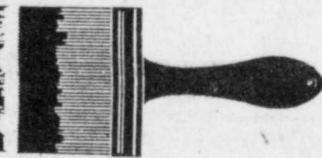

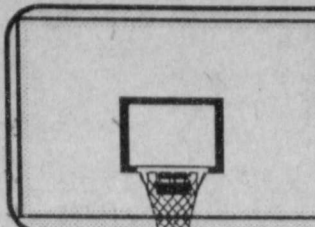

Rebels/Rebelettes Split Games With Prairiland

On almost any night, save Wednesday or Sunday, the basketball enthusiast can find hardwood action. Varsity, Junior Varsity and "B" teams are each playing a full slate of contests in both girls and boys hoops. Following is a synopsis of early season games.

The Rivercrest Rebelettes currently stand at 2-2 as they get ready to begin district play against Como-Pickton next Tuesday, December 5. After droppin the season premier to a tough Paris High School team, the Rebelettes rebounded to defeat Class 3-A Winnsboro. The Rebelettes split a duet of games with Prairiland last week, losing on the road and winning in their home opener.

The Rebelettes lost their shooting touch in a 45-33 loss to the Lady Patriots. The game was decided in the fourth quarter as Rebelette shooters hit no field goals and scored a total of three points in the eight minute stanza.

The Rebelettes also shot poorly from the free throw line, sinking only 11 of 30 attempts. Although no Rebelette had double figures, senior Tonya Hawkins led with eight points, while Krista Weatherall was close with seven and Kristie Stansell added six more. Star Ruckman led the Lady Patriots with 16 points, closely followed by Jan Scudder's 14. These girls were deadly from the outside.

The Rebelettes' resilience was shown three days later as they played the ungracious hostesses, trouncing the Lady Patriots, who were hobbled by injuries to a pair of starters, 59-29. The Rebelettes worked the inside game well, resulting in three post players having good scoring nights.

Senior Amy Gladden led all scorers with 19 points, while impressive sophomore Tiffany Parish added 13 more. Junior Katy Ross hit for seven points in limited play. The game became a runaway in the second half, as the Rebelettes scored the Lady Patriots 20-2 in the third period. Scudder and Ruckman had six points apiece for their team.

The Rebels are undefeated after three games. In an opening 68-56 win over Winnsboro, three Rebel seniors

hit double figures: Jason Pogue led with 19 points, while fellow senior Jeremy Abshier had 18, and Donald Combs, returning to roundball after a year off, hit for 16 points. The Rebels proceeded to sweep a pair of games from the Prairiland Patriots the week of Thanksgiving. Abshier had 21 and Pogue had 16 in a 50-40 win.

Rivercrest built a 10-point lead midway in the final period, but saw the determined Patriots cut that margin to a single bucket with 3:00 minutes left to play. The Rebels turned it on to outscore the Patriots 12-4 in the final 2:37 to secure the victory.

Although the final score indicates otherwise, the second meeting between the two teams was closer.

Ahead by only three points at the end of three quarters, the Rebels used a 12-point fourth quarter outburst by Abshier to pull away to a 65-49 win.

Abshier ended with 25 points in the contest; Pogue had 15 points and junior Kevin House contributed nine more. These three starters are complemented by Combs and Galen Logan, while senior Jason Lankford has come from the bench to assist at forward and junior Ronald Simmons has spelled House and Pogue at post, although coach Wake Wood experimented by inserting all three during the game. Balanced scoring from Prairiland performers saw Brandon Oates and Randy Minter with 10 points, while Randy Barber was close with nine.

- 2 eggs
- 3 cups chopped cooked turkey or chicken
- 1/4 cup mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup A.I. Poultry Sauce
- 1 (8-ounce) can pineapple tidbits in own juice, drained
- 1/3 cup chopped green pepper
- 2 tablespoons chopped onion
- Lettuce leaves

In medium saucepan, over high heat, heat water, margarine and salt to boil. Remove from heat; add flour all at once. Beat vigorously until mixture leaves side of pan and forms a

smooth ball. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition; cool slightly. Spread batter evenly over bottom and side of greased 9-inch pie plate. Bake at 375°F for 40 to 45 minutes or until puffed and browned. Cool in plate on wire rack.

In medium bowl, combine turkey or chicken, mayonnaise, poultry sauce, pineapple, pepper and onion. Chill until serving time.

To serve, line prepared puff with lettuce; spoon in turkey salad. Cut into wedges.

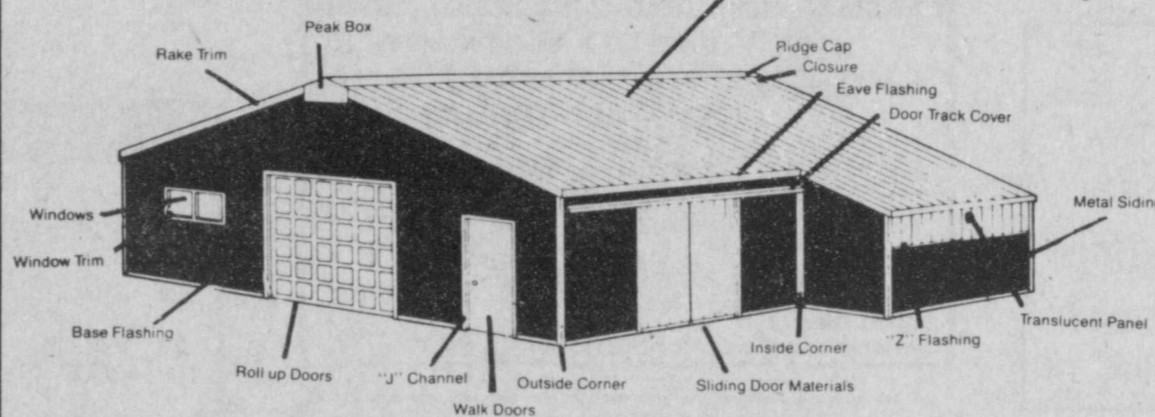

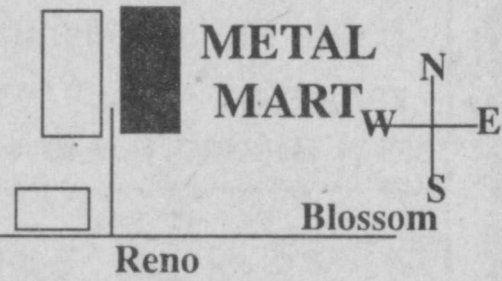

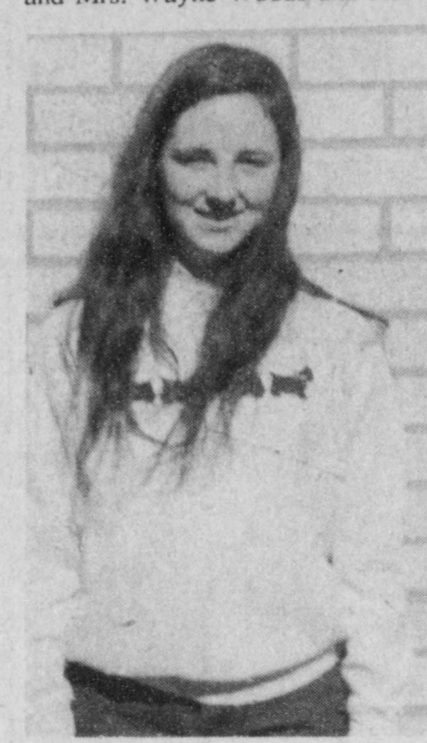
