During World War II the yellow ribbons seem to have fallen by the wayside, but during the Vietnamese conflict, a new song and new resurgence of yellow ribbon use came along.

"Tie a Yellow Ribbon 'Round The Old Oak Tree" was a hit and yellow ribbons caught on once more.

Since then, briefly, tying white ribbons during the hostage crisis in Iran came along.

Now, however, yellow ribbons abound everywhere.

In big cities, in small towns, on the old oak tree and the new car antenna, yellow ribbons are everywhere.

If anyone discovers the true beginning of this habit, please let us know.

In the mean time...it doesn't matter...it's just nice to see a show of unity in the nation.

After months of nothing...namely no rain, it seems the area has been deluged with plenty of moisture in a short length of time.

Drought stricken soil welcomed the first half inch that fell Sunday night, September 9. Then, between Monday and Wednesday 6 and one half to nine inches fell from cool, cloudy skies!

It took four inches before any run-

off what so ever was noticed. Up until that time the thirsty earth soaked it up like the proverbial sponge.

After a scorching hot, humidity ridden weekend more rain came in the form of a thunder storm that brought cooler temperatures once more, and dropped another one to three inches of rain (depending upon location).

After being severely damaged by last winter's hard freeze, then

scorched through a two and a half month long drought, this rain may well have saved meadows and pastures.

Cotton farmers, however, cast a slightly worried eye on the skies, since the cotton stripping season is just beginning.

Water, for the first time since the first week in June, now stands in some fields.

## D-FY-IT Program Introduced To Talco-Bogata Students

The Talco-Bogata sixth through eighth grades and Rivercrest High School students met Monday for the introduction to the D-FY-IT, Drug Free Youth In Texas, program.

Principal Ray Miller opened the meeting with appreciation expressed to those who have helped get the program underway in the schools.

Drug testing will possibly begin on Wednesday. Applications for membership are available at each school office and must be signed by the child and parents or guardian.

Mr. Miller introduced D-FY-IT chairperson, Rue Anna Bell; incentive chairman, Donnie Hayes and guest speaker, Reggie Day of Mineola.

Mr. Hayes reported on the many businesses offering discounts to D-FY-IT members. Mt. Pleasant, Talco, Bogata, Clarksville and Paris businesses have committed to discounts for these student members. He also reported several businesses gave cash donations to the program.

Mr. Miller then introduced guest speaker, Reggie Day of Mineola. He began by telling students that in his 23 years coaching and working with students, he has seen many drug programs come and go, but the D-FY-IT program is the only one he has seen that works, because it involves the community, students, parents and teachers. He explained that these business people give these discounts freely to help students, but if they see Friday and Saturday night drunks and students high on dope, they can and will pull out their support. Students must honor their end of the program and help others honor it, also.

Mr. Day stated that "Didn't want to put the kids to sleep by being too serious," but requested they listen seriously for a few minutes.

He named four things as the most important to a successful life. 1. Courage to say no. Don't be a wimp, make your own decisions. It may not always be the "in" thing, but students know right from wrong. 2. Strive for excellence. Be the best you can be. Don't settle for second. This can be as

a friend, athlete, child or parent. 3. Begin with respect for your own body. Kissing a smoker is like licking an ashtray. 4. Spiritual soundness. Don't be too cool, or too laid back to pray. Churches are not for sissies or wimps. Trust in God. You won't be young forever, so do something with your life, other than ruin what hasn't begun for you with drug and alcohol.

Mr. Day asked the students how many had seen an alcoholic and many hands raised. He stated "Do you want to be seen looking like that?" Texas is the #1 beer selling state. In America today, student deaths are: accidents, 60%; alcohol related homicides, 70%; alcohol related and suicides, 47% alcohol related. The state has more deaths due to alcohol than any other.

He told the students of one TV commercial that shows people playing ball and then having a beer. He asked the student body again, "Have you ever seen or heard of a coach that would tell his team "Win this one and we'll go have a case of beer." What do you think a drunk pole vaulter, gymnast or boxer would look like? Mr. Day made his point clear when he told the group that alcohol and drug abuse is an illness. "How do you think it would look to see a Monday night football game on TV brought to you by measles? Can you see the Monday night movie sponsored by whooping cough?" Smoking marijuana can lead to birth defects in girls, cocaine speeds the heart up and actually makes it explode, crack addicts the person to the point that there is nothing they won't do to get the drug.

Day finished with "Students, place yourselves in your parents' place. Would you want the keys to your car in the hands of a drunk or dope head? Tell your parents you love them. Their ideas are not as bad as they seem when you put yourself in their place.

Mr. Miller dismissed the group reminding them that the D-FY-IT applications may be picked up in each school office.

