33rd, 52nd FTSs join wing units

The 33rd and 52nd Flying Training Squadrons will become part of the 64th Flying Training Wing during ceremonies at 10:30 a.m. today in the Simler Theater.

The activation is a precursor to the start of specialized undergraduate pilot training at Reese, according to Operations officials.

"Of course, SUPT won't get underway until we receive the new trainer (the T-1 Jayhawk)," said Col. Jerry Deakin, deputy commander for Operations. "Meanwhile, students will do T-37 training in the 33rd and 35th, and fly T-38s in the 52nd and 54th."

The colonel added that SUPT will start in April 1992 with Class 93-07. Once implemented, students selected to fly tankers and transports will go through the 35th and 52nd FTSs; fighter/bomber selectees will be trained in the 33rd and 54th FTSs.

The 52nd FTS will fly the T-1.

Col. John Block, assistant deputy commander for Operations, noted that the five-squadron concept will enhance training even before SUPT takes hold at Reese.

"The amount of daylight available for flying is greater now that the longer summer days are upon us," he said. "Add that to nighttime flying, and you have almost a 24-hour flying day. However, under the five-squadron concept, flying times can be staggered so that some units will fly the morning hours and others will fly in the afternoons."

"This will give instructor pilots and other operations people more reasonable duty days," he added.

Another benefit of the move is increased span of control for commanders.

"Current 35th and 54th FTSs members will form the new units, leaving four squadrons with about half the number of instructor pilots of today's flightline squadrons," Colonel Block said prior to the activations. "This will make it easier for squadron and training officers to supervise their people."

"Also, students will now report to a single commander, who will be with them on the flightline. This differs from the old system, where all the students fell under a large administrative unit," he added. "This will ensure that commanders and their people have direct access to one another."

The 33rd FTS will be commanded by Lt. Col. Billy Hill, while the 52nd FTS will be commanded by Lt. Col. Stanley Osborne.

Commander's perspective

Today marks another milestone in our wing's history as we activate two new flying squadrons here at Reese. This is the first step of many that will eventually lead to the implementation of Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training, or SUPT.

The "five-squadron concept" will enable a natural separation into two distinct pilot training tracks, which is the idea behind SUPT. Additionally, the concept gives the flying squadron commanders complete control over all the people and resources required to accomplish their unique portion of the mission. This is accomplished by placing the student pilots directly under the flying squadrons where they're being trained.

Previously, our student pilots were assigned to the 64th Student Squadron, which converted into the 41st Flying Training Squadron in January. This meant that two commanders were always involved with each student, one responsible for training and one having student command responsibilities. A primary benefit foreseen for our new organization is a tighter span of control and less complicated chain of command within the flying squadrons.

Now the 41st FTS, with the activation of the new squadrons today, relinquishes all student pilot command responsibilities and becomes the fifth flying squadron. It has already assumed the Accelerated Copilot Enrichment and Pre-instructor Qualification programs as its flying mission. It also retains responsibility for academic instruction, international programs and all the enlisted members in the Operations Complex.

It is always a significant event when a wing forms new operational squadrons. The 33rd FTS (T-37s) and the 52nd FTS (T-38s) inherit a bountiful tradition built on a proud history. Both served as bombardment squadrons during World War II.

The 33rd FTS also saw service in the Korean Conflict before reverting to inactive status.

The 52nd FTS has previously seen service in Air Training Command from July 1972 through September 1977, when it was the T-38 flying training squadron at Craig AFB, Ala.

The 33rd FTS is to be commanded by Lt. Col. Billy Hill, former operations officer of the 35th FTS. His OPS officer will be Maj. Roger Cude.

The 52nd FTS commander is Lt. Col. Stan Osborne, who recently reported to Reese from the ATC Standardization Evaluation Team. His OPS officer will be Maj. Bruce Gamble.

All wing members are invited to the activation ceremony at 10:30 a.m. today at the Simler Theater.

We are fortunate to have retired Maj. Gen. Buzz Baxter, a former wing commander at Reese, from January 1972 to July 1974, to help with the activation of the new squadrons this morning.

Three other former wing commanders will arrive at Reese this weekend to participate with local civic leaders in a community relations event Monday. We're always pleased to have our honored alumni return. Welcome home, Brig. Gens. Jim McIntyre, Dick Heame and Bob Hullender. It's good to have you back.

The transportation division is comprised of military members, civil servants and contractors who are responsible for many facets of transportation.

Vehicle Operations and Maintenance is performed by Allied Management of Texas.

Vehicle Operations provides a valuable service to us. They are responsible for the timely movement of pilots to and from their aircraft. In addition, they provide taxi service for members' official trips.

