We've always admired the childish handwritten letters that remember to ask for something for their brothers and sisters.

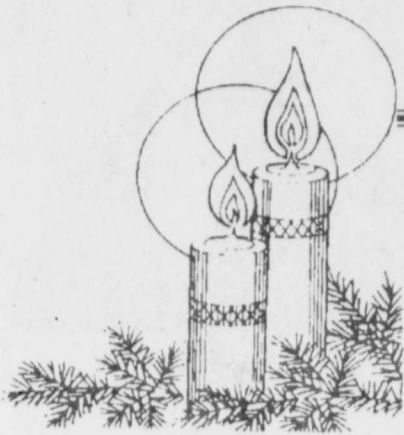
We've shared with one another the odd things that kids sometimes ask for Santa Claus to bring to their parents.

I just thought I would "rake" up a little history about Johntown. My father and mother, Lewis and Geneva Stoker, used to live in Johntown. My father lives in Mt. Vernon at this time, my mother died March 11, 1961. We moved to Tyler in 1943. I still live at Tyler, now on with the history.

In about 1935 my father built our first house about 1 1/4 mile south of Johntown on Hwy. 271. It was constructed of peeled logs chinked with a mixture of mud and grass. I might also add that it was very comfortable. Our modern home had windows, but before we had glass, my dad put hogwire over them to keep out or in anything that needed to be kept out or in. I do not know which paper it was at that time, but one newspaper wrote the article that the mosquitoes were

so large that Lewis Stoker had to put hogwire over the windows to keep them out. The next story really did happen. My brother, James Stoker, hunting something to make a sling shot (not what we called them, you know) at that time, looking in a closet, discovered a rattlesnake. The snake had three rattlers, also three mice were in its stomach. I also might add that I have just scratched the surface. If I put everything down that happened, it would take a sheet of paper 20 feet long on both sides. I am not 6, 10, 15 or 25 anymore, I am 61 years old and I still enjoy The Bogata News very much. Halftime saw the exes leading 19-

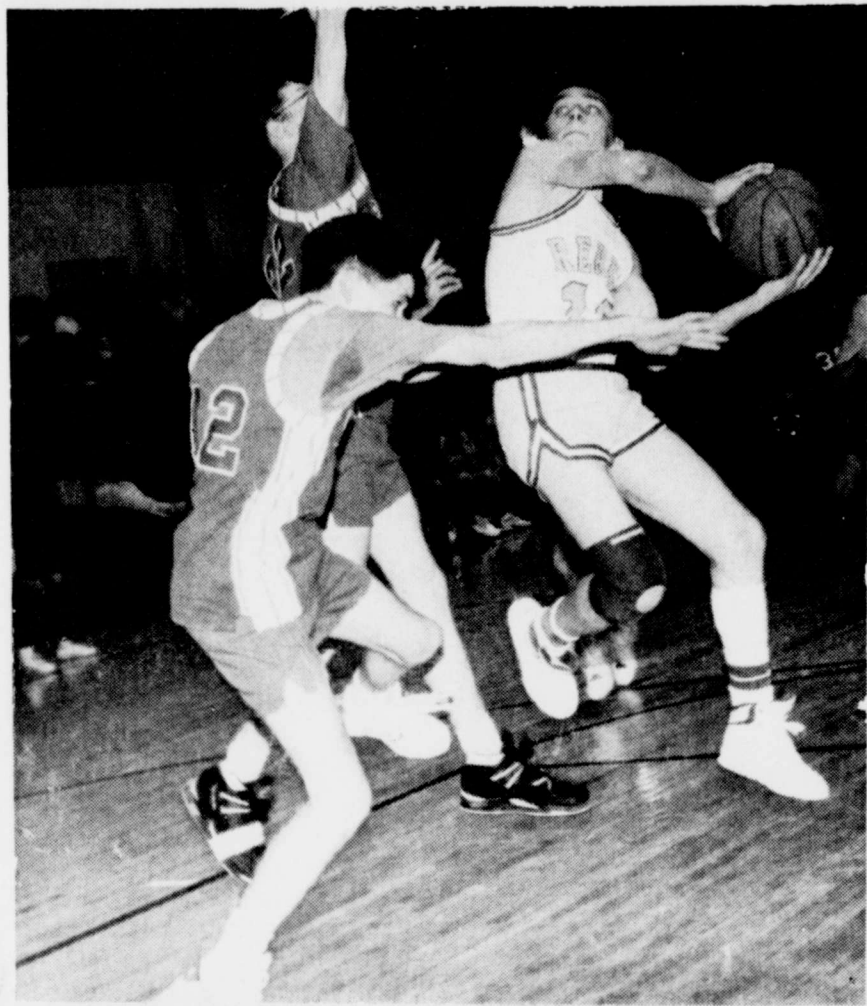

The Advent Wreath Is Harbinger

In many churches and homes, during the four weeks before Christmas, wreaths with candles are displayed to remind the faithful of the approaching holiday.

