## Fires Sweep Through Area High Winds, Dry Grass Speed Spread

The entire area has been plagued by grass fires that engulfed hay and some barns over the past week, and arson figured in at least one of them.

Beginning with a huge grass fire Tuesday, of last week at Johtown, numerous smaller fires occurred. On Wednesday a grass fire just south of Red Oak Cemetery required units from all over to keep from destroying three residences and several barns. It did burn over 125 large round bales of hay. In the early hours of Thursday, November 9 the Deport Fire Department was called to a fire in which three separate stacks of large round hay bales, on opposite sides of the road and widely separated, were on fire. Evidence there points to a deliberate ignition.

Later that same morning fire units

were called to Cunningham, where the Musgrove Flying M ranch grass-land was burning.

Right after noon a big fire at Clardy called out units from all over. Before volunteer firemen could even return home calls came in to go to Detroit, where a huge grass fire required units from Bogata, Deport, Reno, Blossom, Detroit Cunningham, Talco, Faught, Paris, Pine Creek and virtually every other fire department in the area. Again before units could return home the call came in to go to a fire at Four Duce Ranch between Detroit and Woodland. This fire burned down barns full of hay and again required almost every unit possible before being brought under control.

During that time fires at Rock Ford and other areas of the countries of a smaller nature were also called in, often with almost no fire units to combat them.

On Saturday a recurring fire on Flying M was extinguished. More grass fires at Deport, Blossom, Bogata and Talco were reported, with the calls actually being too numerous to keep an accurate report on.

At the current time winds are still brisk, and the extremely dry conditions that have contributed to the fire danger have not been alleviated.

Everyone is urged by all volunteer fire departments to not burn anything.

## Grief Stricken Widow Still Manages To Render Aid

Every once in a while we read or hear about courageous individuals who perform exploits which go beyond the limitations of human endurance. These individuals are able to put all thought for themselves aside and rise to meet the demands of a crisis.

One of these rare individuals was on hand in Bogata to administer aid to a wreck victim in the early hours of Thursday, November 9.

An unidentified male was traveling south on Highway 271 when the Chevrolet pickup he was driving veered from the road, smashing head-on into a culvert. A truck driver passing by saw the wreck and ran to a house nearby to call for an ambulance.

Gwen White, a Licensed Vocational

Nurse, was at that house. Only a few hours before, she had attended the funeral for her husband, Morris White. He had died after several months of being bedfast from terminal cancer. During those months, Gwen had taken almost complete care of her husband.

As the truck driver reported the seriousness of the victim, Gwen recalls that she felt this was one time she would be unable to help. However, by the time she had finished speaking to Titus County Memorial Emergency Unit, the call of her vocation was pulling her to the scene.

Exhausted from many nights of lost sleep and the stress of her husband's death, still, she ran to the aid of the victim who needed triaged emergency help, taking along her sister-in-law,

Pam Sasser, also an LVN, and her daughter, Kim Stone.

Upon arriving at the scene, they found paramedic, Randy Carroll, from the Talco First Responders. Another paramedic from the Responders, Jim Carroll, arrived shortly after. They all worked together to free the victim from the wrecked vehicle, and then administered necessary aid. The victim was airlifted to St. Michael's Hospital in Texarkana and last report, the victim was in critical but stable condition.

Although the circumstances surrounding Gwen White offered her a valid reason for stepping aside that night, she ignored those circumstances and rendered life-saving service to a needy individual.

Rehearsal was held for the wedding party immediately following the meal.