Vehicle Maintenance continues to be AMT's strongest point. Performing maintenance on a diverse fleet, consisting of over 240 vehicles ranging from sedans to refuelers, is truly a challenge. They have maintained an impressive vehicle-in-commission rate of over 98 percent for the entire fleet. Two quality assurance evaluators ensure AMT performs to these demanding standards.

The Traffic Management Office rounds out the Transportation Division. The majority of you have had dealings with the household goods section of TMO. These folks are responsible for the movement of your personal property.

Faced with the challenge of moving more than 700 aircraft maintainers in a short period, the people in this office per-

formed superbly. They ensured everyone received proper entitlement counseling and timely moves. The quality control section of TMO ensures you receive a high-quality move from the commercial carrier industry through thorough inspections. In fact, during the maintenance conversion, they exceeded the 50 percent inspection standard by more than 25 percent.

The passenger section, in cooperation with the Scheduled Airline Ticket Office, ensures you receive timely airline reservations and tickets at the lowest cost to the government.

It was a pleasure for me to preside at the ribbon-cutting ceremony last month for SATO. They are now conveniently located in Bldg. 920, first floor.

Not as noticeable, but definitely as important, are the folks in Packing and Crating and the Freight Warehouse. Packing and Crating prepared over 13,000 items for shipment last year — many of those required the construction of specialized crates.

The folks in freight receive and ship cargo to all destinations including our Accelerated Copilot Enrichment Program bases.

The combined efforts of these sections make certain our jets are capable of accomplishing the mission.

All sections of the Transportation Division work together to process mobility cargo and passengers for movement to their Aerial Port of Embarkation.

As you can see, the Transportation Division is a service organization that ensures successful mission accomplishment at Reese. Consequently, let's join in recognizing their accomplishments during their week!

needs. Capt. Russell Roberts, Reese Accounting and Finance Branch chief, was selected as the company grade support officer of the quarter; and 1st Lt. Michael Febles, 54th Flying Training Squadron, was named the IP of the quarter.

Capt. Russell Roberts

Captain Roberts is responsible

for overseeing the payroll actions of more than 2,500 wing members; disbursing more than \$50 million annually; and ensuring requirements under the Prompt Payment Act are met when paying the more than 1,500 commercial vendors on base.

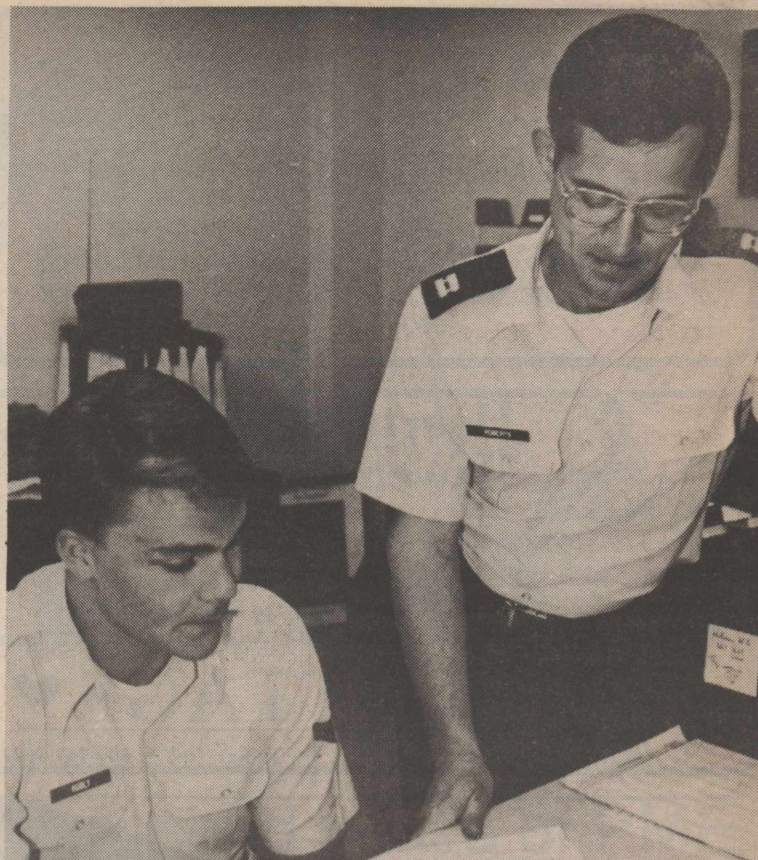
He developed and began professional training programs for his staff, resulting in improved customer service.

His merge of the military and travel pay sections provided for a more efficient and knowledgeable staff, and enabled effective use of limited space, said Lt. Col. Stephen Maddox, 64th Flying Training Wing deputy commander for Resource Management.

