

Drive for marrow donor planned

Martha Reep, a teacher for the Prairiland ISD is in need of your help. She has leukemia and her only chance for survival is a bone marrow

transplant. After none of Martha's family was found to be a suitable donor, the family turned to the National Marrow Donor Program (NMDP), which operates a Registry of volunteers willing to donate marrow to unrelated patients in need of a transplant. However, a search of donors currently on the Registry has identified no match.

According to Justine Johnson, nurse for the Prairiland ISD, they are organizing a recruitment drive to increase the number of donors on the NMPD Registry and they want eligible volunteers to participate. Anyone between the ages of 18 and 60, in good general health and not excessively overweight, can potentialy become a volunteer donor. Eligible volunteers simply need to sign a consent form and give a small amount of blood.

Everyone tested will be added to the NMDP Registry of volunteer marrow donors that is searched by patients such as Martha. Even if you or the other volunteers donors

added through the recruitment do not match Martha, you may match one of the thousands of other patients waiting to find a miracle match.

To join the Registry, please attend the drive at Prairiland High School on December 6 beginning at 9:00 a.m. and ending at 6:0 p.m. in Pattonville.

The laboratory fee is \$20 for each test. Baylor Hospital will pay for the first 50 tests and funds are being raised to defray the cost of testing all the other. Financial contributions will be accepted at the testing session or checks made out to the National Marrow Donor Program can be sent to Justine Johnson or Dr. L. C. Stout at Prairiland's Marrow Donor Program, Route #1, Box 200, Pattonville, Texas, 75468. Please write Martha's name in the memo area of the check.


Lady Pats place 4th at Saltillo Tourney By Michael Richardson





The earlier a drug problem is detected and faced, the better chance your child has of being helped. Discuss your fears and suspicions calmly and frankly when your child is sober (NEVER confront a child who is under the influence of alcohol or other drugs). Avoid overreacting, screaming, crying and moralizing. But don't be apologetic. Because you love your child, you must be willing to enforce discipline and do whatever it takes to