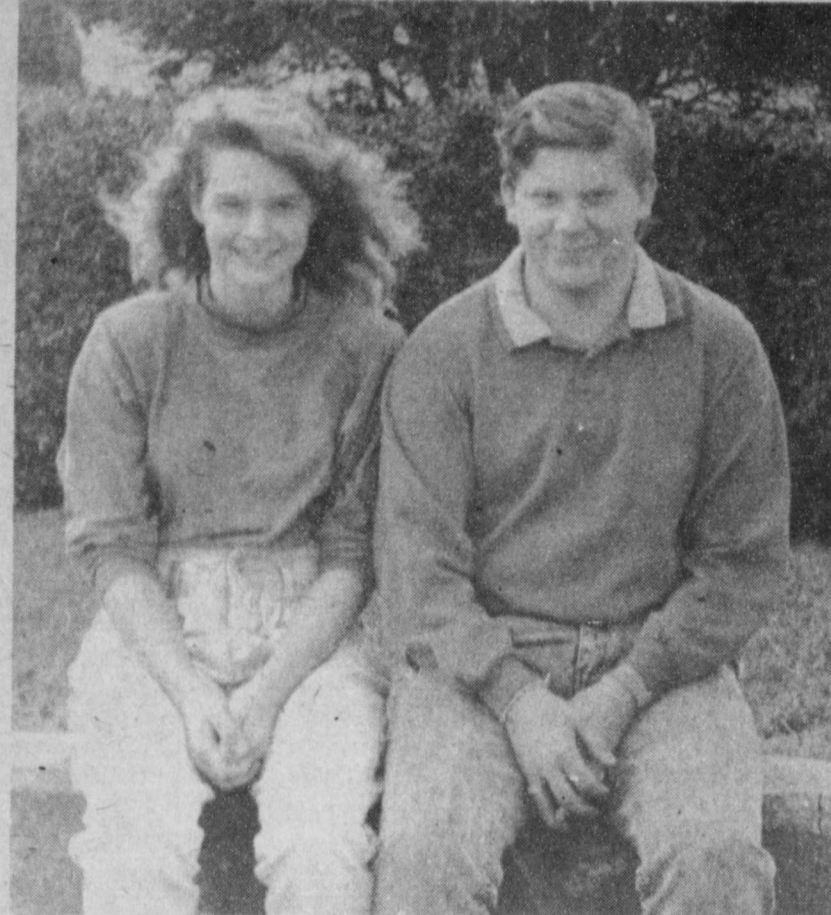

# Rebels Glow Despite 68-21 Loss

Cooper: Every cloud has a silver lining. So the Rivercrest Rebels can look on the bright side in the face of a 68-21 season ending loss to the powerful Cooper Bulldogs, who proved they are worthy of their fourth place ranking in Class 2A gridiron competition. Consider these rays of hope for the Rebels, 1) the Rebels will never have to face the state's premier running back Bam Morris again. Morris scored six first half touchdowns and rushed for 218 yards as he put a lock on the state's rushing title, with almost 2,400 yards, 2) the Rebels did something against Cooper that few other opponents have accomplished; they scored three touchdowns and rushed for nearly 300 yards, 3) for the first time in at least five years, the Rebels can boast of a 1,000 yard club member. Senior tailback Jeremy Abshire surpassed the coveted mark on his final offensive play as a Rebel, as he ran for 20 yards and a touchdown with only 1:23 to play. That run gave Abshire a

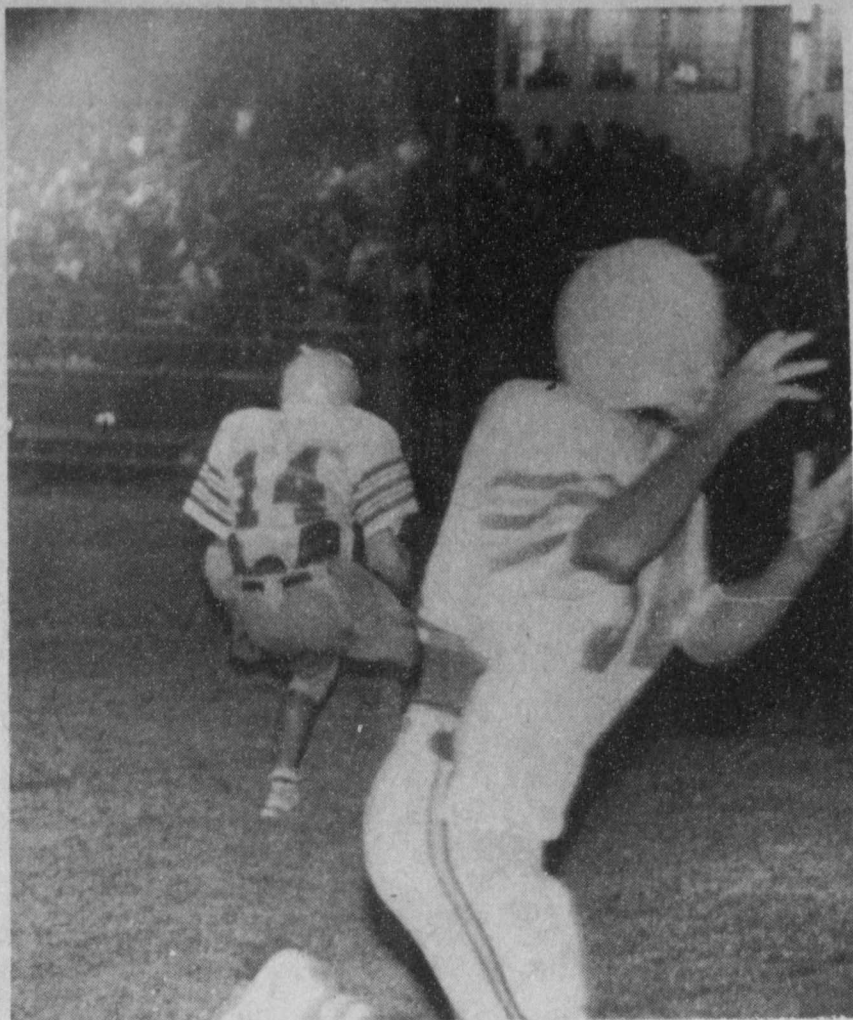
total of 1,005 yards for the season on 122 carries. The outstanding breakaway runner, who emerged into full bloom midway in the season, also led the Rebels scoring with eight touchdowns, 4) the Rebels provided plenty of excitement for the fans during the season. One-half of the Rebel touchdowns came on plays of 50 yards or more. The offense averaged 321 yards per game, with 243 of that coming on the ground. Finally, we must remember that this is high school football, not college or professional play. It is designed to be a learning experience for the participants, a time of character development, and a training field for life. Winning should not be the primary factor, for often more is learned in a loss than in a victory.

