The Talco Brownie Girl Scout Troop 197 met Monday, December 4 at the Calvary Baptist Church for an investiture and rededication service.

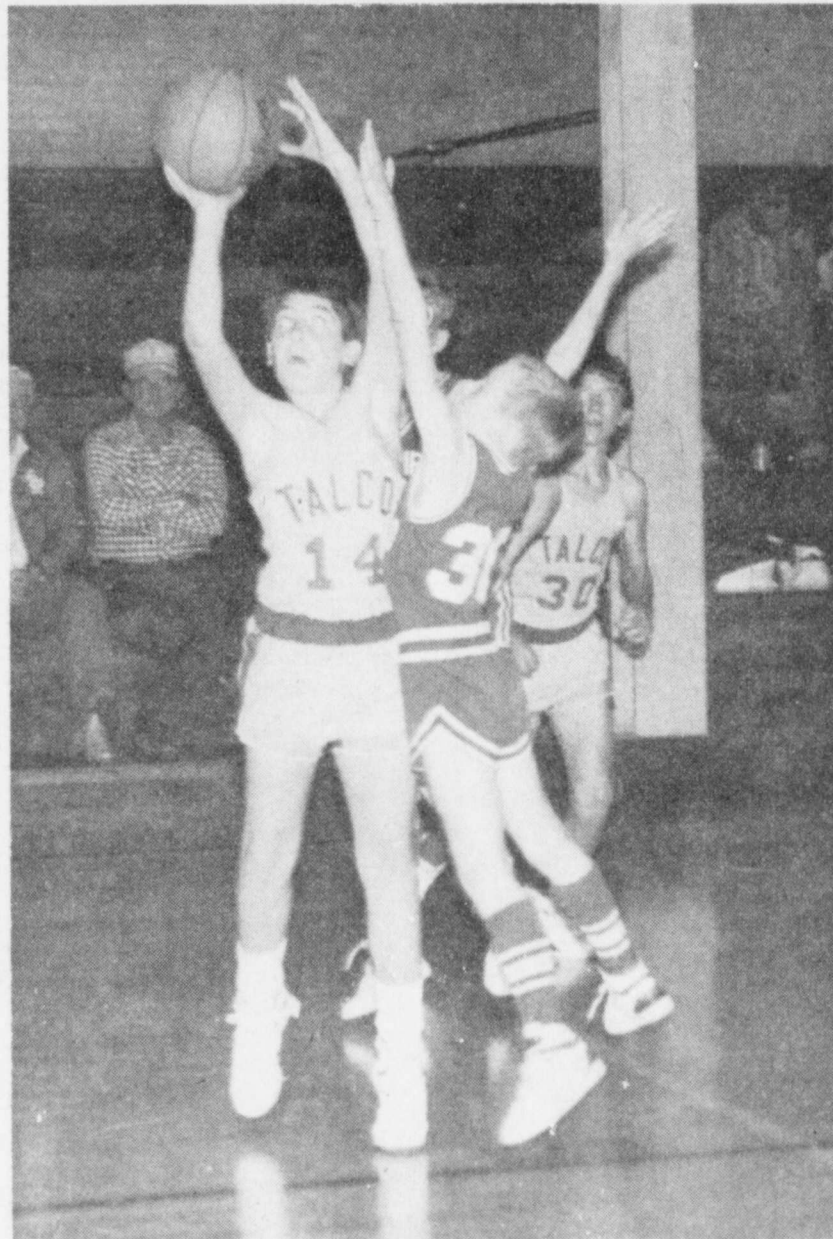
Following the welcome and opening prayer, the flag ceremony was presented, followed by the Girl Scout Promise.

