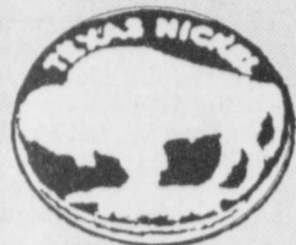


Nichols

Wreck Kills Three, Injures Four

Three people died and one remains in critical condition following a two-vehicle accident last Wednesday, July 5, just outside of Deport.

The call came in at approximately 6:10 p.m. on U.S. Highway 271 South, about a mile northwest of Deport.

According to Texas Highway Patrol official reports, Willie Ray Abbott, age 61, of Rt. 3, Paris, was the driver of a 1986 Ford pickup, which was traveling northwest on Hwy. 271, when Jerry Mike Woods, age 32, of Deport, the driver of a 1977 Datsun car, which was traveling southeast on Hwy. 271, attempted a left-hand turn onto the Highland Cemetery Road.

Abbott's truck was unable to avoid the automobile. The pickup struck the car, and went airborne with a

portion of the right front quarter panel of the Datsun imbedded in the front grill of the pickup. The pickup then swung around and flipped, coming to rest on its top.

Abbott was killed, and his three passengers, Melvin Abbott, age 35, Larry Michael Smith, 54, and Eddie Darrell Archer, age 33, were injured. All three passengers were from Paris.

The Datsun then swung left and came to rest on the unpaved portion of the shoulder, about 68 feet from the point of impact.

Killed were Jerry Mike Woods, the driver, and a passenger, James Dewayne Seat, age 34, both of Deport. Critically injured was Sarah Avalos Gutierrez of Los Angeles, CA. Also killed were two dogs riding in the Woods vehicle.

Gutierrez had to be cut from the Datsun by the Reno Rescue Squad, using the jaws of life apparatus. She was taken to St. Joseph's Hospital in Paris, and later that evening was transferred by Careflight helicopter to Wadley Regional Medical Center in Texarkana, where she was still listed in critical condition, but alive, on Tuesday, July 11.

Deport Volunteer Firemen assisted at the scene and the Reno Rescue Squad was on hand quickly to administer help.

All three bodies were taken to Grant Funeral Home and the accident is currently under investigation by authorities.

The First Baptist Church of Talco will have a special guest in the evening worship service on Sunday, July 16.

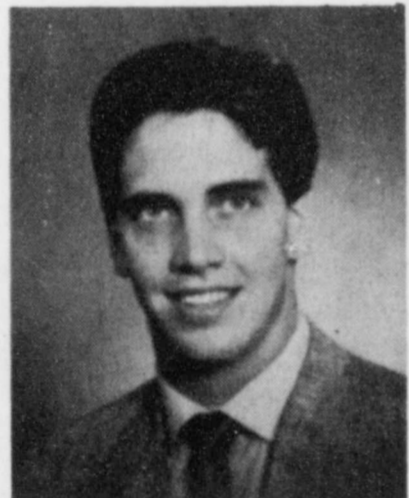
Chuck Morrill will present a concert of gospel music in the 6 o'clock service. The program will include both old and new favorites and many of his original compositions.

Emergency Farm Loan Applications Being Accepted

Applications for Emergency farm loans for losses caused by tornadoes, flooding and severe storms which began May 4, 1989 are being accepted at the Farmers Home Administration office in Clarksville, Frank B. Stroud said today.

Red River County is one of 29 in Texas recently named by Secretary of Agriculture Richard E. Lyng as eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from the tornadoes, flooding and severe storms.

Stroud said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 80% of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue in business or \$500,000, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest rate is 4.5%.

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30% loss of production to be eligible for an FmHA Emergency Loan, Stroud said. Farmers

participating in the PIK or Federal Crop Insurance programs will have to figure in proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

"Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be accepted until February 15, 1990, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing and possibly over into the new farming season," Stroud said.

FmHA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and rely on farming for a substantial part of their living. Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who are U.S. citizens and to farming partnerships, corporations or cooperatives in which U.S. citizens hold a majority interest.

The FmHA office in Clarksville is open from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Meeting Set For Mayors, Council Members

State Senator Bill Ratliff, Mt. Pleasant, announced recently that he is hosting an informative meeting for all mayors, city councilpersons and city managers on Friday, July 14 in Mt. Pleasant at the Titus County Civic Center.

"I am pleased to be able to bring these city leaders together to discuss recently passed legislation which directly affects the cities they represent," Ratliff said.

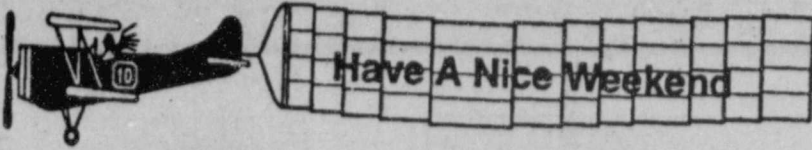

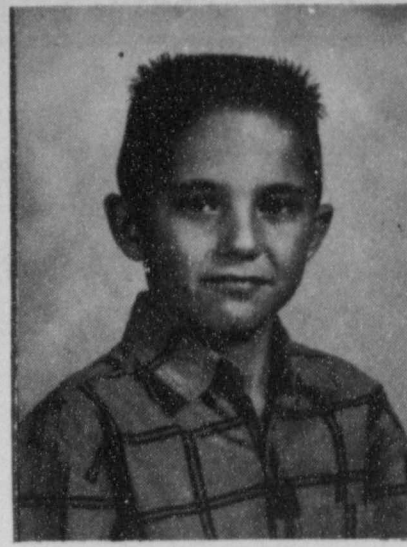