The Rebel coaching staff is to be commended for their example, and their hard work in teaching these principles of life to the Rebel squad.

## Rivercrest Hoop Squads Ranked Among State's Elite

A tradition of quality basketball crowns the program of Rivercrest High School. The 89-90 editions are expected to continue to add lustre to the diadem as they embark next week on a quest for a state championship.

Many knowledgeable sources believe that the Joliet hoopsters will be contenders for that prize. Texas Basketball Magazine ranks the Rebelettes in the 19th slot in Class 2A play, while the Rebels are rated at number 20 in the pre-season poll. Under the tutelage of Wake Wood, who is starting his 23rd year as a varsity mentor, but is assuming his first full season as a girls' head coach, the Rebels and Rebelettes will employ the pressing, defense and fast-break offense which has netted Coach Wood with more than 400 victories. Wood has an excellent nucleus on which to form a high calibre squad, even though the competition will be stiff.

"District 17AA basketball is reputed to be the strongest Class 2A league in the state," commented Wood in a recent interview. "For example, every girls' team has played at either the regional or state competition in the past." The Rebelettes have won two state championships and seven regional trophies. A very positive minded Wood gave the following evaluation of this year's basketball offerings.

The Rebelettes: "The team should be very competitive, opening on November 14 against Class 4A Paris High School, a team that lost to eventual state champ Levelland by one point last year.

The squad returns ten lettermen from last year, and is expected to be two deep in each position. Although Wood expects to platoon a great deal, possible starters include three seniors. 57" Tonya Hawkins will move from point guard to forward, but her hustle will mark her as the floor leader. Tonya has a super attitude and will be recruited to play guard in college. The post positions will be handled by 58" Kristie Stansell and 60" Amy Gladden, both three year starters. "Stansell is very quick around the bucket and Amy, who averaged 13

points per game last year could be one of the best players in the state," said Woods.

Starting at point guard will be junior Jerilyn Russell, who will be backed up by senior D'Ann Stephenson. The other forward slot will be manned by sophomore Krista Weatherall, who has a highly accurate outside shot. Back-up forwards will be senior Kristie Brooks, an excellent defender, and junior Kristie Eudy. Rounding out the varsity unit, and expected to see a lot of action are senior Shane Webb and junior Melanie White at forward and Junior Katy Ross and sophomore Tiffany Parish.

"All 12 can play varsity basketball and do a good job," commented Wood of the consistency of his Lady Rebels. "Seven or eight of the girls are capable of scoring, we have several good perimeter shooters, and our post players have proven they are not afraid to shoot the ball."

"The girls have worked exceptionally hard on defense; we have spent more time in practice on that phase of the game, since we plan to employ a pressing defense all the time, whether ahead or behind. I believe this is the most improved area of the game," said Wood when asked about strengths and weaknesses.

"I believe the Rebelettes will become a real fine basketball squad; they are a hard-working group of girls, who are learning to discipline themselves to the program. feel that they beat the majority of the teams in Texas."

The Rebelettes open at home on November 24 against arch rival Prairiland, although they travel to Paris, Winnsboro and their 271 neighbors prior to Thanksgiving.

