



Not as much fun though... as making a big mess in mom's kitchen with all of the dye and new-fangled egg coloring kits. Just doesn't seem as much fun as it used to be... the mess just isn't the same!

So, here we go! I found a recipe for Egg Salad Dressing. One for Shrimp Salad, Hot Baked Chicken Salad and Baked Deviled Eggs. They all sound good!

April 11, 1996 Eggs-actly!

Egg Salad Dressing
 5 hard cooked eggs
 1/2 cup salad oil
 1 teaspoon salt
 1/2 teaspoon pepper
 1/4 cup lemon juice
 Mash egg yolks in bowl. Add oil and mix well. Add lemon juice, salt and pepper and chopped egg whites. Stir well; serve on lettuce leaves.

Shrimp Salad
 1 cup large shrimp-cooked and chopped
 1 cup chopped celery
 3 hard boiled eggs-chopped
 1/2 cup mayonnaise
 salt and pepper to taste
 Combine all ingredients. Serve on lettuce leaves or stuff large tomato. For variation add 2 tablespoons pf chopped pickles pr 2 large avacados, diced and sprinkled with the juice of 1/2 lemon.

Hot Baked Chicken Salad
 2 cups chicken-cooked and chopped
 2 cups celery-chopped
 1/2 cup pecans or almonds
 1 can water chestnuts
 1 cup salad dressing
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 2 teaspoons minced onion
 2 tablespoon lemon juice
 1/2 cup grated cheese
 1 cup potato chips-crushed
 2 hard boiled eggs
 Combine all ingredients, except cheese and chips. Pour into greased casserole dish. Sprinkle cheese and chips over top. Bake at 375 degrees for 25 minutes. Can substitute 3/4 cup cream of chicken soup for 3/4 cup cream of chicken soup for 3/4 cup mayonnaise.

Baked Deviled Egg Casserole
 6 hard boiled eggs
 2 teaspoons prepared mustard
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 3 tablespoons plus 3/4 cup sour cream
 2 tablespoons butter
 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
 1/3 cup chopped onion
 1/4 cup chopped pimiento
 1 can cream of mushroom soup
 1/2 cup grated cheese
 Halve eggs lengthwise; remove yolks. Mash yolks, mustard and salt together with 3 tablespoons sour cream. Fill egg whites with yolk mixture. Melt butter in large skillet. Sauté pepper and onion until tender. Remove from heat; stir in pimiento, soup and remaining 3/4 cup sour cream. Place 1/2 of soup mixture in 1-1/2 quart shallow baking dish. Arrange eggs, cut side up, in single layer on top. Pour on remaining soup mixture. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until heated through. This may be made in advance and refrigerated until ready to bake. Just bake a few minutes longer. Serves 12.

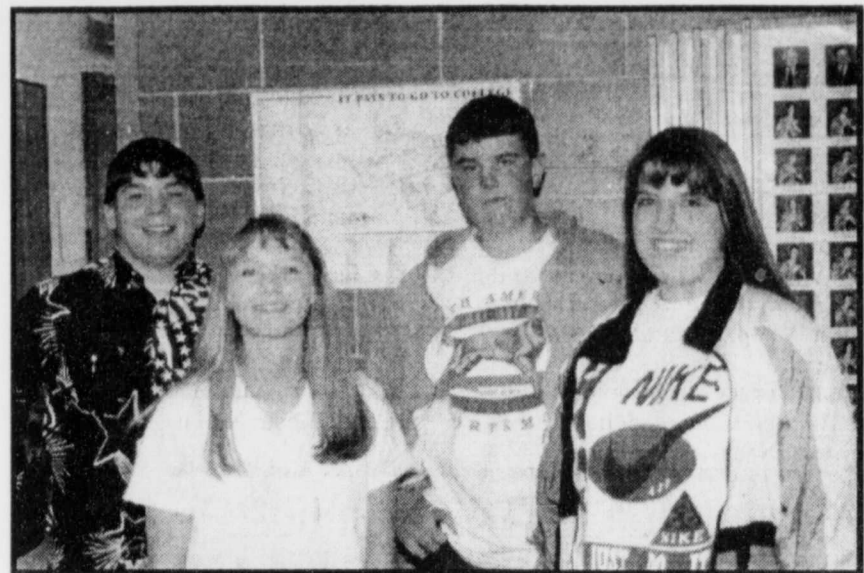

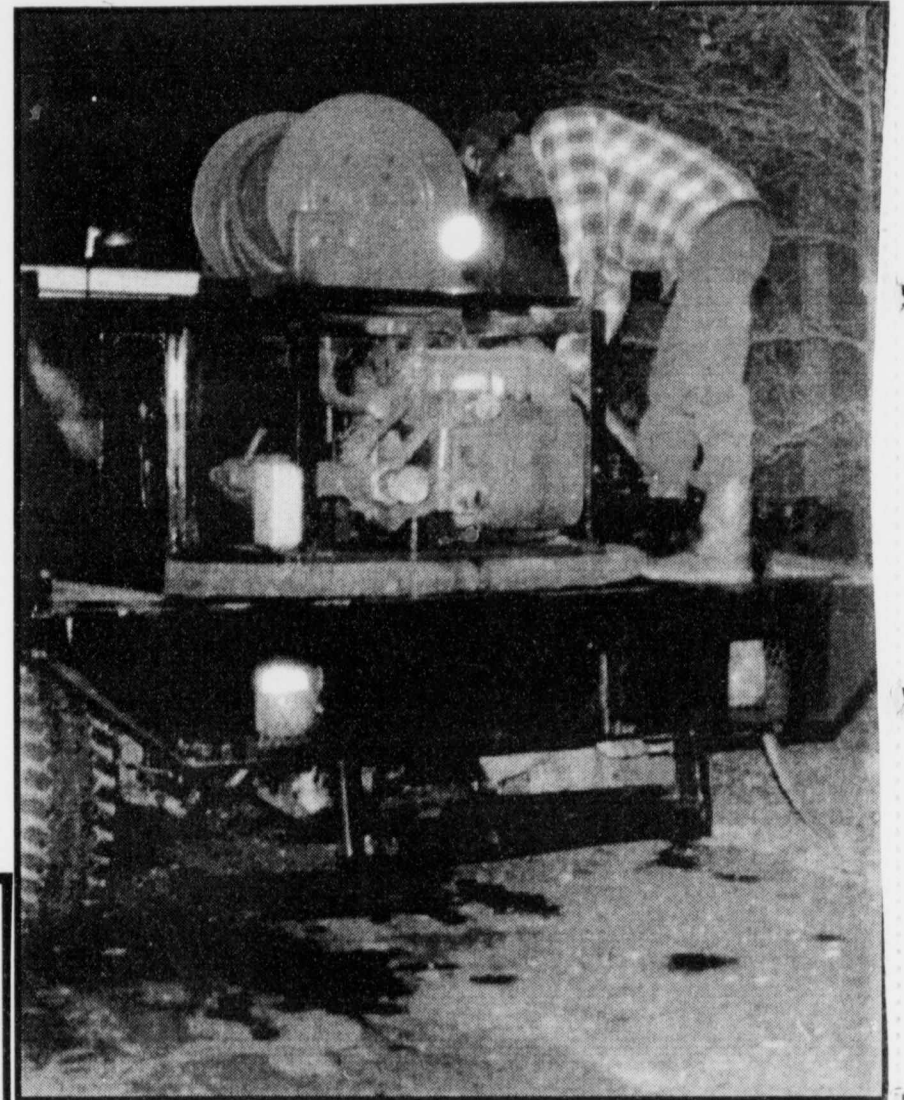
