But it has been so lovely, and so long this year. I hope you've enjoyed it as much as I have.

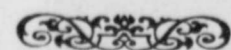
Cunningham Community Center to hold supper & singing

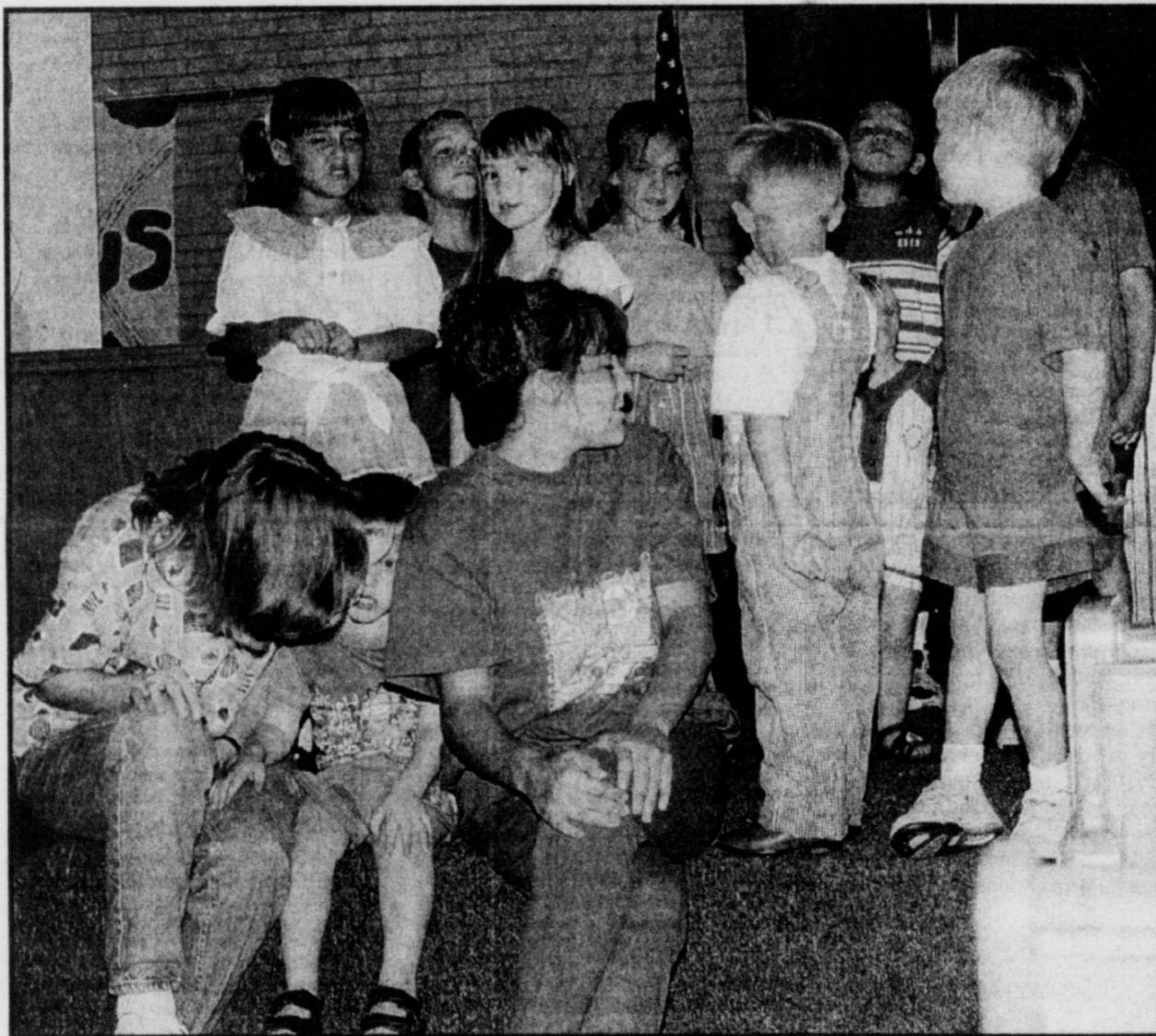
Prairiland Board of Trustees have budget workshop, hire teachers

The Prairiland Board met June 10, and held a budget workshop for 1997 at the first part of the meeting. The board approved a resolution to contract with Region VIII and approved Inter-Local Agreement. The Worker's Compensation Plan with Claims Administrative Services, Inc. was approved, as was the Depository Contract for 1997-98 and 1998-99 from Guaranty Bank-Deport.