In the investiture ceremony, Missy Carroll, Shelly Hollis, Laci Taylor,

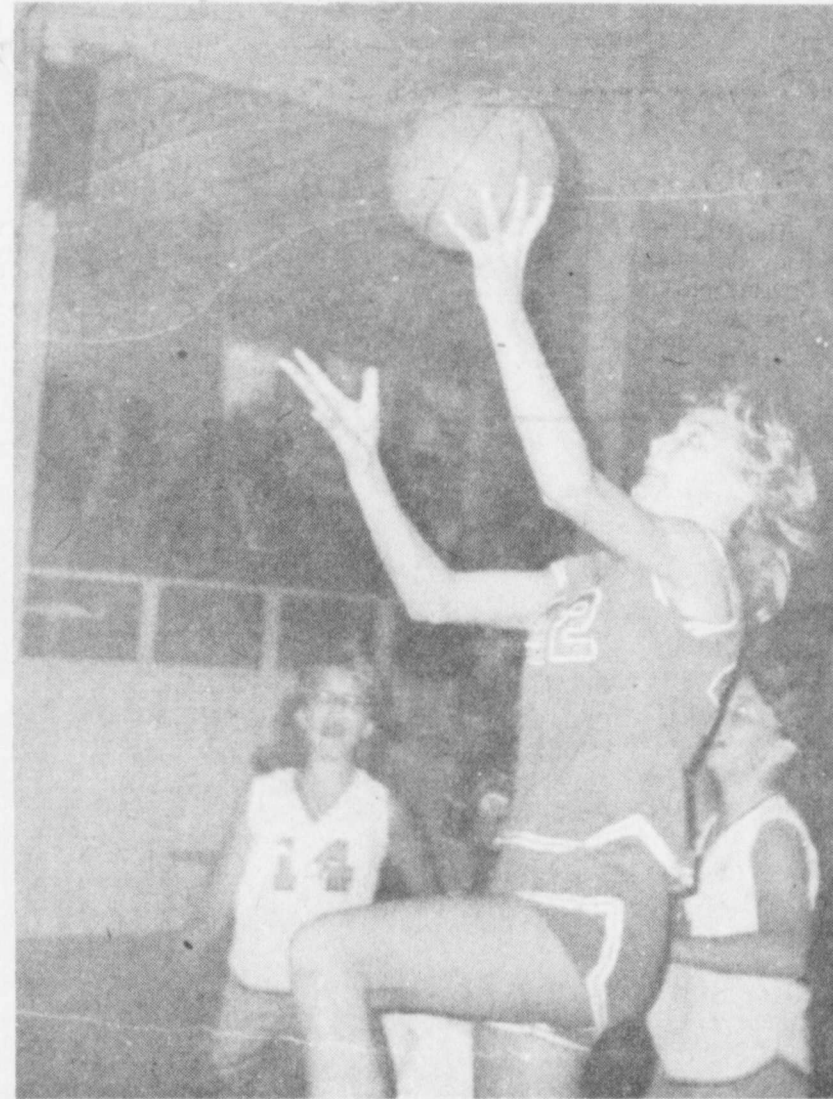
Laura Cochran, Erin Stansell, Jessica Forsyth and Bre'Ann Stroud were welcomed into Girl Scouting for the first time.

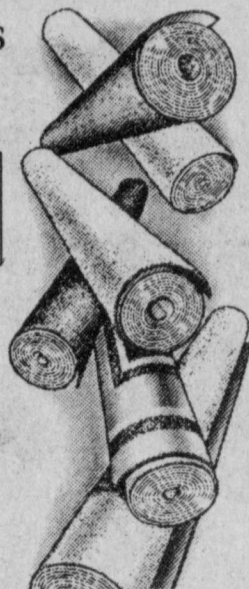

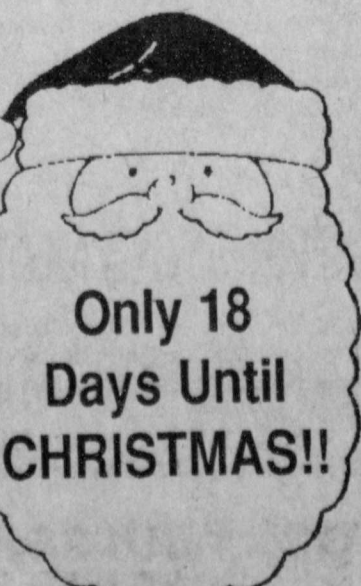

Rebs Take First Place Trophies In Tournament Play

A week of victories for the Rivercrest Rebels and Rebelettes brought their season's records to 7-0 and 6-2 respectively.

Action for the week began with savory wins over the Mt. Pleasant Tigers and Lady Tigers. The Rebels coked out a 69-67 win, while the Rebelettes prevailed by a score of 45-3.

The Rivercrest Invitational Tournament resulted in a pair of first place trophies for the host teams, as well as a consolation trophy for the Rebelette junior varsity squad.