The Rebels have the potential to be an outstanding basketball team, according to the evaluation of Wood. Although the team returns only two starters from last year, a wealth of talent will come from the junior class. The key to the Rebel success may well be the play of senior 67" post Jason Pogue, who has become much more aggressive in his style, and has the ability to dominate inside play. Jason is an excellent shot blocker,

and could be one of the best post-players in east Texas.

The other returning starter is 5'10" senior Jeremy Abshier, who will report to the team along with other footballers at the end of the season. "Jeremy is a great athlete, and a natural team leader," said Wood. Abshier will move to forward due to the plethora of talent in the point guard position. Senior Donald Combs has returned after a year's absence, and junior Galen Logan, an excellent outside shooter, saw much action there last year. In addition, sophomore David Stringer has looked good in early season practice and is expected to suit up with the varsity. Other starters are expected to be Kevin House, a junior, who will see play at the other post slot, but will be moved at times to forward because of his outside shooting and court awareness. "We will probably platoon a great deal, using House and juniors Ronald Simmons and Shane Beers, who perhaps is the best overall player, in the high-low post or double low post offense," said Wood. Senio Jason Lankford, whom Wood called the most improved player on the squad will move from post to forward. Rounding out the 10 to 12 man varsity unit will be senior Marc Teel, a transfer from St. Joe, who played varsity ball there.

The Rebels have missed the District play-offs by a single game the last three seasons, but are looking to be strong contenders for the title this year. "The winner of District 17AA play must be capable of winning the state championship," quipped Wood, referring to the fact that although his Rebel squad is rated 20th in the state, two district teams are ranked higher: Cooper at number six and Chisum at number 15. The Rebels will have a tough pre-district schedule, including games with Paris High, Mt. Pleasant on November 28, Hughes Springs, an area play-off team last year, and Clarksville, who advanced to the finals in 3A play a year ago. The Rebels open November 17 at Winnsboro, and then face Prairiland on an away and home exchange November 21 and 24.