The engagement of McClanahan and Holmes to do the school audit for 1996-1997 was okayed and they approved the breakfast and lunch prices for the 1997-98 school year. Full price for lunch is currently \$1, the recommended price is \$1.25. Breakfast is currently at 50¢, the recommended price is 75¢. Reduced price lunch is currently 60¢ with a recommended price of 75¢. Breakfast, reduced is currently 40¢ recommended price is 50¢. Teacher's lunches are \$2.00 currently, recommended price is \$2.25. Breakfast is currently \$1, recommended price is \$1.25.

The board heard a report from Buddy Freeman on AEIS reports and went into executive session. After coming out of executive session the board hired Marsha Madewell and Cindy Winters as teachers on Blossom Campus and assigned Sharon Connot to the Blossom Junior High as English Language teacher. They hired Kathy Stringfellow as teacher at the High School campus and hired P.G. Morrison as a teacher/coach at the high school.

Minutes were read and approved, tax report approved and payment of May bills and the financial statement approved.

Charlene's 7 layer dip
2 cans bean dip
1 8 ounce carton sour cream with 1 package taco seasoning
1 avocado mashed with 1 tsp. lemon juice
1 small can chopped olives
1 cup chopped green onion
1 cup chopped tomatoes
2 cups grated cheese
Layer, chill and serve with chips.

Pat's Tortilla Soup
1 medium tomato, quartered
1 can (14 1/2 ounce) whole peeled tomatoes with liquid
1 small onion quartered
1 garlic clove
2 cans (10 1/2 ounce each) condensed chicken broth
1/2 tsp. chili powder
1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. black pepper
1/4 tsp. ground coriander
1/4 tsp. ground cumin
1 Tbsp. minced fresh cilantro
6 corn tortillas
1/4 cup cooking oil
Sour Cream
Shredded Cheddar or Monterey Jack Cheese
Place tomatoes, onions and garlic in a blender or food processor; blend until smooth. Transfer to a large saucepan. Add the chicken broth and seasonings; bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 3 minutes.
Cut tortillas into 1/4 inch strips; fry in hot oil until crisp and brown. Drain. 1 cup of cooked, cubed chicken can be added (optional)

Batter-Fried Squash Blossoms
Makes 8 servings
Squash blossoms, picked as they are just about to open (2-3 dozen)
1 cup milk
1/2 cup cooking oil

Garlic Bread
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1 (4 ounce) can chopped ripe olives
8 ounces Monterey Jack Cheese grated
6 Tbsp. Margarine, softened
2 to 3 jalapenos, finely chopped
1 green onion, chopped
1 tsp. garlic powder
1 loaf French bread
Combine mayonnaise and margarine. Stir in remaining ingredients. Split French bread in half lengthwise. Spread cheese mixture on both halves. Broil 4 to 5 inches from heat until cheese is melted and lightly browned. Makes 10 to 12 servings.

Apple Dumplings
Pie Dough:
2 cups flour
1 cup crisco
6 to 8 apples, pared and sliced
1/2 cup water
pinch of salt
Cut dough in 6 inch squares. Place apples on each square. Sprinkle apples generously with sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg. Dot with butter. Moisten edges of pie dough. Bring corners together in center, pinch edges together. Place 1 inch apart in ungreased 11 X 7 X 1 1/2 inch baking dish. Make syrup of 1 1/2 cup sugar
1 1/2 cups water
1 stick margarine
Bring to boil. Pour over apple dumplings. Bake at 350 for 45 minutes.
