One of the biggest factors in
rural development in the
United States has been the

isolated locations, and the

occupation of Carl Williams of
Bogata Gas and Appliance

Williams received his dealer's
license in September 1962 to
operate and sell butane, and
has been in the business
since November, 1962. The
original company included
two partners, Jim Robinson
and Jesse Gray, but now
Williams is the sole owner.

The big black and white
truck you see is not the same,
as Williams has two trucks
that are almost exactly alike.
That's why the truck looks

clean, even after a big rain. In
addition to the two trucks,
which adds to the storage
capacity for Bogata Gas and
Appliance, Williams has
18,000 gallons of storage next
to his home at Rosalie.
