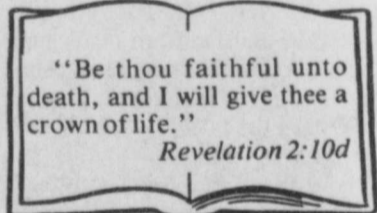

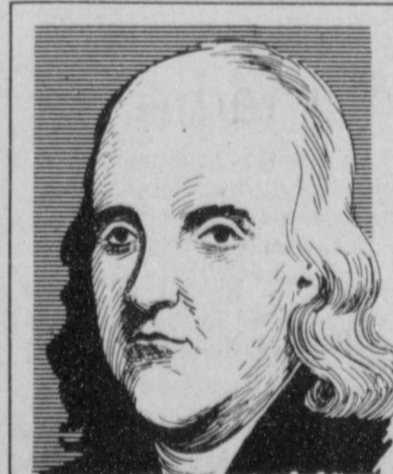

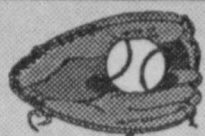

Tiger pitcher Bas Kegans looked sharp allowing but three hits while leaving eight Rebel batters with the bat in their hands on strike-outs.

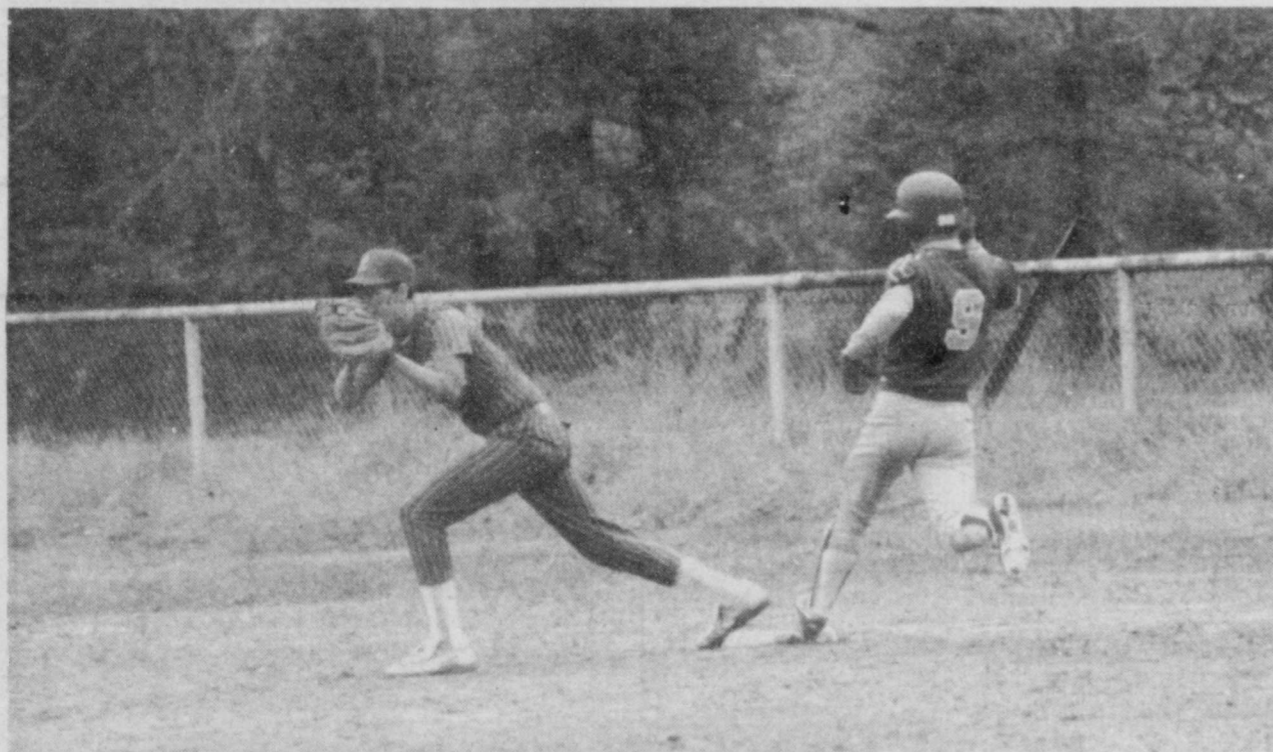
Rebel players made several sharp defensive plays. Kevin House played well as he scooped low throws for outs. Roach threw out a Tiger runner, stealing third base.

