It's all very well for us to talk of our tall manmade structures, our beautiful, glittering cities, or our giant ranches.

But a trip through Texas right now is bound to make anyone appreciate to the fullest the wonders, the glories, the beauty of Texas as a natural state...a scenic treat to the traveller.

The local Texas State Teachers Association will have their banquet on May 8 at 7 p.m. at Bogie's Cafe in Bogata.

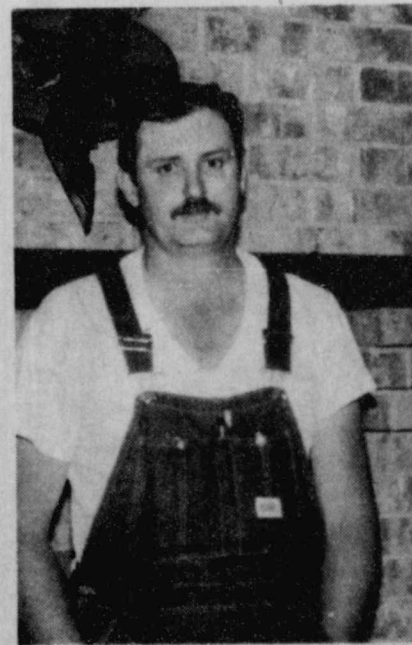

- 3 bay leaves
- 1 green bell pepper, chopped
- 1 med. onion, chopped
- 1 lg. clove garlic, pressed
- 4 cups small, whole Dole Fresh Mushrooms
- 1 cup chopped Bud of California Celery
- 1 cup chopped green onion
- 2 tbsp. white vinegar
- ½ tsp. thyme, crumbled
- ¼ tsp. black pepper
- ¼ tsp. cayenne pepper
- Hot fluffy rice

Cover beans with water. Soak overnight. Cover ham hocks with water. Cook, covered, 1 to 1½ hours until tender. Remove meat from bones. Add meat back to stock along with drained beans and remaining ingredients, except rice. Simmer, covered, 2 hours. Stir 3 to 4 times. Broth should be thickened from beans. Serve over rice.

Cook and stir sausage in 10-inch skillet until light brown; drain. Stir in beans, catsup and pepper. Pour into ungreased 1½-quart casserole or 10x6x1½-inch baking dish. Arrange apple slices on top; sprinkle with brown sugar. Cook uncovered in 400° oven until hot and bubbly, 25 to 30 minutes, 4 or 5 servings.

Women Work Harder

Women work harder than men, at home and at their jobs, according to a new study by two University of California, Santa Barbara sociologists.

Analyzing data from a representative national survey conducted by the University of Michigan, William and Denise Bielby studied 1,515 working men and women and found that women give more time and attention to their jobs than men despite the fact that women also spend more than twice as much time on household tasks.

The Bielbys' study concludes: "For women to work harder than men, despite their greater household responsibilities, they must be able to draw on a reserve of energy that is either not available to the typical male or, more realistically, that men choose not to draw upon."
