Former Justice of the Peace and long time Bogata resident, James
Clyde Watson, died Sunday morning, Aprill 1 at McCuistion Regional Medical Center in Paris, where he had been hospitalized for a combination of serious maladies during the past three weeks.
Judge Watson, the son of Pete and Alma Senter Watson, was born in the
Fulbright Community on June 29 1916. On January 27,1938 he married Naomi Ruth Davidson of De-

Naomi's death on February 20 of this year, only forty days prior to his passing.