He designed a Personal Financial Management Program and produced a guideline for maintaining a checkbook. "This program received immediate acceptance basewide," said the colonel. "Keeping our people in good financial standings is what we're here for. Programs like the captain's help ensure the job is being done." Captain Roberts also assists Texas Tech University with the ROTC program, by providing the necessary accounting and finance training to the cadets.

tional," said Lt. Col. Gary Bundy, 54th FTS commander.

A pilot with many facets, Lieutenant Febles holds various positions in the Reese flying arena. As a runway supervisory unit controller, his flying knowledge is essential to the safe recovery of crew and aircraft during in-flight emergencies.

As an assistant flight commander, "the lieutenant is regarded as one of the squadron's best," said Colonel Bundy. Additionally, Lieutenant Febles has been selected to be "G" flight's first military training officer, or MTO — part of the five-squadron concept.

The lieutenant is also a unit standardization and evaluation member. In this position, he assists with standardizing training and instruction practices; prepares IPs for qualification and proficiency check rides; and is responsible for the Buddy Instructor Pilot Program.

Lieutenant Febles is also a weekend supervisor of flying. As such, he oversees the off-station training of more than 20 aircraft.

"His superior flying and instructor capabilities contribute greatly to the successful graduation of about 350 students yearly," said Colonel Bundy.

T-38 part shortage resolved

Brake discs now available

Sufficient T-38 brake discs are now available to resume normal Talon operations in the 64th Flying Training Wing and the rest of Air Training Command, command officials said Wednesday.

On April 6, ATC placed restrictions on all T-38 missions that did not directly contribute to pilot training.

The restriction was in response to a shortage of brake parts caused by a 16-month delay in the award of a parts contract.

"The situation was resolved thanks to prompt action on the part of ATC Logistics, the Ogden Air Logistics Center in Utah and the San Antonio ALC," said Col. John

Block, 64th FTW assistant deputy commander for Operations. "Thanks to their efforts, we can get back to business as usual in our T-38 operations."

ATC officials asked commanders to ensure training requirements for this quarter are met, Colonel Block said. However, flying time for instructor pilots will not be increased to make up for semi-annual or quarterly sortie requirements not flown because of the part shortage.

A portion of the pilots' semiannual requirements will be prorated to cover the period during which the flying restrictions were imposed.

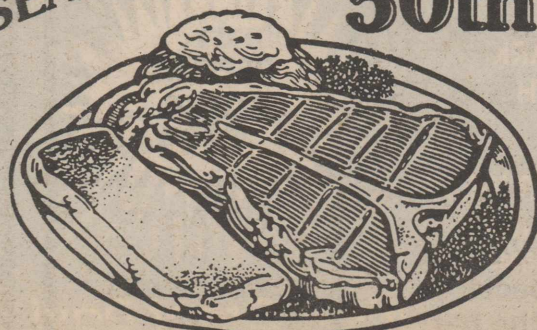

Maintenance unit deactivates Wednesday

Old faces move out, making room for the new.

Except for scrapbook photos and newspaper clippings, all that has become a memory in wing members' minds — and hearts.

Activated at Reese on Oct. 8, 1972, FMS deactivates in a ceremony at 9:45 a.m. Wednesday in the 64th Flying Training Wing Conference Room, Bldg. 800. "The era of military maintainers in Air Training Command is at its end," said Lt. Col. David McIntosh, 64th Field Maintenance Squadron commander. "It's time for a new generation to step in."

Over the past 18 years, the squadron took an active role in many aspects of the Reese community. In the early 1970s, many people felt the crunch from the fuel shortages, and wing members were required to sustain the mission with limited resources.

Then came aircraft modifications from the mid- to late 1970s. "During this time, maintainers had to update antiquated aircraft, and refurbish them to last another couple of dec-

ades," added the colonel.

Throughout the years, Reese maintainers have assisted with aircraft recoveries, not only of Air Force jets, but also jets from other services. They've also maintained the aircraft used at the wing's Accelerated Copilot Enrichment Program, or ACE, locations.

"They've worked hard to maintain the top-notch appearance of the static displays and various maintenance shops across Reese," said Colonel McIntosh.

In the competitive arena, FMS members helped push Reese into first-place during Torchlight 1986, and second-place in 1988 and 1989. "The maintainers have done their best to accomplish the wing's objectives — and they've done well," complimented the colonel.

About 40 maintainers now remain. Some will be reassigned to Detachment 2, 3307th Testing and Evaluation Squadron here; some will work with the contractors in the Reese Quality Assurance Evaluation Section; and the rest will depart for another base by June.

"It's been a great year for me in FMS. I'd like to extend my appreciation for the fine caliber of people I've had the chance to work with and the support they've provided me throughout my command," said Colonel McIntosh.