The annual Rivercrest Athletic Banquet will be held at Rivercrest High School cafeteria on Tuesday, May 2 at 7 p.m.

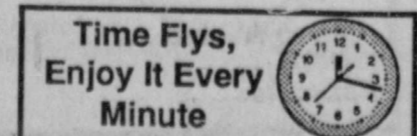
Tickets are \$5.00. They may be purchased by student athletes or coaches or at the banquet. Special awards will be given in the auditorium after the meal.

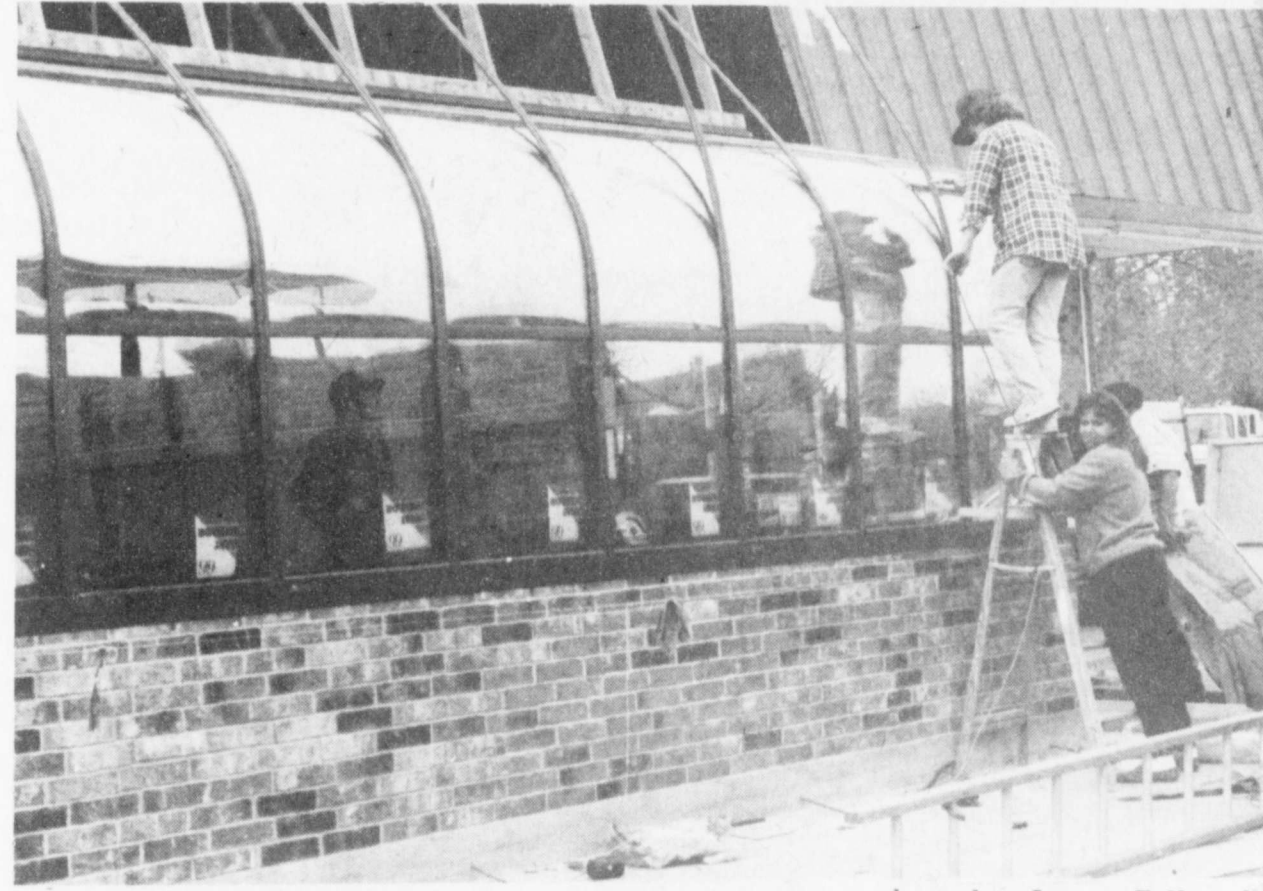
Talco Assembly Of God To Hold Revival
