enhance their teaching methodology skills and refine their program priorities. "Best Practices in Home Economics Education" offered sessions conducted by teachers sharing successful teaching strategies/resources or planning/management strategies which have proven to be especially successful in their home economics programs.

Workshops were offered preparing educators to successfully navigate a totally new system of funding which will distribute funds more on a basis of a program's instructional and marketing effectiveness than has been the case in the past.

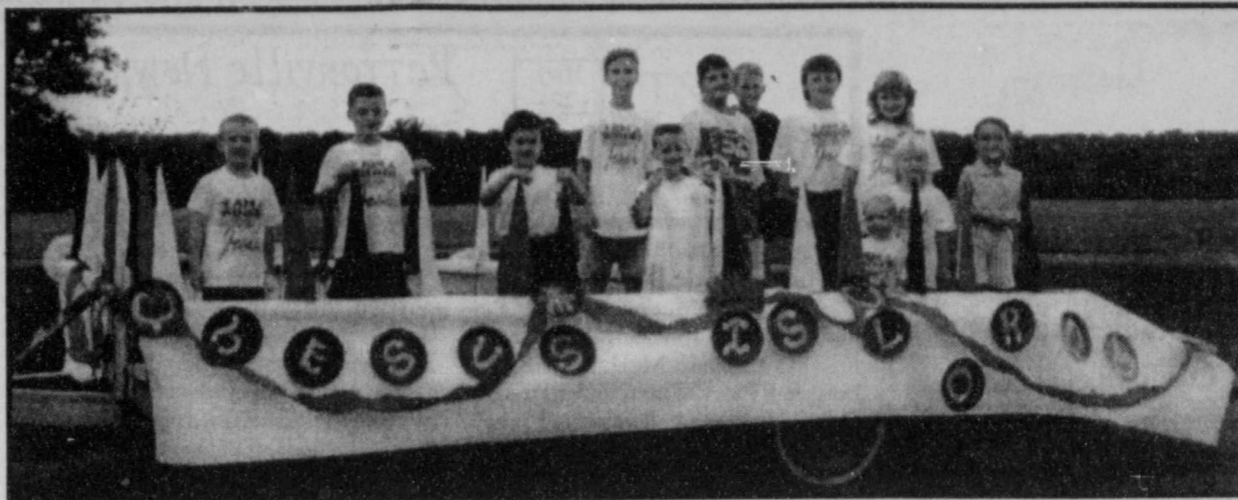
Of special importance this year were the presentations and work sessions to prepare teachers for the implementation of the new curriculum resulting from the revision of the Essential Elements as the State's core curriculum into the Texas Essential

Knowledge and Skills. Concurrent interest sessions addressed a variety of subjects including Tech Prep and School-to-Work Transition, Technology and Applications in Home Economics Education; Career Pathways and Career Majors; and Inclusion of Special Needs Students.

Gay Nell McGinnis, Texas Education Agency's State Director for Home Economics Education said, "This will be the first of a series of conferences addressing the information and resources necessary for teachers to capitalize on the opportunities that are before us. To properly prepare ourselves for implementation of the new curriculum and changes in funding patterns and policies, participation in each of these conferences is critical."

Mrs. Graves and Mrs. Bangs attended the professional association's annual meeting, their awards banquet and an education exhibits show held concurrently with the conference.

1996-97 VHEATAT President Godwin of Wall ISD said "In 1996-97 the home economics teachers in Texas will face many diverse challenges which will be met as opportunities to enhance and strengthen the home economics programs. The home economics teachers constantly strive to improve their teaching methods by attending professional development seminars and by updating their curriculum to meet the needs of their some 250,000 students across the state and prepare them for the changes which are taking place in our global society".

Deport Vol. Fire Dept. members will place an American Flag on display five (5) days each year at a business, residence or other private location which subscribed to the service.

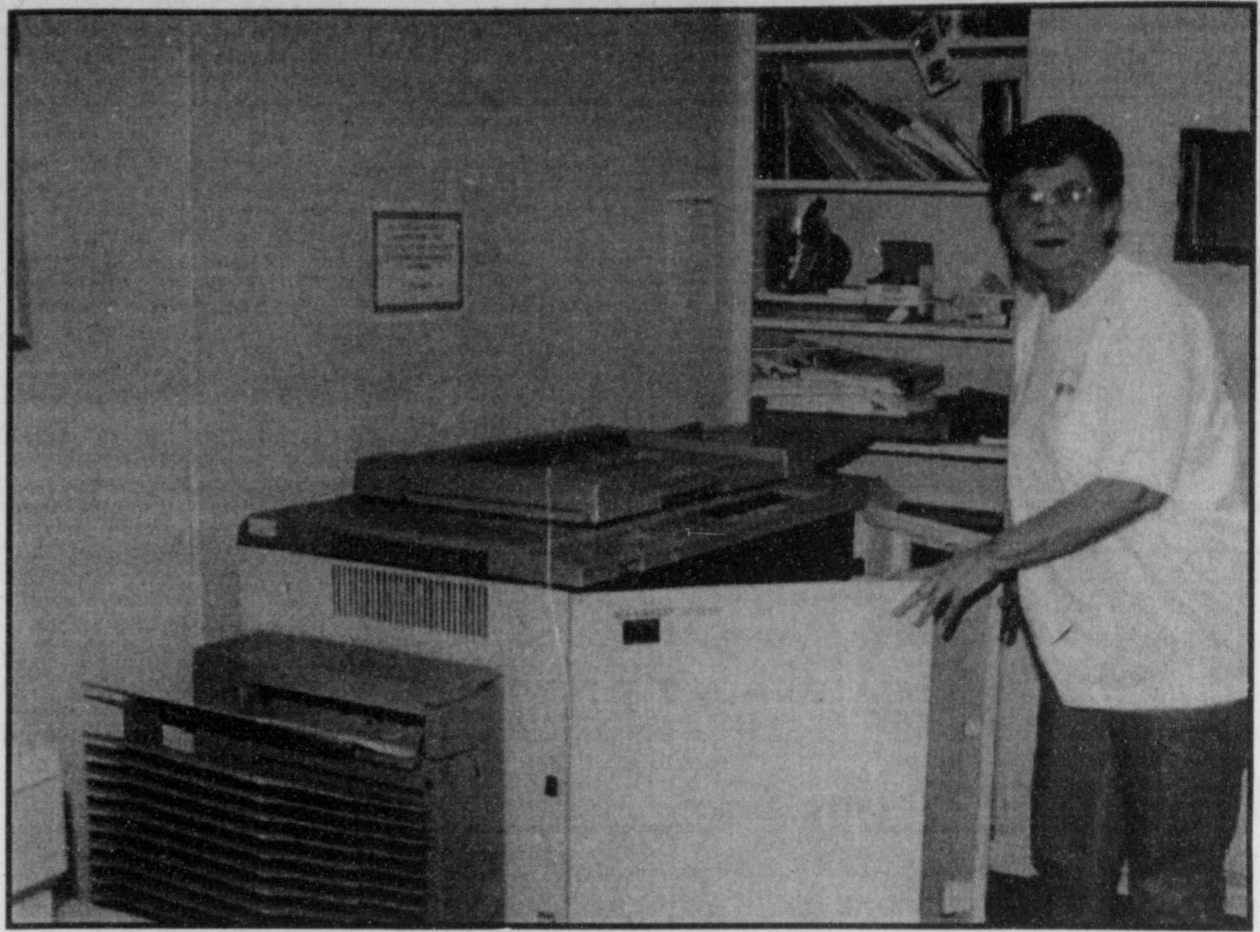