The Rebelettes gained a berth in the finals against Mt. Vernon's Lady Purple Tigers by virtue of easy wins over the Tiger JV unit on Thursday and the Clarksville Lady Tigers 76-35 on Friday night. These games allowed all of the Rebelettes to see significant playing time, as Coach Wake Wood employed various combinations. Krista Weatherall was high scorer in the initial win with 16 points, while Kristie Stansell and Amy Gladden hit for 17 each in the rout of Clarksville. Good defense by Kristi Brooks and D'Ann Stephenson assisted the Rebelette cause, while hustle by Jerilyn Russell and Tonya Hawkins caused numerous Tiger miscues.

The championship game against Mt. Vernon saw the Rebelettes take advantage of a poor shooting night by their opponents to earn a 48-41 win.

The Rebelettes double-low post offense allowed Stansell to be open repeatedly for shots near the paint, resulting in a 16-point performance. Tiffany Parish, a talented sophomore post player, garnered 13 points and numerous rebounds in the effort. The Lady Tigers mounted a comeback attempt in the final quarter, as Yolanda Linwood hit nine of her 15 points in the period to cut the Rebelette lead to seven points midway in the period. Tiger teammate Elaine Robinson matched that total in a losing cause.

Detroit earned third place with a decisive win over Clarksville, 52-43.

Clarksville managed only two first quarter points, which allowed Detroit's Lady Eagles to post a 15-2

lead. Although Clarksville, behind Chas Dillard's 18 points, outscored Detroit 18-11 in the finale, it was not enough. Twana Cary led the Lady Eagles with 21 points.

The Rivercrest Junior Varsity girls won consolation honors with a convincing win over Mt. Vernon's younger team, 42-28. Kristi Eudy had 12 points in the victory, while Faye Whitney contributed 11 and B.J. Thompson added nine more.

The All Tournament team in the girls division was composed of a trio of RHS seniors: Tonya Hawkins, Kristie Stansell and Amy Gladden, with Twana Cary and Shannon Bolin of Mt. Vernon rounding out the mythical squad.

The Rebels cakewalked through the first two opponents of the tournament, trouncing Detroit and James Bowie by lopsided margins. Junior post Kevin House led the scoring attack in these contests, with 19 and 24 points. The Rebel bench, all of whom are capable players, displayed their ability as Jason Lankford and Jim Purviance hit for eight each, while Ronald Simmons spelled Jason Pogue at the post slot.

The Mt. Vernon Purple Tigers posted their undefeated 3-0 record against the Rebels 6-0 perfect mark in the tourney closer. Since neither team has been seriously tested in previous games against Detroit and James Bowie, it was hard to expect what might happen.

The Purple Tigers, led by 6'4" Doyle Preston, bolted to a 10-2 lead in the first three minutes of the contest. After a Rebel time out, a composed squad fought back to wrestle the lead from the Tigers on senior guard Donald Comb's steal and lay-up with :43 seconds left in the quarter. Although tied at 16 at the buzzer, the Rebels would not trail in the contest again.