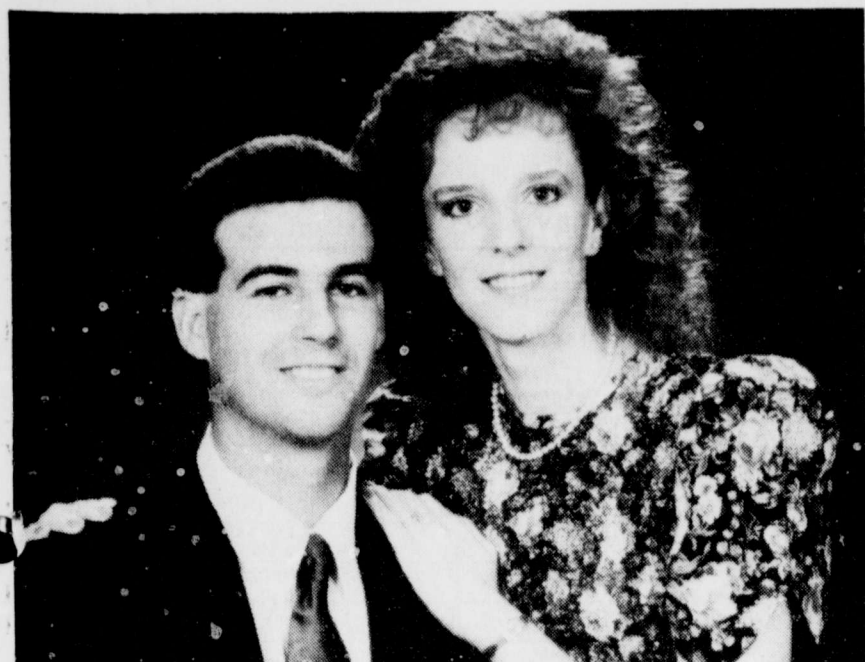

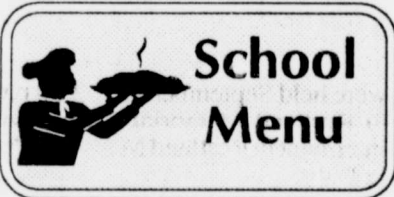

### Asthma and Allergies: New Hope and Help

An estimated 50 million Americans—some 20 percent of the population—suffer from some type of allergic disease, including asthma, studies show. An estimated ten million have asthma—one-third of them are children. Both asthma and allergies cost Americans millions of dollars every year for medications, doctor visits and time lost from work. Also, in 1988 alone, nearly 4,600 people died from asthma attacks. Fortunately, there's been a lot of progress in recent years in terms of treating these diseases.

Although there are no cures for asthma and allergies, reports the Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America (AAFA), over the past decade medical science has made great strides in understanding the complex events that cause asthma and allergies and in developing better and safer medications to control them. The Foundation sponsors National Asthma and Allergy Awareness Week—celebrated in 1990 from May 6 to 12—which takes place annually at the height of the spring pollen season, a time when millions of children and adults experience respiratory difficulties triggered by airborne grains from trees and grasses.

First proclaimed by President Reagan and by a joint resolution of Congress in 1984, the week is meant to spotlight the widespread nature of these common immunologic and inflammatory illnesses and the work of volunteers, scientists and physicians in developing and improving diagnosis and treatment approaches and patient-family education.

The goal of the week is also to make more Americans aware of the "team" of organized programs and services for asthmatic and allergic Americans:

- the public sector, led by the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, National Institutes of Health;
- the professional sector, led by the American Academy of Allergy and Immunology, and the American College of Allergy and Immunology;
- the non-profit sector, led by the Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America, its chapters and volunteers.

The AAFA Poster Child for 1990 is Jennifer Carol Price, who, through intensive education and proper medical treatment, has achieved control of her asthma while excelling in scholastics in the Gifted Education Program at her school in Midland, Texas.