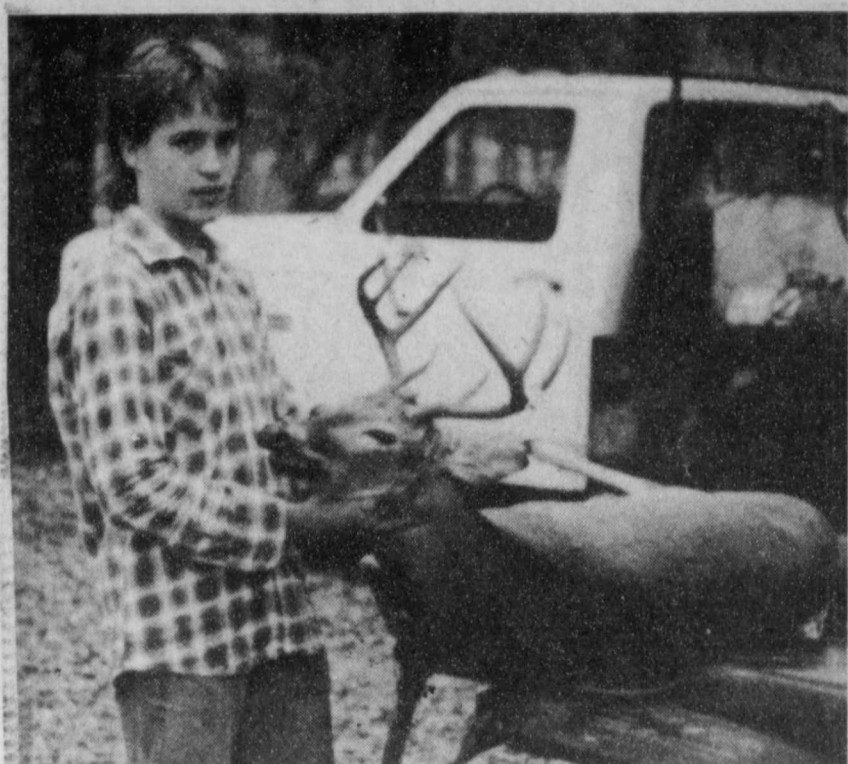

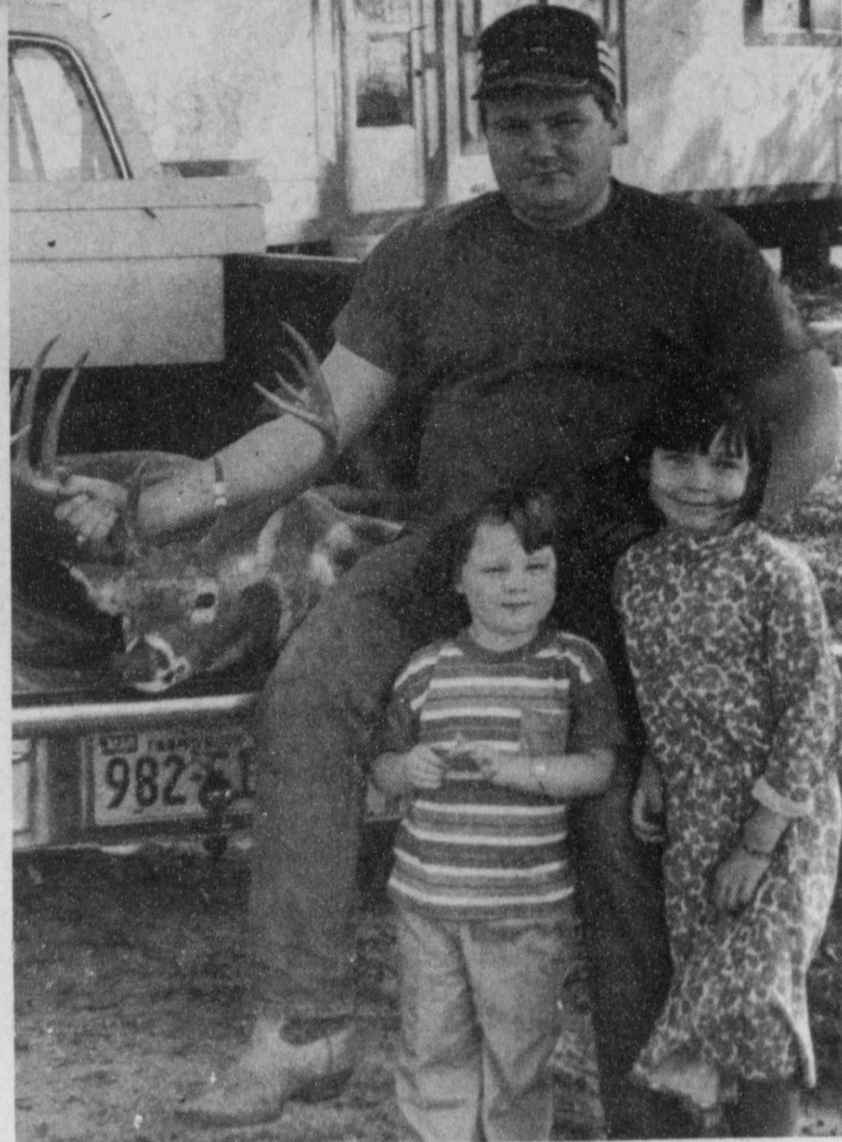

MICHAEL DODD killed this 30-point buck on November 5 at the Dodd farm with a 30-30. Michael is the son of Jackie Dodd.