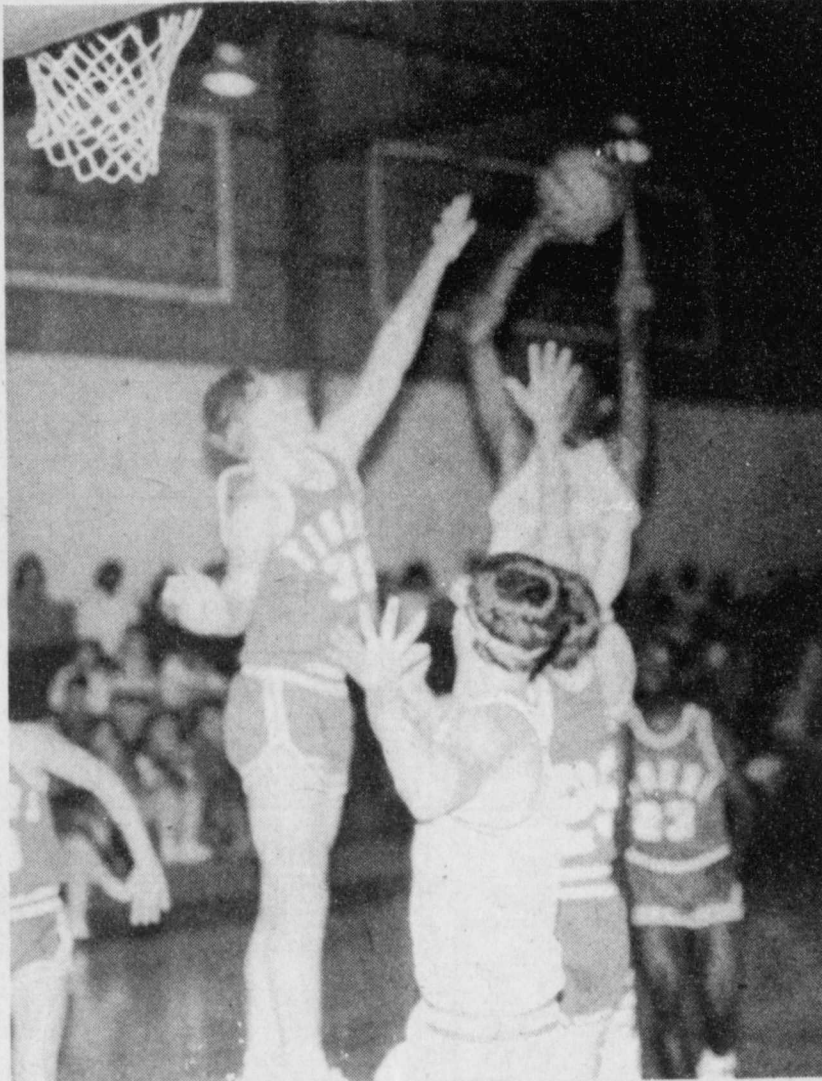
The Rebel defense was able to slow Preston in the second quarter, limiting him to a single bucket, enroute to a 31-27 halftime lead. The third quarter saw the Rebels use their superior height advantage as 6'7" Jason Pogue hit for 11 points to show the way to a 50-37 Rebel advantage with only eight minutes left to play.

Pogue had 25 points on the night while Kevin House had 18. Two other Rebels scored in double figures, Jeremy Abshier and Galen Logan with ten each. The Rebels were plagued with foul trouble near game's end as Combs fouled out, and House and Pogue played gingerly with four fouls. That fact permitted Mt. Vernon's outstanding player, Doyle Preston to score half of his game-high 32 points in the span, cutting the lead to six points with 1:29 left to play. But the

Rebels would score six points in the final :39 seconds while Mt. Vernon did not score to make the final 74-62.

In addition to Preston of Mt. Vernon and John Savage of Detroit, Coach Wood named a trio of Rebel seniors to the All Tournament team: Pogue, Abshier and Combs.

The Rebel varsity boys play in the Celeste Tournament this weekend, as do the Rebelettes. Both squads open against Anna, girls at 4:30, boys at 6 p.m.