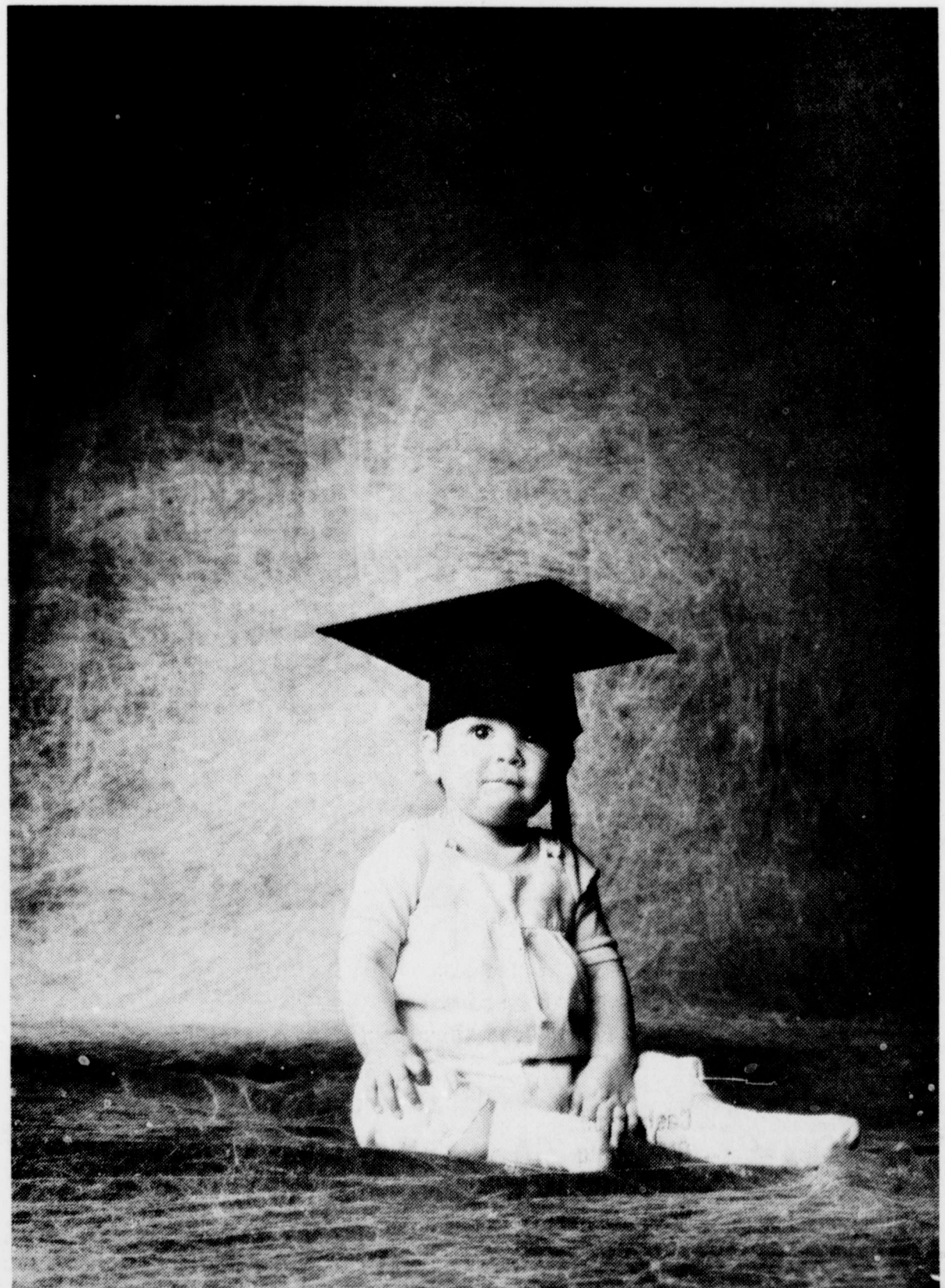

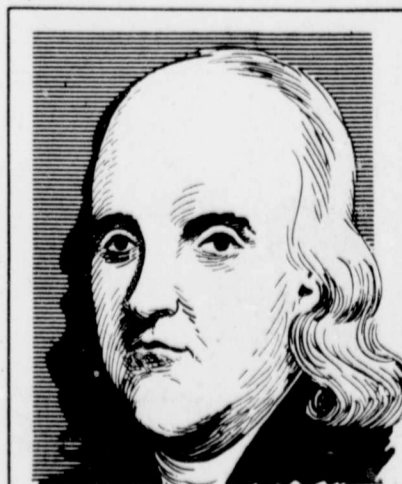

**RETIREMENT SEMINAR MATERIALS ARE AVAILABLE....** A variety of materials is available from Social Security for use by business and organization who want to sponsor pre-retirement seminars. The materials listed below are available by contacting your local SSA office.

The film 'Pre-retirement Planning - It Makes a Difference' emphasizes that Social Security is a basic ingredient, but not the whole recipe for successful retirement planning.

Personal Earning and Benefit Estimate Statements (pebes) provide individual benefit estimates for age

65 retirement, early retirement, and delayed retirement. It is suggested that seminar leaders take a supply of the SSA-7004 request forms to the seminar and encourage participants to complete the forms.

A number of Social Security publications may be useful, especially the booklets, Retirement and Medicare. Factsheets on specific issues such as government pension offset may be desirable for some groups.

## Article Recalls Dr. A.G. Elder

Mrs. Mary Stone of Clardy graciously brought by an article she had kept from the Dallas Times Herald Magazine, printed in June 25, 1967.