These decorations are known as Advent wreaths, symbolizing the eager awaiting of mankind for its redeemer.

Originally, the Advent wreath may have been part of pagan observances. Tribes in northern Europe would display cartwheels decorated with greens and lights in their homes during the winter season.

The custom became Christianized in time, with the wreath's circular shape symbolizing God's unending nature, and the ever-greens symbolizing His unchanging nature.

There are four candles

on the wreath, one for each week of Advent. Three of the candles are violet in color, as a reminder of our repentance and our longing for the Savior. One candle is rose colored, symbolizing our joy and hope in the coming of the Messiah. All the candles are tied with purple ribbon, again as a symbol of longing and repentance.

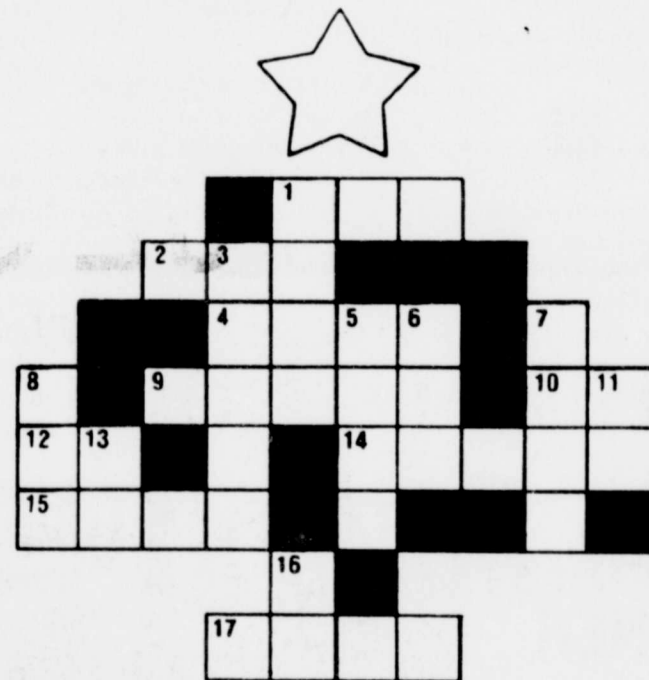

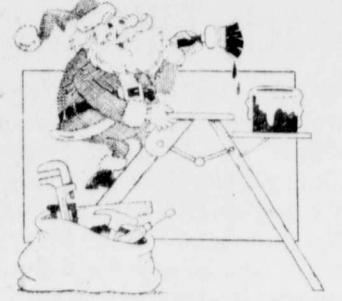

In August, 1984, Ms. Filkins was promoted to Clerk III in the Purchased/Community Services Division where she worked for a Contract