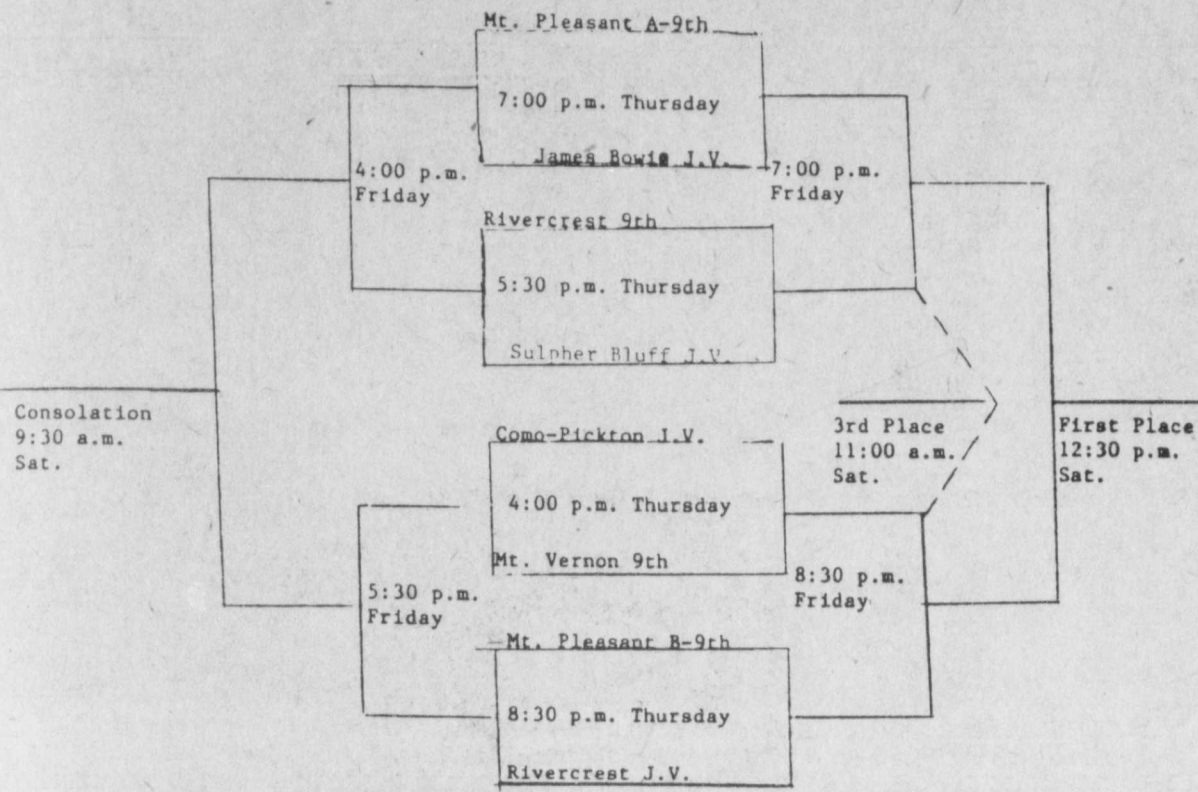

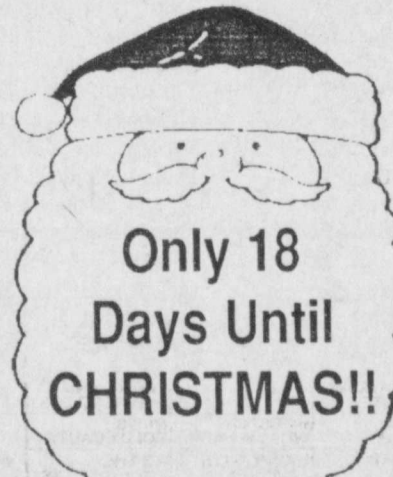

Talco State Bank Presents Program On Banking

In Talco-Bogata typically, people have had to go to banks to learn about banking. The transition is being made, however, the banking representative assisting the teacher with the technical aspects of banking.

This is evident in the VHS video cassette program, "Banking Is...", which the Talco State Bank presented as a public service to the students at Rivercrest High School. Ninety percent of all financial transactions are made by check and the American public will write more than 37 billion checks this year. Yet in spite of this, statistics show that less than 85% of the graduating high school seniors know how to write a check properly. So, it is easy to see that check writing is an activity that students should understand if they are to take their places in the financial community."

We hope our sponsorship of this program will give students a more thorough and systematic understanding of these basic banking activities, the new services that are available, and help them in management of their personal financial affairs."

"We strongly believe that the more financially secure students become through knowledge and practice of good banking, the better citizens they become; and the better our young citizens, the better our tomorrow."

In addition, Jo Anschutz pointed out that as part of the program an officer of the bank is available for a follow-up classroom question and answer session and the students may be given a tour of the bank to see numerous financial operations at work.



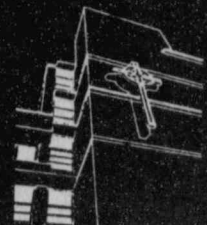

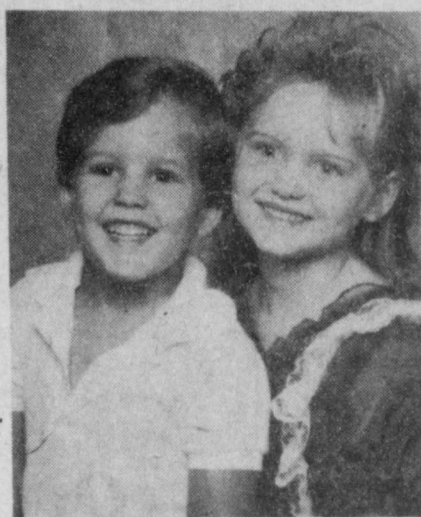

Time Running Out To Obtain Pesticide Certification

By Paul D. Payne

Individuals have until December 31 to become a Certified Applicator without paying \$50.00 for a license. After that date, individuals will pay \$50.00 for a five-year license.

