## "Strike Force" Muscles Message Across To Young People!

It's an unusual approach, one with a strong, important message for kids, put forth in a way that kids can understand and relate to.

Strike Force, a group which performs feats of pure strength, will be appearing at Rivercrest High School. On August 10 and 11 they will be at Rebel Stadium beginning at 8:00 p.m. On August 12-15 they will appear at 8:00 p.m. in Rivercrest Auditorium. There is no admission fee.

The group uses feats of strength to promote a drug free, healthy and religious lifestyle. They are an interdenominational group and bring their powerful message to youngsters of all ages in a positive, fascinating, never boring way.

The leader of the group, Keith Craft, quotes Matthew, Chapter 4 saying Jesus was a fisher of men.

"Without the proper bait you won't catch any fish" he says. "That's our philosophy, using something persons will enjoy watching but employing a more subtle religious message."

Among the things that this "Youth Explosion Spectacular" will perform are: crushing four stacks of concrete as they burst into flames; 10 feet of ice crushed with a blow from the head; hot water bottles exploded with lung power, incredible amounts of weight lifted, telephone books ripped in half and much more.

The leader, Keith Craft, has broken out of over 1,000 pairs of police handcuffs and holds a record for crushing eight feet of concrete with one blow from his arms!

By breaking handcuffs Craft and his associates hope to show that it's physically possible to break the chains

of drugs and alcohol. They see between 5,700 people a night, most of who understand the message.

Craft says it's a very diversified, different program every night.

A different member will share a few minutes with the audience, telling about themselves, every night.

Among the businesses that are helping sponsor this event are: Days Inn, Western Sizzlin; Life Health Center, Buckman's Drug, Inc., Paris Lumber and Building Supply, Buck's Welding and Machine, Lonnie "Bo" Pilgrim and Peoples National Bank in Bogata.

Brother Larry Allgood of the Assembly of God Church in Bogata, first met the group two years ago at a convention. "They are really good," he says.

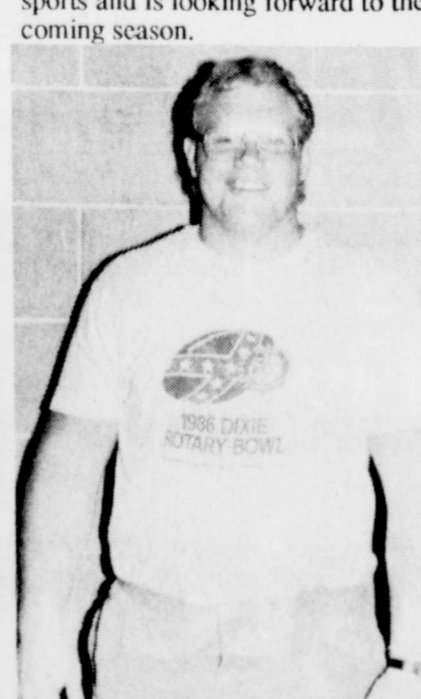
She has talked to some of the girls who will be playing this season and says "We won't lose a game because we are out of shape!"

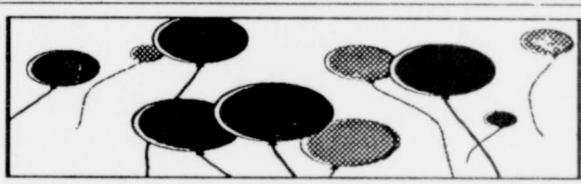

## Gray-Holt Exchange Vows

The gown, fashioned from white silk taffeta, featured a sweetheart neckline, basque-waist bodice, fitted sleeves and a sweeping train. **Contel Provides Free Emergency Calling**

Beginning July 1, 1990, emergency calls placed to police, fire department and ambulance emergency services are now toll-free, Contel recently announced.