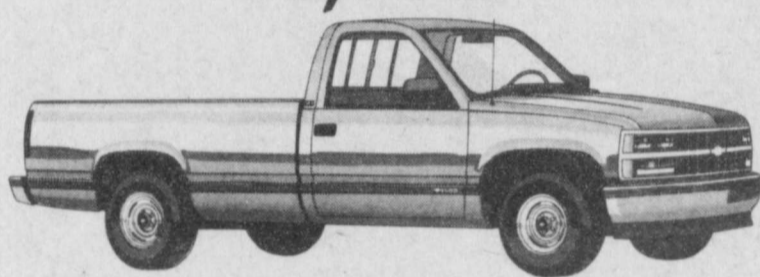

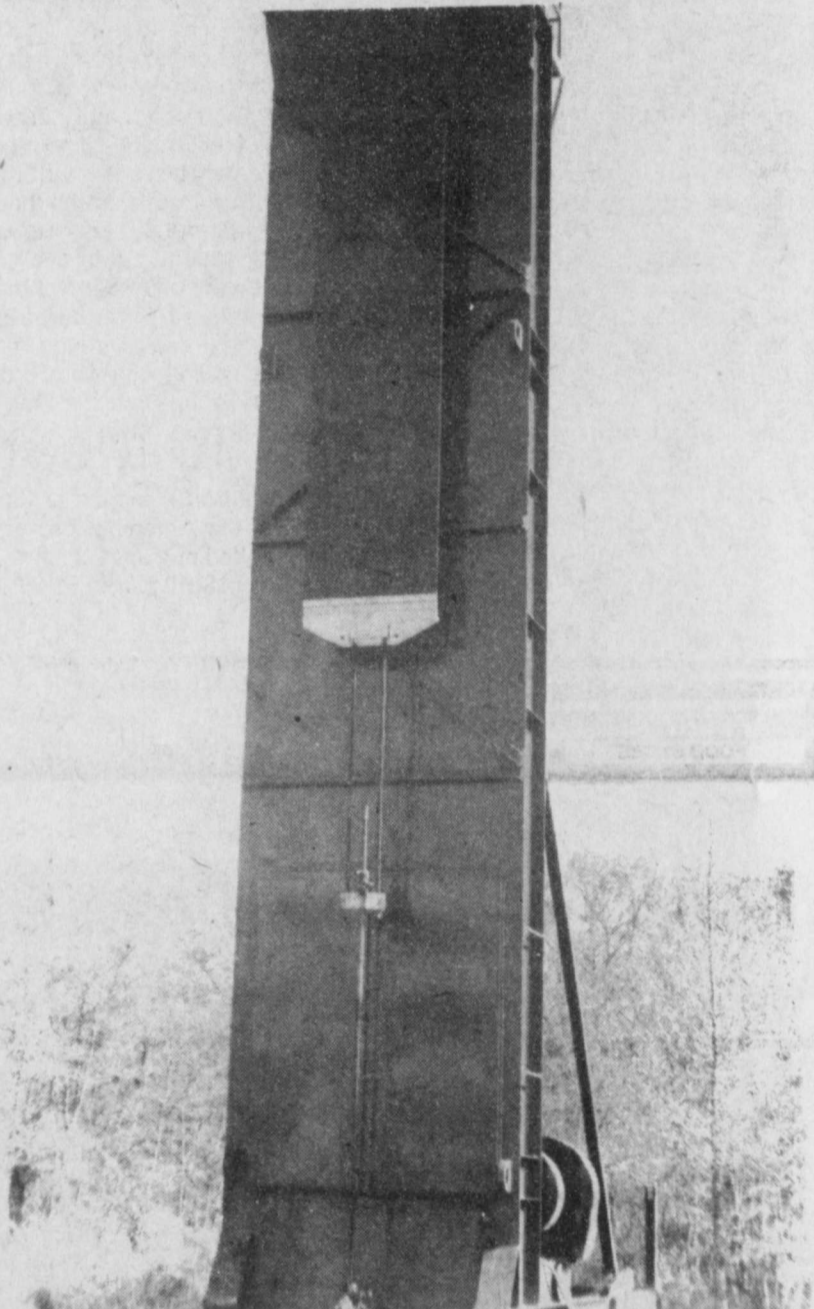

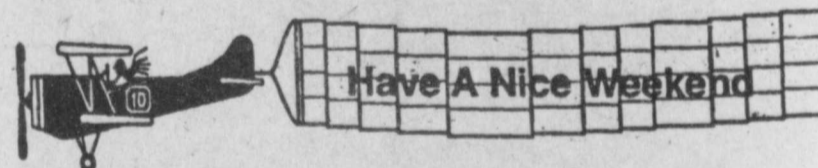

As a published author, she has three books to her credit. They are "Glimpse of Glory", published in 1969, "On The Wings of Joy" published in 1979, and "For the Love of Kids" published in 1985. The latter is a special book about Special Education Children. She says her favorite subjects are God and nature and her favorite book is her first, "Glimpse of Glory". 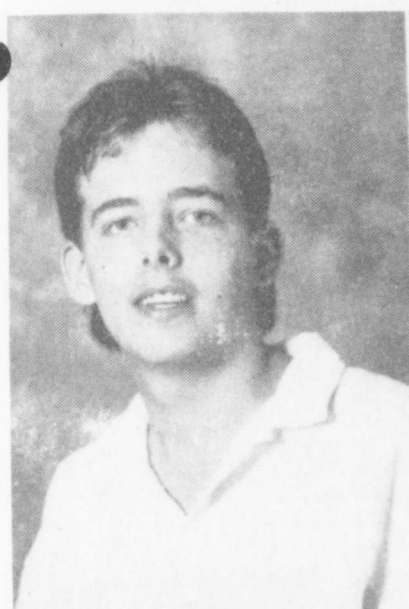


