former head coach, Terry Giddens. Coach Green will be moving into the area around July 9 and he asks everyone to come meet him. He has been married to Paulette for 25 years and they ahve three children, twin girls, Jennifer Canwell and Jamie Hill, age 21 of Texarkana, and Marian Green, age 14. Paulette is a teacher in Texarkana School System.

He said that if there ever was a perfect coach's wife, Paulette is it. "If enthusiasm is contagious, I hope

I have enough for the kids. I'm not a traditional coach, I might show up for practice in a T-shirt and flip flops. Those kids need to understand that I can enjoy laughing and not be a hard case all the time."

Green further said"I'm easy going andI don't have an ego problem. Give me a chance to show them how much fun playing and coaching football can be. 

## Emergency Farm Loan **Applications Being Accepted**

Applications for emergency farm ers, the interest rate is 4.5%. loans for losses caused by severe

Red River County is one of eight in Texas recently named by Secretary of Agriculture Clayton Yeutter as eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from the storms, flooding and tornadoes.

Farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 80% of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue in business or \$500,000, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain

As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30% loss of production to be eligible for an FmHA emergency loan, Stroud said. Farmers pariticipating in the PIK or Federal Crop Insurance programs will have to figure in proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

FmHA is a credit agency of theU.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work and rely on farming for a substantial part of their living. Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who are U.S. citizens and to farming partnerships, corporations