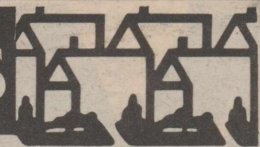
"All the students who applied for these scholarships deserve a hand for the effort they've put into their education," said EWC

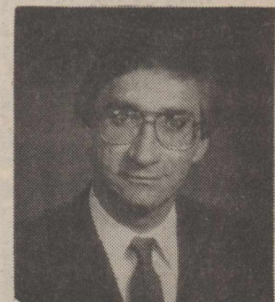

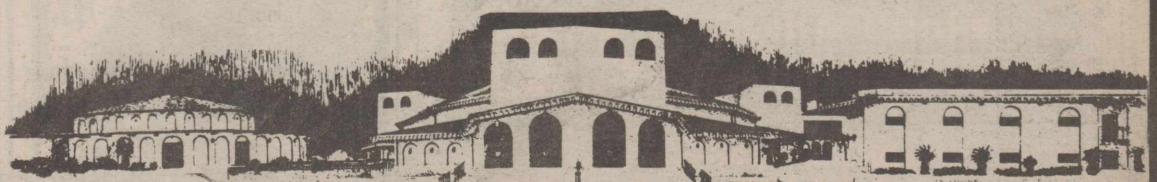

"In the beginning, I had three goals in mind — the first of which was making it to the playoffs, which we have done," said Kahumoku. The second was to be consistent. Although we weren't always consistent, the team managed to keep the winning streak going.

"Our last goal is to win the playoffs. It's going to be tough, because we have very good competition."

The MSS coach, while recognizing his players, placed them in three categories: as an outstanding hitter, he recognized Dwayne Donelson, Cintron Friday, Derald Jones and Shane Ware; multi-talented players include Larry Woods, Dino Carrell and Angie Wallace; and known as super supporter are Dave Forsyzewski and Miguel Baca. "Although we have no 'superstar,' I feel we have the best six players overall on the floor at any given time," he commented.

Serving and passing, pointed

out Kahumoku, are two basic fundamentals that help a team to win. Teamwork and cohesiveness only increases the effectiveness of the team. "It's not really the winning that is important; it is being good enough to make it to the place where you can win," he said. "Whether we win or lose next week (during the playoffs), at least we can have the satisfaction of saying we had a tremendously good season," concluded the captain.

The top three teams in each of the division and the two next highest record teams overall will go on to the playoffs. Joining MSS in the National League are the 35th and 54th Flying Training Squadron "A" teams. The American League teams are USAF Hospital Reese "A", 41st FTS and 35th FTS "B". The 64th Civil Engineering Squadron and 1958th Communications Squadron (AL) will also play.

Playoffs begin Monday; game schedules will be determined today. Double elimination will be used to determine what teams will play in the finals May 18.

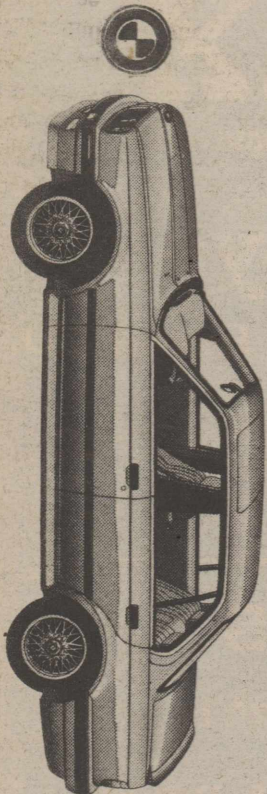

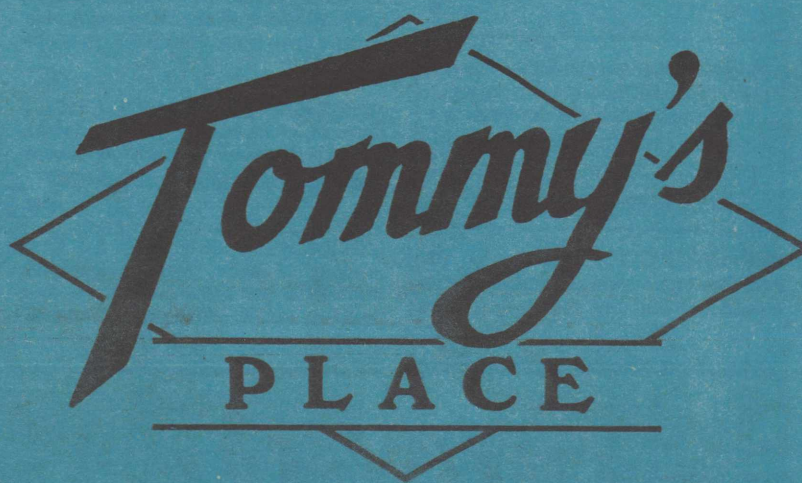
