Indian blanket, celandine, yellow hops, all added the buttery richness yellow provides.


Feathery whites, delicate pinks, purples and blues, soft colors, bright colors, in-between colors all lit the way as we drove.

Women Work Harder

Women work harder than men, at home and at their jobs, according to a new study by two University of California, Santa Barbara sociolo-

Analyzing data from a representative national survey conducted by the University of Michigan, William and Denise Bielby studied 1,515 working men and women and found that women give more time and attention to their jobs than men despite the fact that women also spend more than twice as much time on house-

The Bielbys' study concludes: "For women to work harder than men, despite their greater household responsibilities, they must be able to draw on a reserve of energy that is either not available to the typical male or, more realistically, that men choose not to draw upon.'