The article, written by Bill Thompson, was about Dr. A.G. Elder of Deport, his practice and his fox hunting.

At that time, Dr. Elder was 87 years old, and still practicing medicine, although a heart attack had cut down on his fox hunting.

The article mentioned that he was one of the oldest active physicians in the Southwest. Since he actually continued to practice medicine one into his nineties, he may well have died THE oldest.

Dr. Elder's story points out some of the differences between practicing medicine then and now.

For instance, Arthur Gilbert Elder got the notion early that he wanted to be a doctor. He set out to study at the University of Texas Medical School. Family problems caused him to drop out, but he continued to study at the University of Nashville and received his medical degree in 1907.

Fourteen years he practiced at Fulbright. That fourteen years he rode horseback. His territory ran from south of Detroit to north of Bogata, eight miles from Clarksville, and included the old Lone Star and Dark Corner settlements. He told the reporter "Times were hard, but they made a good corn crop that first year. I accumulated a corn crib full of corn in

payment for my services".

He got a two-cylinder Maxwell car in 1911, but in muddy weather still had to go back to the saddle or buggy.

In order to get a better education for his children Dr. Elder moved his practice to Deport in 1922.

He served as the Deport Health Officer for many years, and headed the school board for 10 years.

No one knows just how many babies he delivered, but he was tending the grandchildren of kids he had delivered years earlier!

But Dr. Elder had another love...fox hunting.

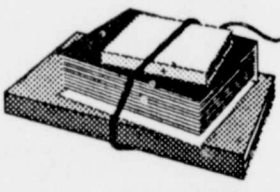
He learned, the article said, the joys of fox hunting with hounds as a child "I hunted with the slaves on my dad's place. They had brought some hounds with them from Virginia".

It took him practicing medicine for ten years before he could afford to keep hounds and fox hunt. After that, he became something of a legend among southwest hunters and dog owners.

When the article appeared Dr. Elder hadn't missed an annual hunt of the Texas Fox and Wolf Hunter's Association since 1918...that was 49 years.

His hounds won prizes over all the Southwest. After his heart attack in 1955 he sold them, and finally, in 1957, sold his camp which was nestled in the deep woods near Cuthand.

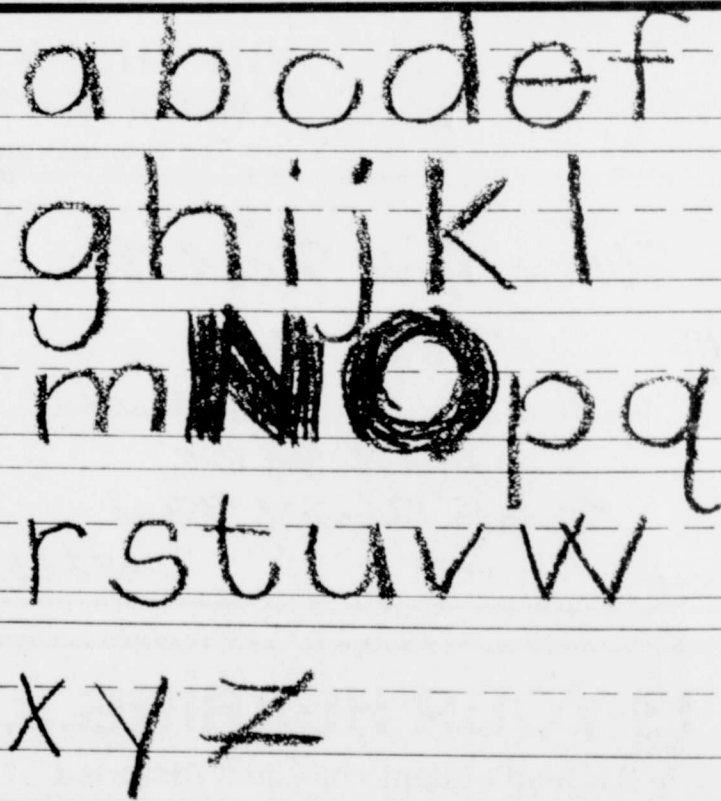

### PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 2, Sixth Called Session, 71st Legislature, proposes a constitutional amendment to provide that if the Senate, at any special session, does not take final action to confirm or reject an appointee of the Governor made during a recess of the Senate, the appointee is entitled to continue in office until the Senate rejects the appointee at a subsequent session or until the Governor appoints another person to fill the vacancy, but such a nominee whom the Senate does not act to confirm or reject at a subsequent regular session is considered to be rejected when the session ends.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:  
"The constitutional amendment to clarify the authority of the senate to consider certain nominees to state and district offices and to provide for filling vacancies in those offices."
