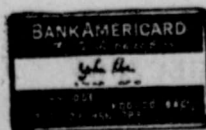

- 1 tablespoon minced onion
- 1 tablespoon chili sauce
- 1 teaspoon chopped parsley
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon prepared mustard
- Dash pepper

Mix together shrimp, mayonnaise, sour cream, tomato juice, onion, chili sauce, parsley, lemon juice, garlic salt, paprika, mustard and pepper. Cover and chill. Serve over tossed salad greens. Makes 1 1/4 cups.

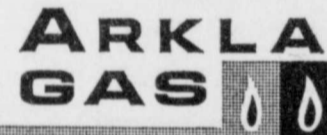