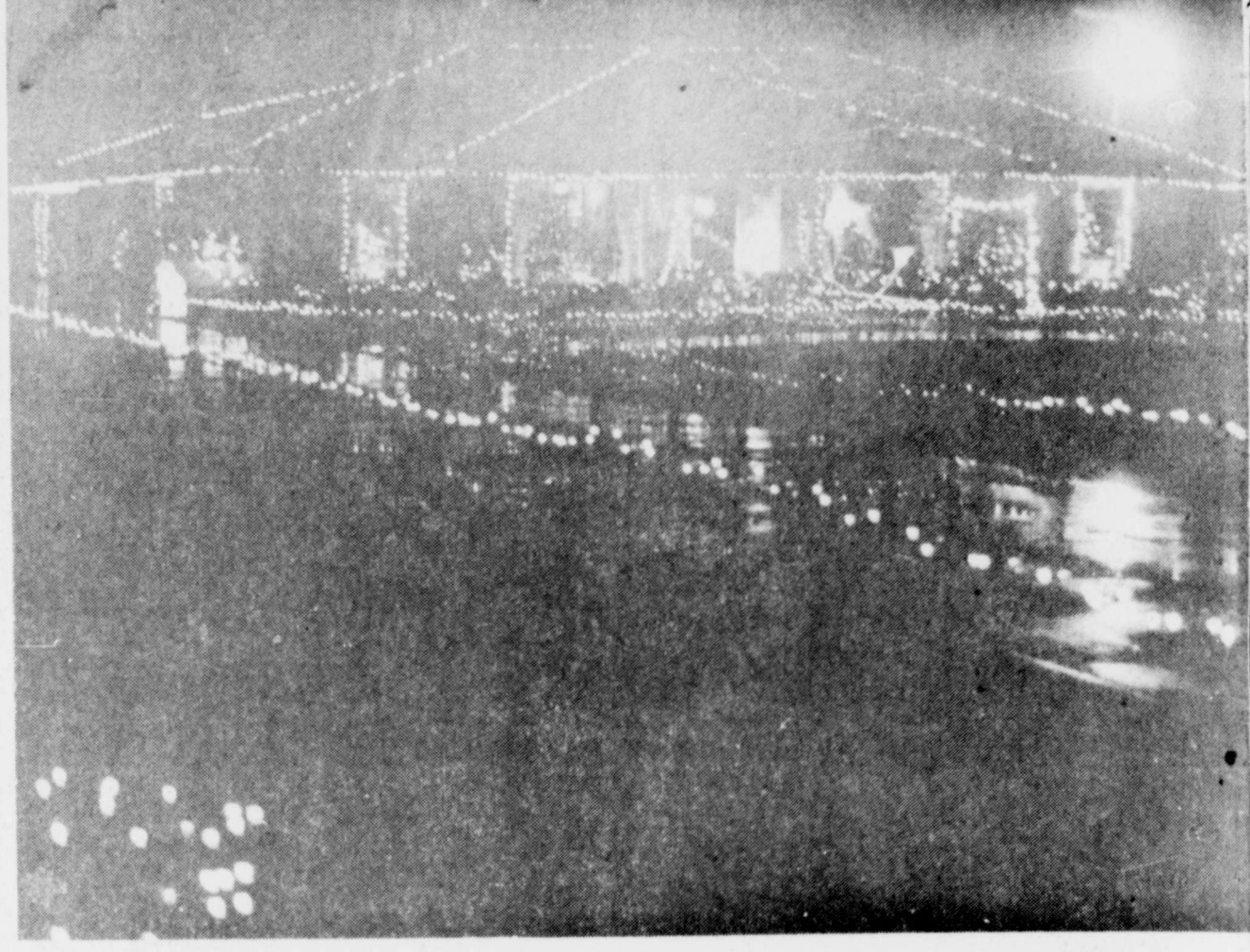
Manager and a Family Self Support Case Analyst.

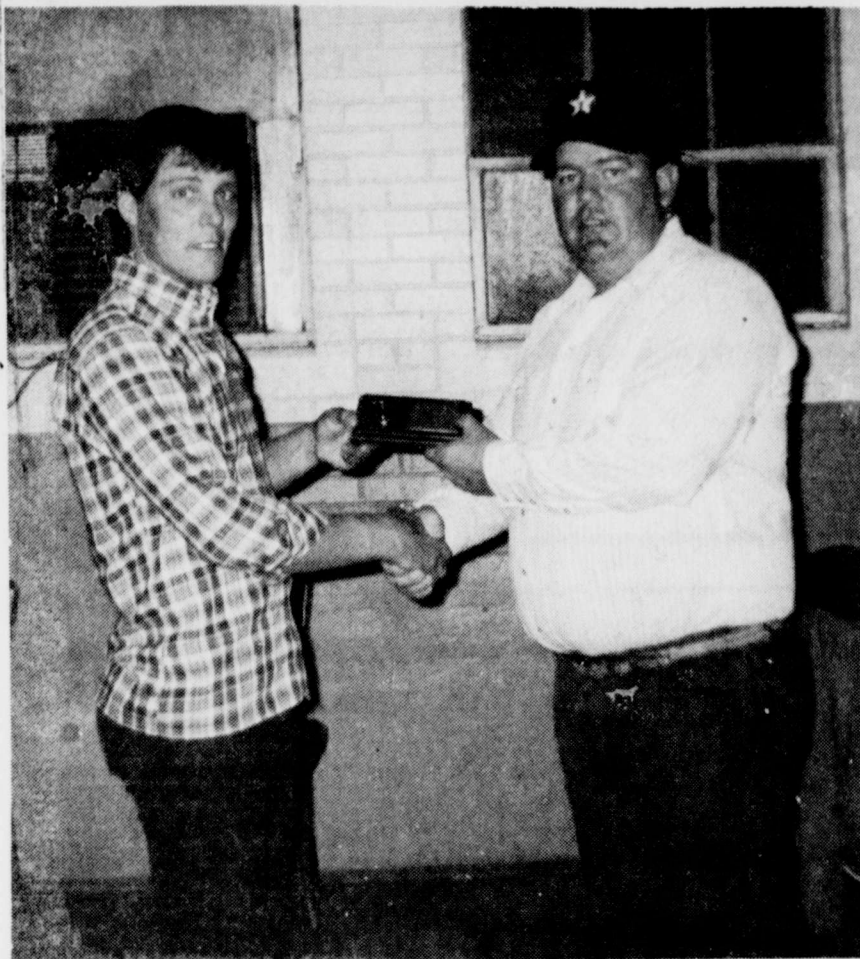