There are two ways that an individual may become certified. One is to pick up the home study course available from the County Extension Agent and forward the review to the Texas Department of Agriculture so that it reaches their office on or before December 31.

The other method is to attend a training program to be conducted in Paris on December 28. This three-hour training meeting will begin at 7 p.m. in the TU Electric Building in Paris.

Individuals obtaining their private applicator certification in 1989 will

need to renew those in five years at a cost of \$50.00. The private pesticide applicator certifications obtained prior to 1989 do not expire and consequently there will not be a cost incurred. There could be recertification training required in the future, but we do not know at this time.

Certified private applicators cannot supervise another individual in the application of restricted use chemicals after December 31. In order to supervise another person, one must become a Licensed Private Applicator even though they are already a Certified Private Applicator. In addition, the person supervised must be trained. The cost of becoming a Licensed Private Applicator is \$50.00 for a five year period.

Spring Semester Schedule Announced At NTCC

A new registration process at Northeast Texas Community College should make things speedier for students signing up for the spring, 1990 semester, according to NTCC's Phil W. Ebersberger, Dean of Admissions and Registrar.

Early registration for the spring semester is December 5 through 7. Regular registration is January 9 through 11. Classes begin January 15, final exams will be May 7 through 10 and graduation is May 11 and spring break is March 19 through 23.

Copies of the spring schedule of classes are available in the NTCC Admissions and Records office. Three hundred ninety-two credit courses, 292 day and 132 evening, will be offered this semester.

A student currently enrolled at NTCC need not complete a new

application for admission, but must secure an academic advisement-registration form from the Counseling Center.

Students with questions about college majors or programs of study are encouraged to seek career counseling through the NTCC Counseling Center. Students planning to graduate at the end of this academic year should complete an application for graduation and have an official degree plan on file in the Registrar's Office prior to the beginning of the spring semester.

All students entering NTCC for the first time are required to complete an application for admission, a health form, an oath of residence and provide a copy of their high school or college transcripts or GED certificates.

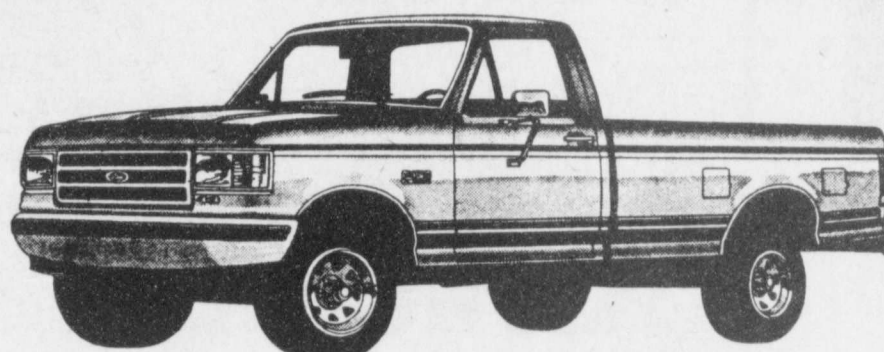

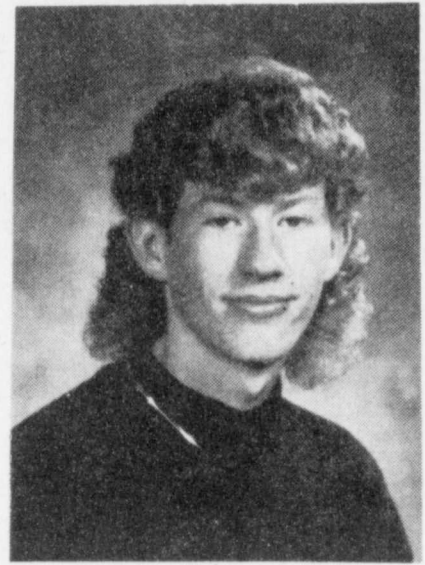
